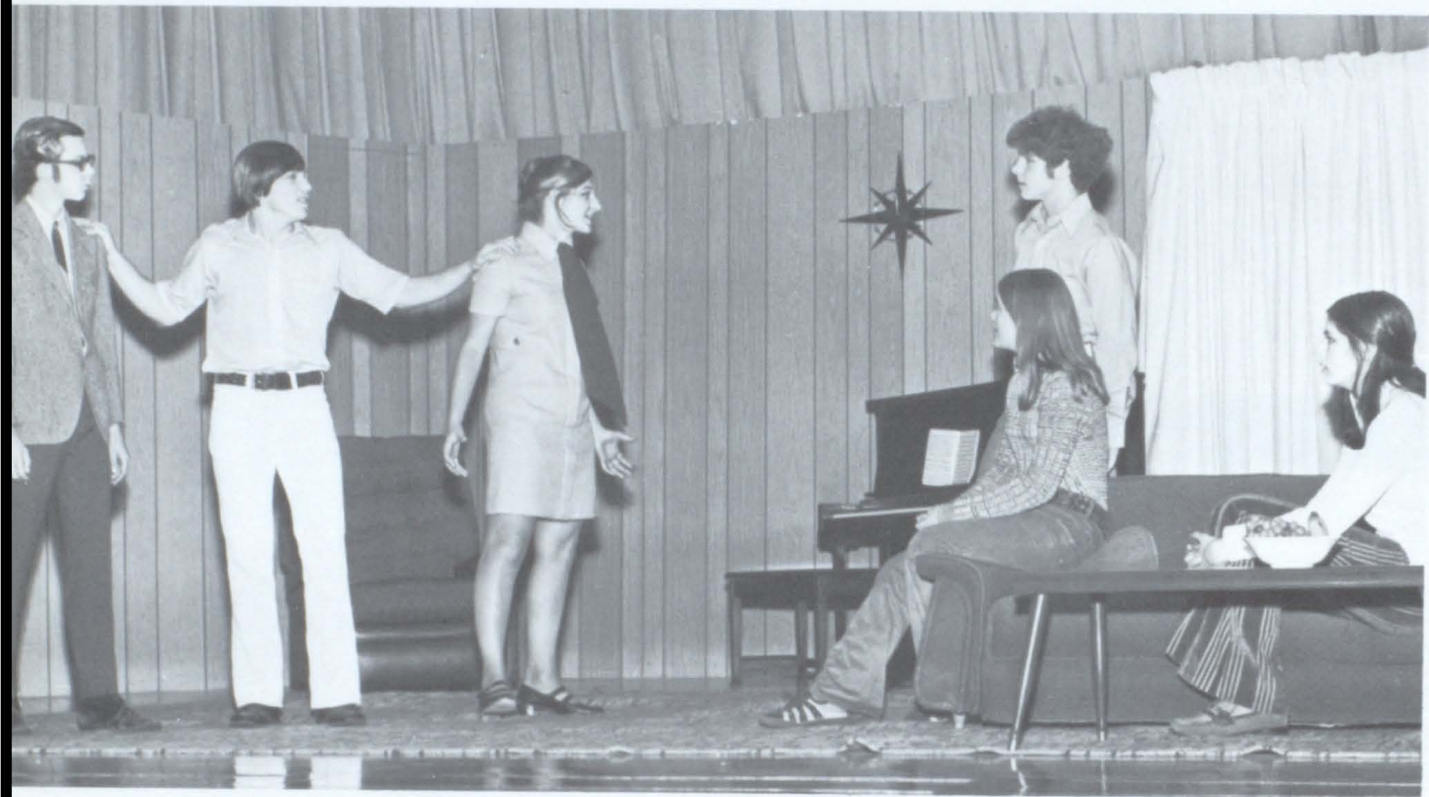


# The Thespians present "A Man Called Peter."

