Both of these are good; so after a discussion period the staff decided to use both by combining them to read CHALLENGES OF UNITY. Since unity is necessary to the success of group endeavor, this was our own first challenge to unite.

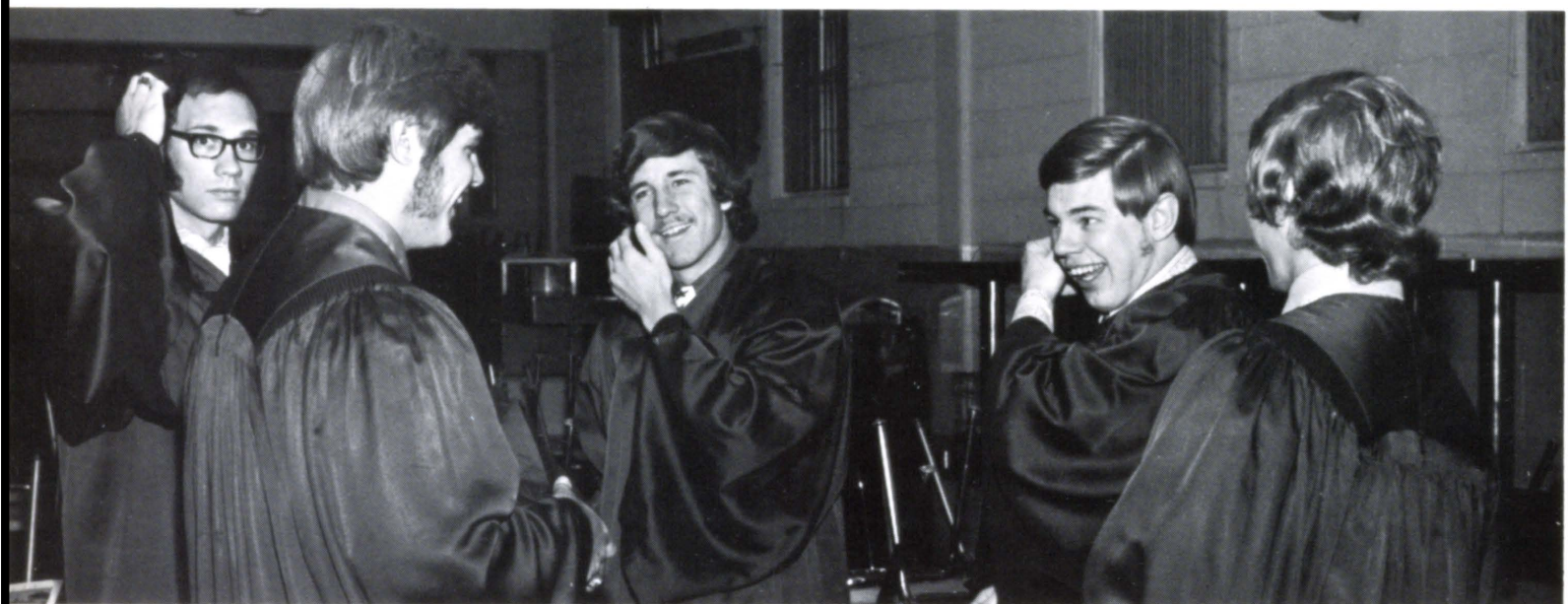
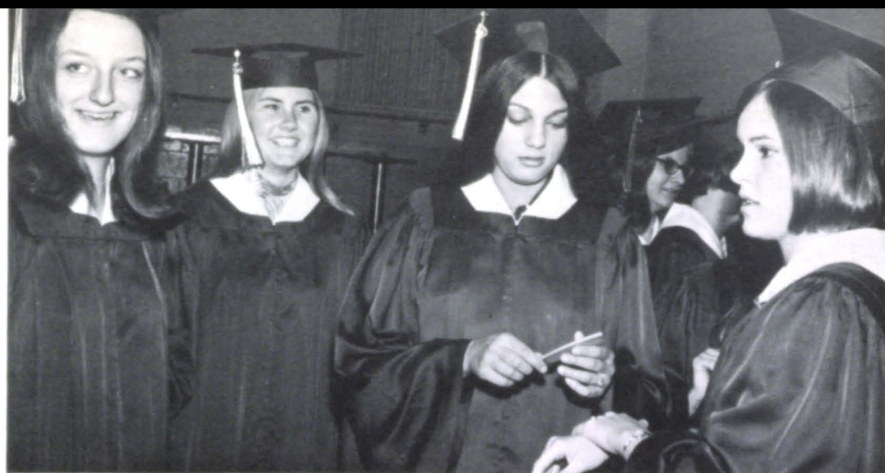
## 1971 Boys And Girl Staters

