SPRING CONCERT ENDS SEASON

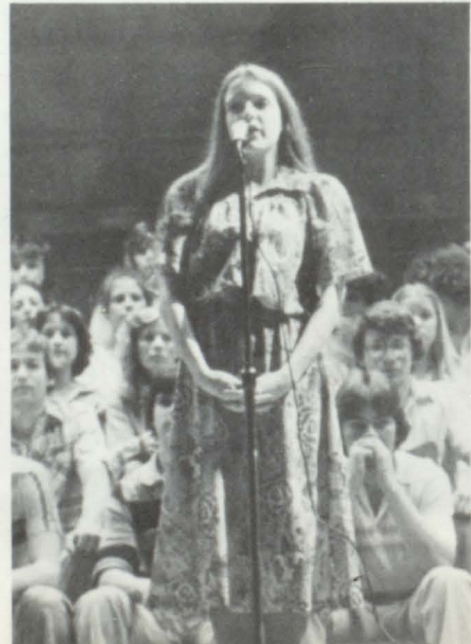

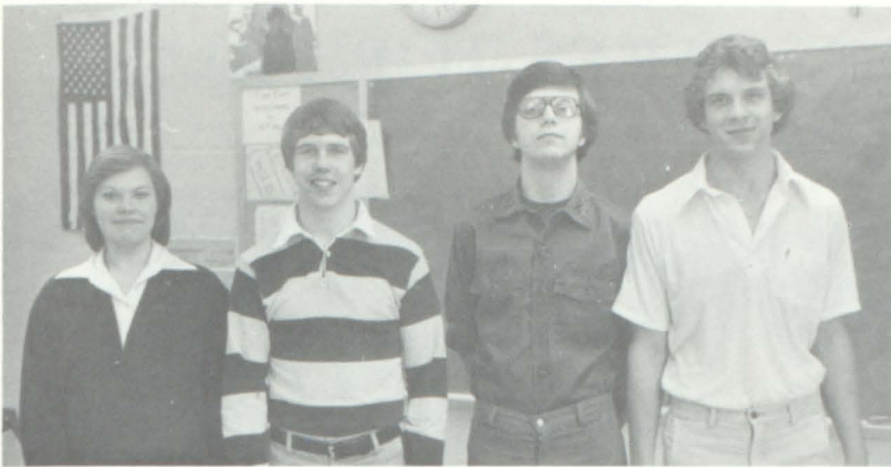

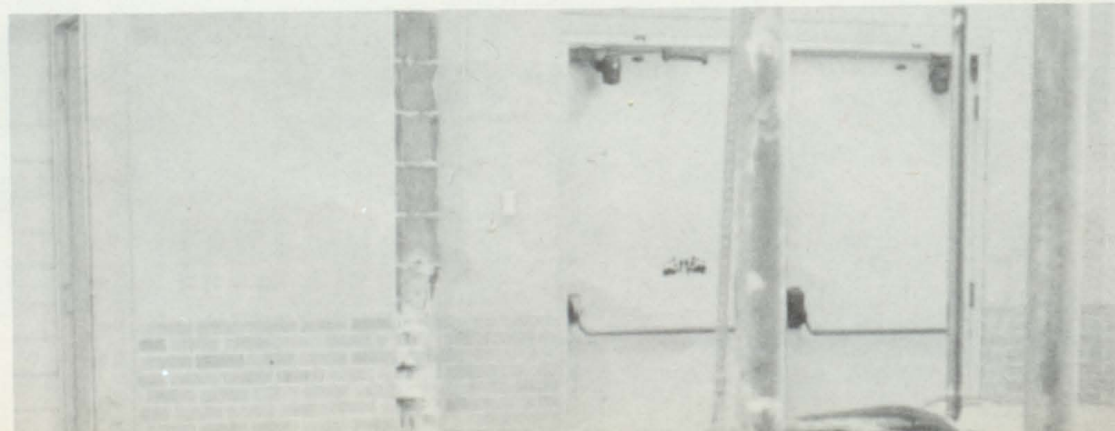


TWENTY-ONE ELECTED TO COUNTY OFFICES