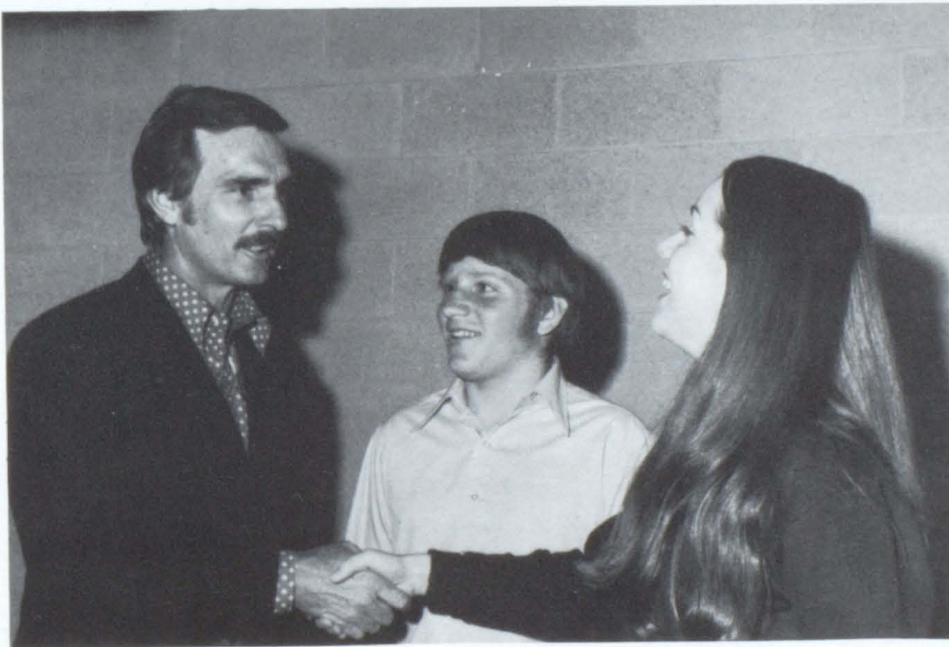




## Boy and Girl Staters

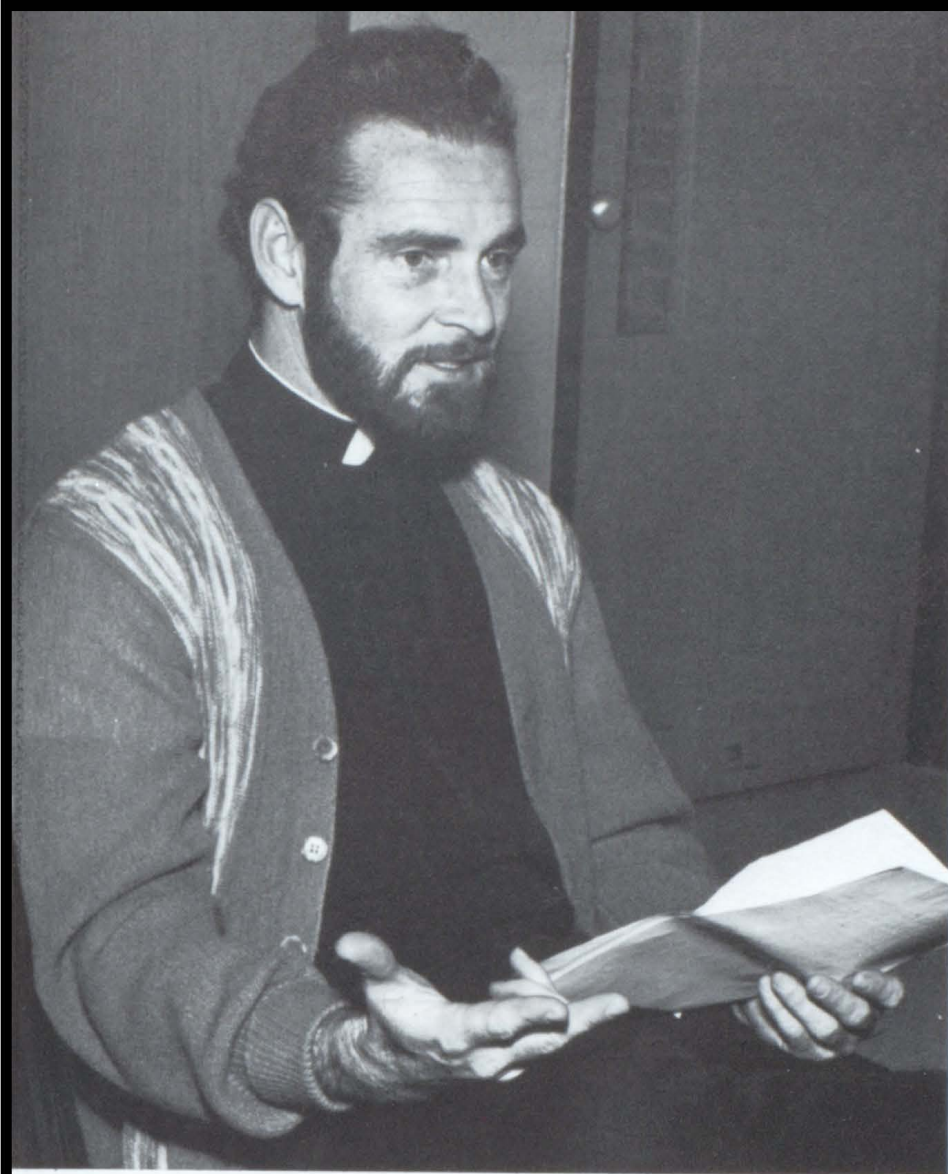