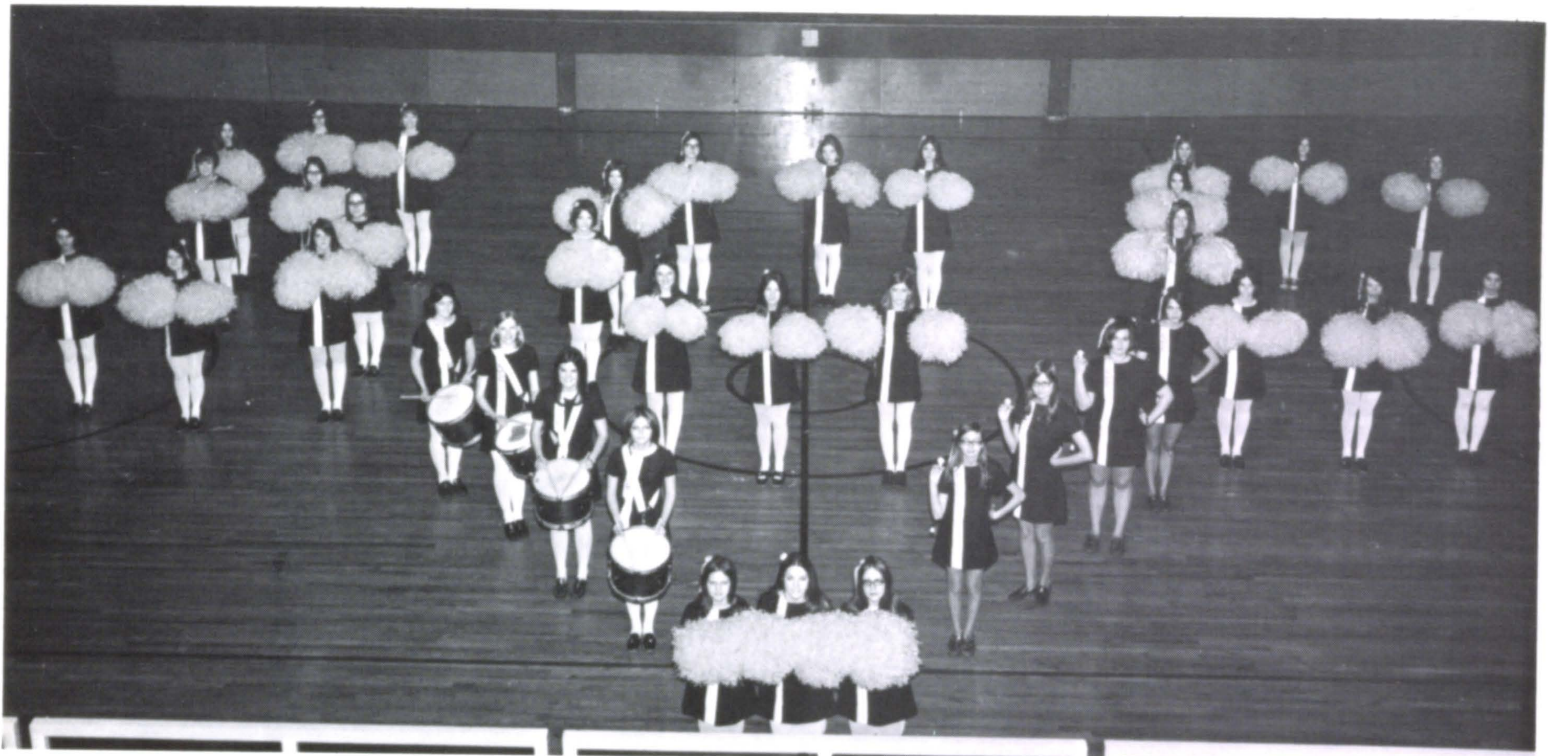


## Scotus Pep Club

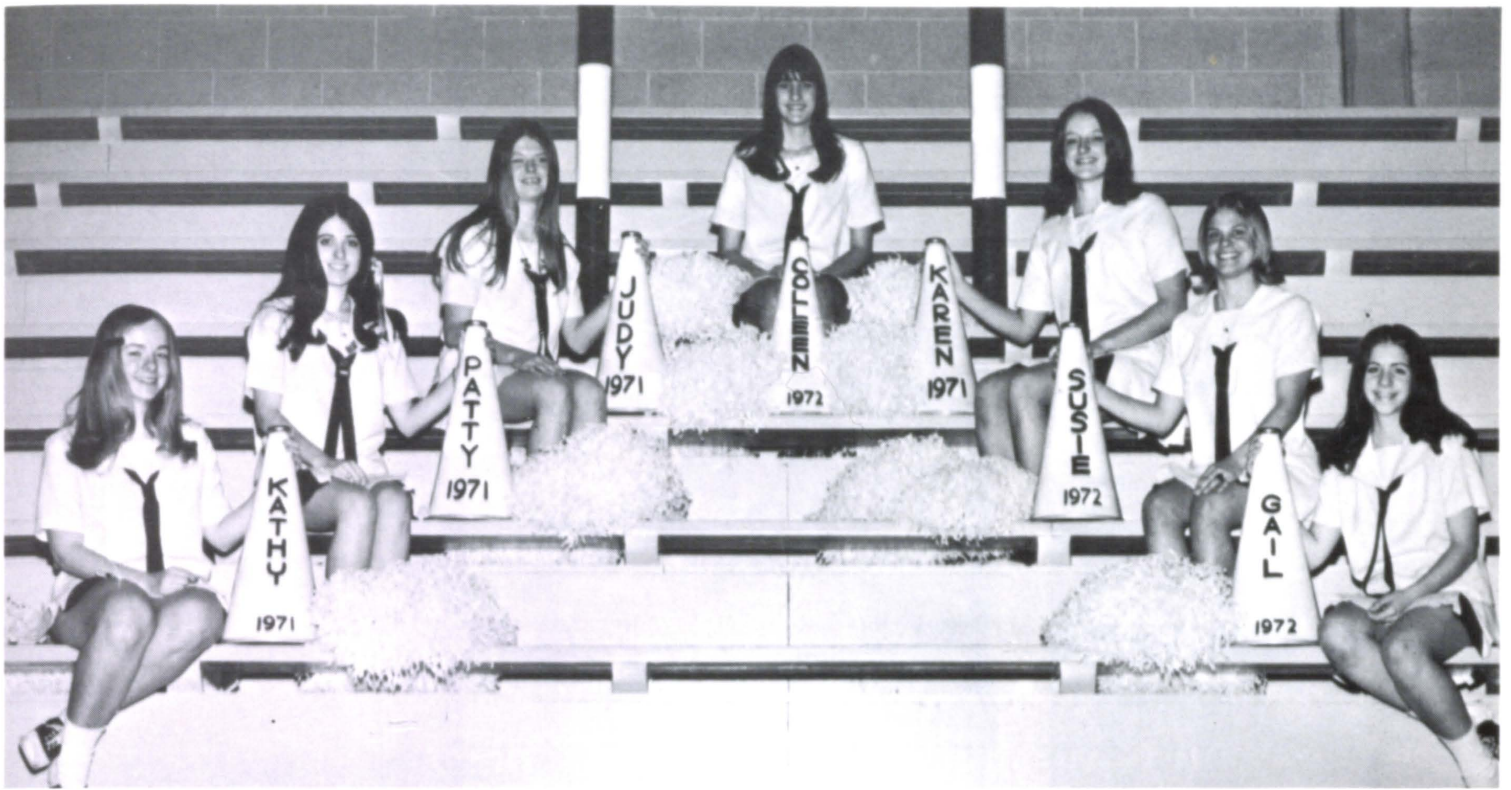
## Scotus Drill Team

