ST. BONAVENTURE H.S. STATE

The St. Bonaventure H.S. Shamrocks won the Class "B" State Championship at the Nebraska State H.S. Track Meet at Kearney on May 16, 1964. The SBHS squad was an easy winner with 33 points. The Irish, trained by Coach Dean Soulliere and his assistants Lowell Roumph and Pat Keitges, ranked fourth in the Grand Championship behind three Class "A" schools, Omaha Tech, Scottsbluffs and Grand Island. Fortyone teams were ranked.

Last year the Shamrocks missed the Class "B" title by only two points. They went into the state finals this year with a strong field of qualifiers determined to capture the crown. This was a fitting climax for an outstanding track season during which SBHS won every meet entered. There were many team and individual superior performances. The squad retained the District title, captured the Catholic Conference Meet for the third straight time, and won the Omaha Archdiocesan Meet.



1964 FOOTBALL TEAM

This St. Bonaventure H.S. Football Squad brought the school its first UNDEFEATED SEASON since 1953. The Shamrocks, with a 9-0-0 record, were ranked third in the state in Class "B" from among 64 schools. They were Nebraska's leading 11-man scoring team with 322 points. Keith Johnson was selected for the OMAHA WORLD-HERALD ALL-State Class "B" Team. Mike Shonka received Honorable Mention. Keith, Ty Jarosz, and John Iossi were given Honorable Mention on the LINCOLN JOURNAL Class "B" All-State Team. The 1964 SBHS Football Team was also the Central Catholic Conference Champion. Keith Johnson, Mike Shonka, John Iossi, Ty Jarsoz, and John Shank were named to the All-Conference Team.

The UNDEFEATED squad received a great deal of publicity and acclaim for their excellent season. Most notable of these was a community-sponsored banquet attended by over 700 people. Columbus H.S. also had an undefeated season (their first since 1944) and both teams were honored at this banquet. Coach Dean Soulliere was given special mention since he played on St. Bon's UNDEFEATED squad in 1953. The community of Columbus showed appreciation for the fine records by sending the Head Coaches of both schools and their wives to the New Years Cotton Bowl Game at Dallas to see the University of Nebraska play Arkansas.


B-CLUB


GIRLS STATE— BOYS STATE
