DEDICATION






OUR ASSISTANTS



FOOTBALL AT ST. BON'S

St. Bonaventure Gridsters lost its opener to St. Cecilia's of Hastings 13-0. The Irish made 15 first downs to Hastings' 5, but lost the ball game because of fumbles.

After losing to Hastings the Irish roared back to defeat Loup City 38-6. After breaking a 6-6 tie in the first quarter, it was the Shamrocks' ballgame with John Blahak scoring three times on 49-58, and 12-yard runs, and Cliff Speicher turning in a 59 and 60yard scamper for 12 points. Paul Melcher banged over for the final T. D. from 3 yards out.

The following week the Shamrocks dumped Boys Town Reserves 25-6. The points for both teams were all made in the first half with a 0-0 battle in the last. The passing of Dick Tooley and the catching of Dave Bowe sparked the Irish offensive. Bowe scored twice; once on a pass play which covered 78 yards. Cliff Speicher scored the remaining 13.

The Irish won their third straight game by spanking St. Joseph of Omaha 32-0. Even though losing Blahak with a broken collar bone, the Irish kept rolling with L. Sanders, T. Mimick, D. Bowe, and P. Melcher scoring touchdowns and Sanders and R. Melcher extra points. Blahak scored six points before being taken out.

After trailing 13-0 at the half the Shamrocks came slashing back to score 21 points and defeat Newman Grove 21-13. Dennis Baumert intercepted a pass later in the third period for the first Irish score. The second Irish score came from a 9-yard plunge by Paul Melcher. On the third touchdown, Keith Speicher cinched the victory with a 49-yard scamper. Extra points were made by Paul Melcher and Cliff Speicher.

The Irish won their fifth straight by bumping St. Mary's of Grand Island 20-6. Paul Melcher plunged over from the 3 for the first score, Dick Tooley sneaked over for the second, and Dave Bowe intercepted a pass and raced 58 yards for the third. Cliff Speicher and Bowe scored the extra points.

St. Bonaventure received their worst setback of the season by Holy Name of Omaha, 38-6. Ted Mimick kept the Irish from being deadlocked by banging over from the four in the final stanza.



The Irish lost their third game of the season 20-0 to Cathedral, another Omaha school. The Omahans dominated play throughout most of the contest. The Shamrocks could not hang on to the ball long enough to get their offense rolling.

St. Bonaventure ended its season with a smashing 61-6 triumph over Sacred Heart of Greeley.

Paul Melcher led the way by scoring three times on 8, 41, and 28-yard runs. T. Mimick followed with two 10-and-11-yard runs and 2 extra points. J. Lippstreu, Bill Ernst and E. Gates each contributed 1 T. D. apiece, all were converted linemen.

Keith Speicher gave the fans the thrill of the evening with an 85-yard run. Cliff Speicher and D. Korger gave 2 points each, while D. Bowe accounted for 1 point.