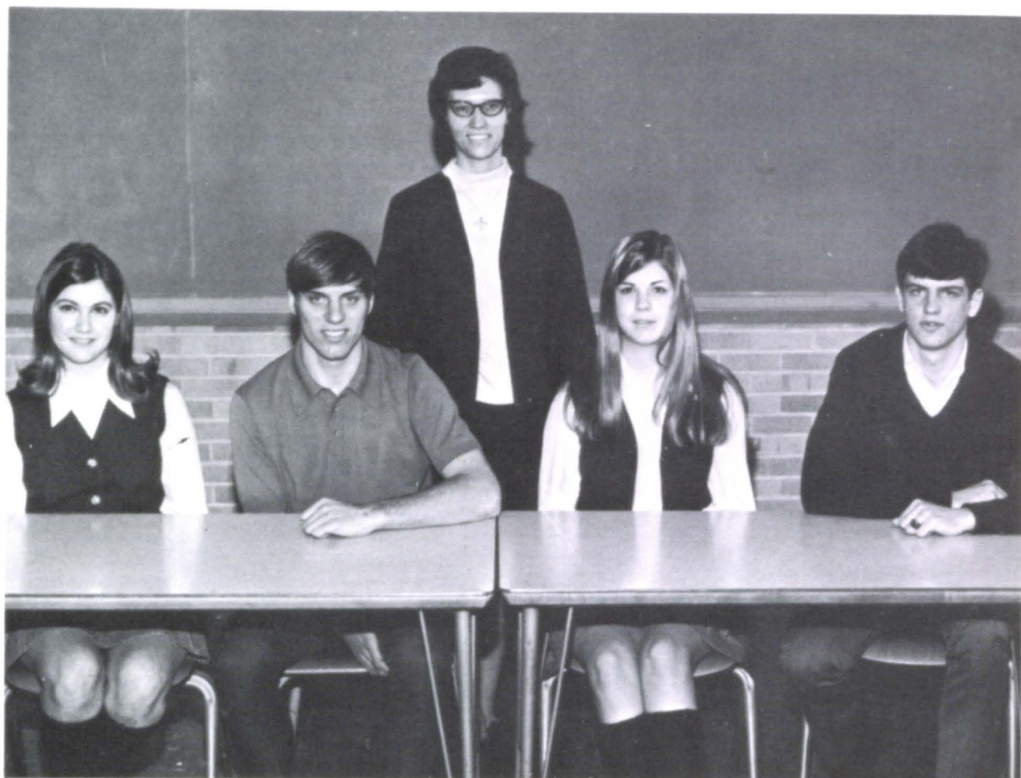

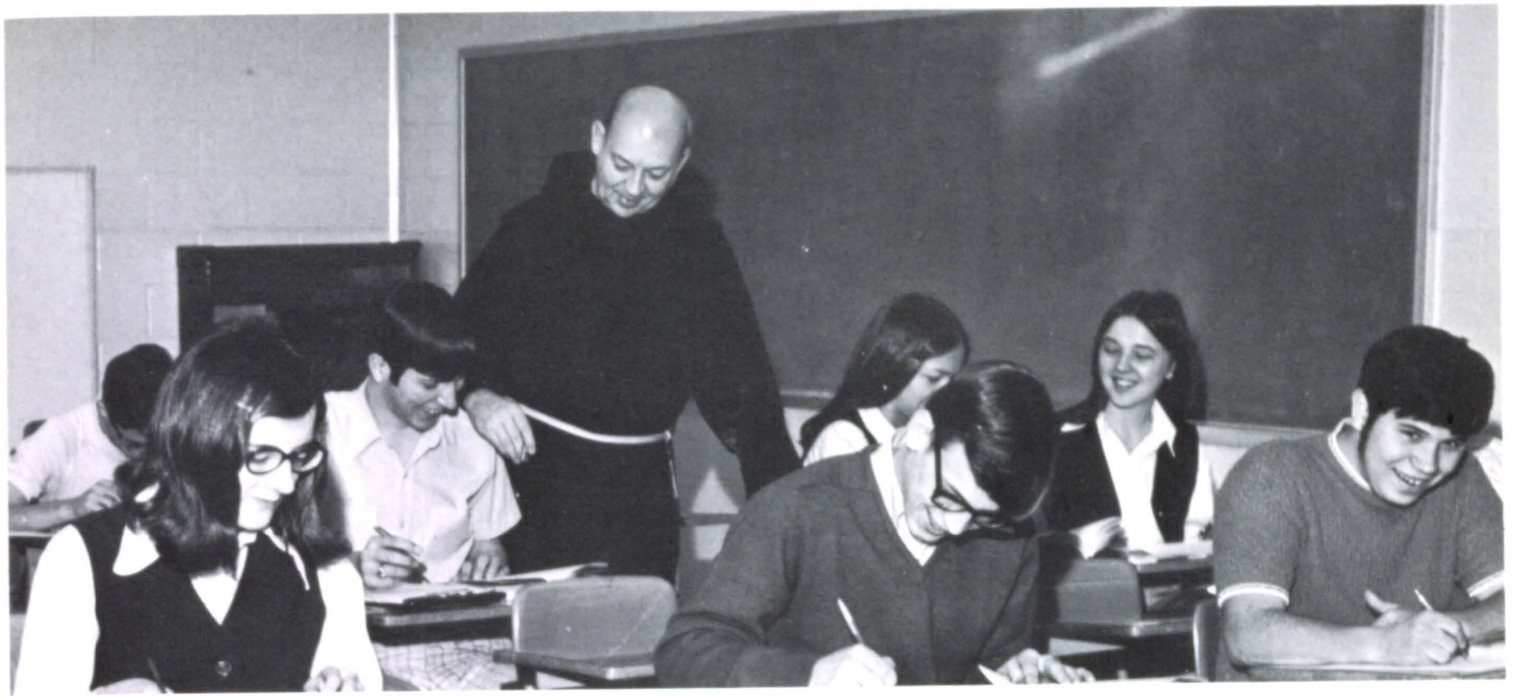

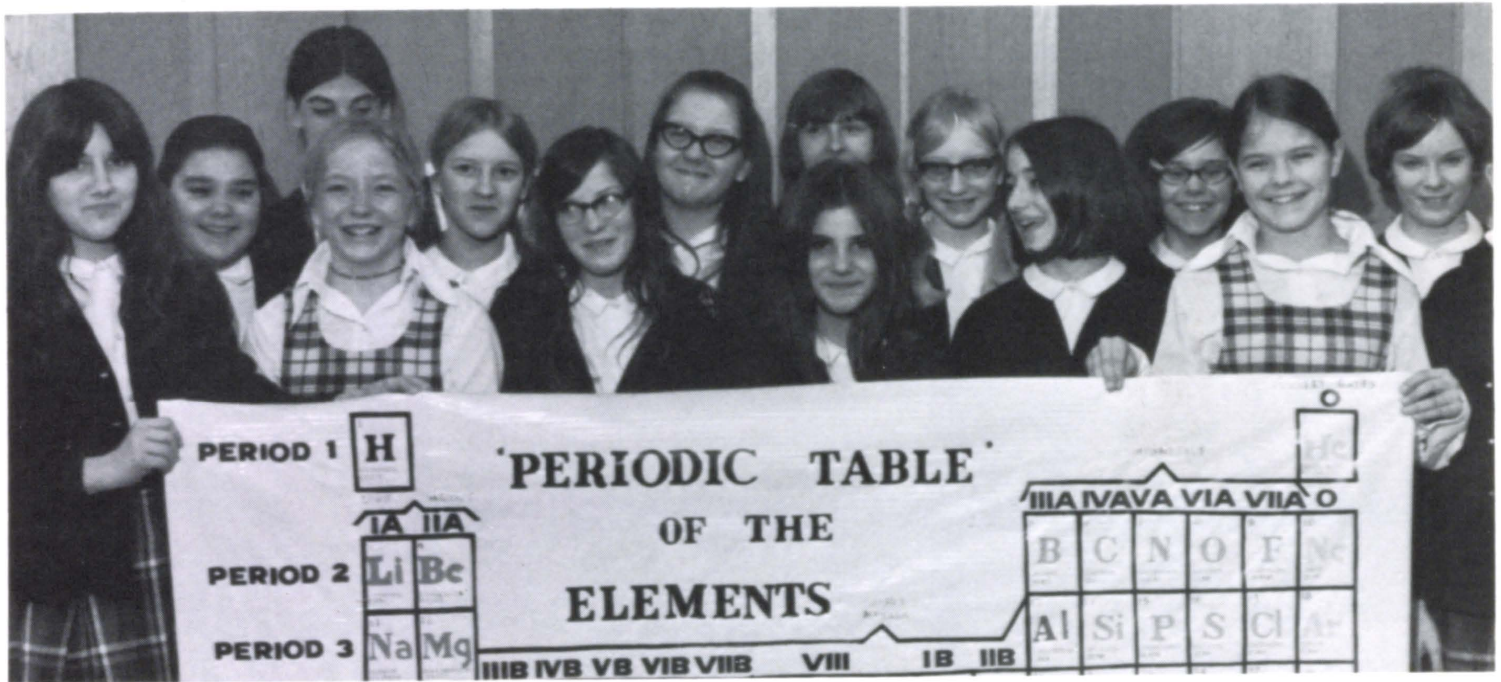
