



#### SCOTUS CENTRAL CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL EXPERIENCES A HAPPENING

Our Alma Mater is growing. The year 1968--1969 has witnessed a number of happenings that give evidence of growth. The new administration added a 2-1 ratio of lay representatives to the Board of Directors when two lay people from each parish were selected to work with their pastor on the policy-making of Scotus High. This advance injected new vigor to the educational plant and very soon it became apparent that Scotus was suffering from "growing pains". New courses like Art, Spanish and Physiology, widened its horizon and broadened its cultural offerings. First the CEF and then the SEF buttons gave signs of the involvement of a large group of parents, and prominent citizens in the efforts Scotus was making to keep alive and progress. Within the school, a new atmosphere developed as the students felt the pressures and sensed the problems that beset it. After a cold drink machine was added in the Commons, that place became the hub of many activities. Daily Mass began the day there and students gathered to share in the Eucharistic banquet and ask for God's blessing. But as the seniors were given the privilege of its use as a casual study hall, the Commons grew into a discussion center where warm friendships developed and the bigger lessons of life became the issues to discuss. Candy sales, student polls, and other meetings spiraled to the Commons. It was a cozy place to be and even if it was the place we went to register the place to go to receive the report card and on Graduation night, the place to return the cap and gown, to the seniors of 1969, the Commons was a place to grow, spiritually, physically and educationally.





## Our Religion Teachers

## Languages