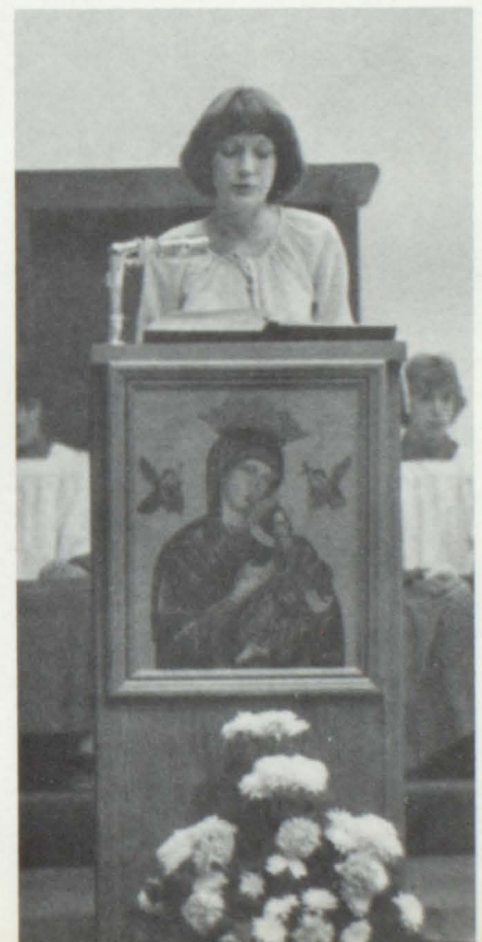
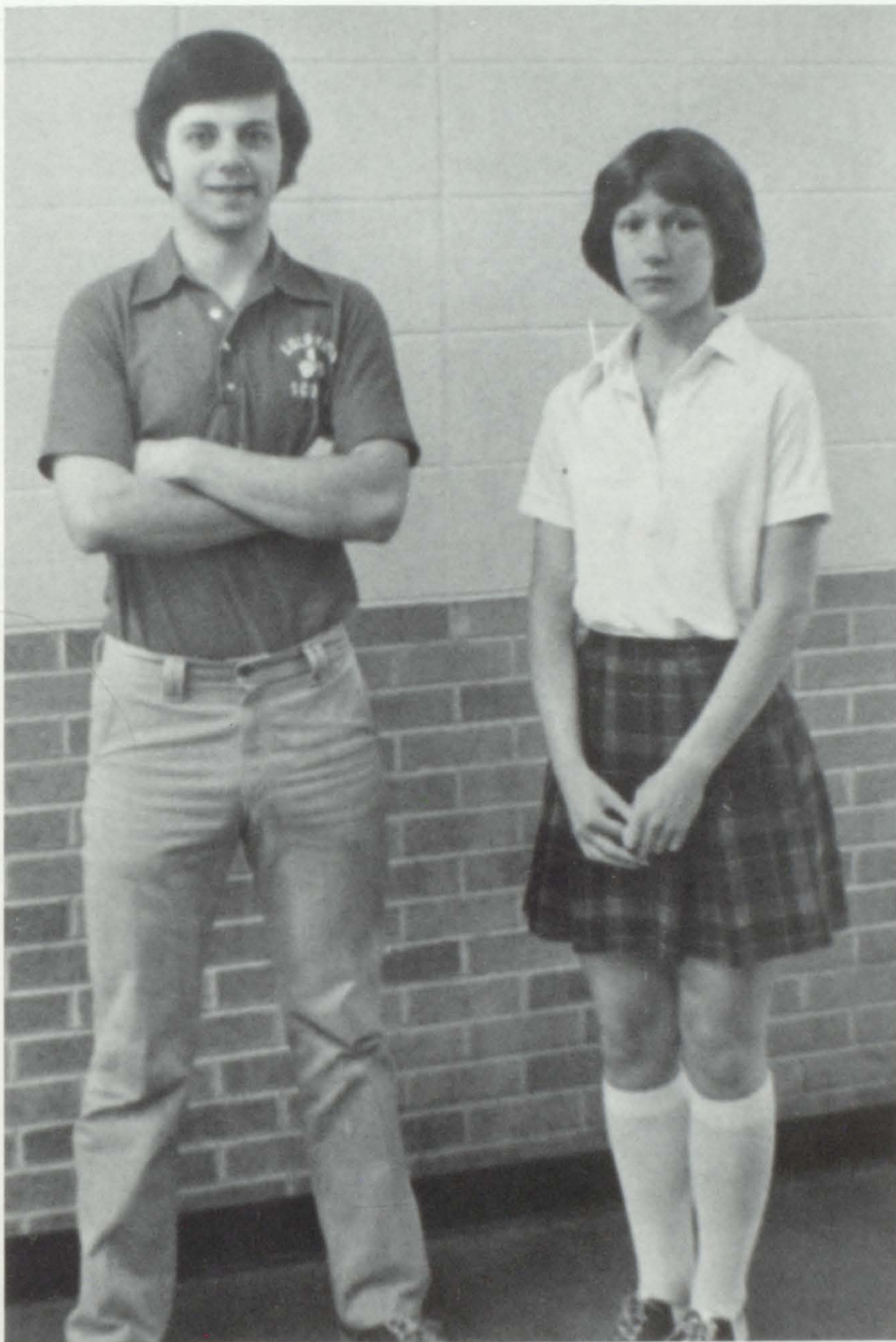

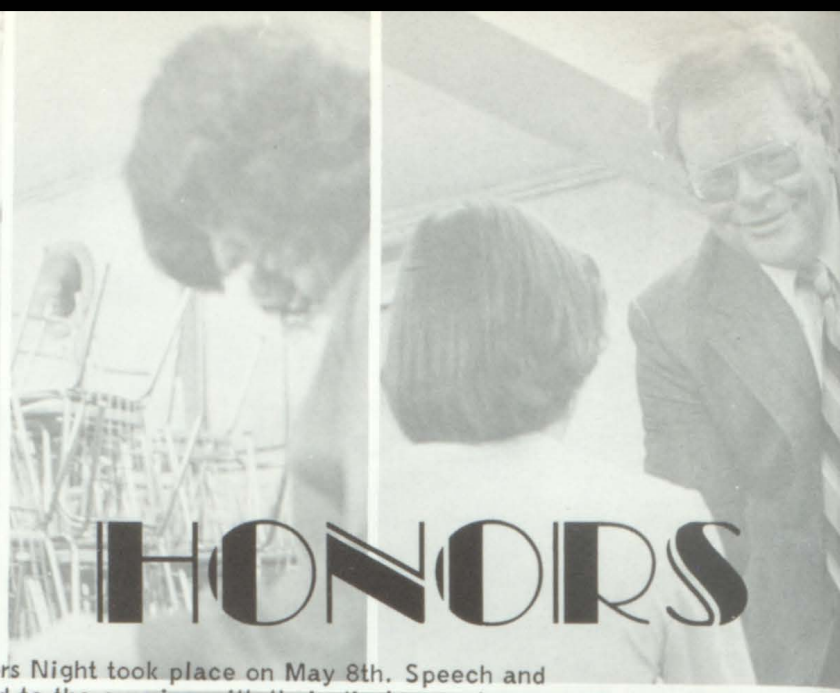


GIRL/BOY STATERS

The annual Honors Night took place on May 8th. Speech and art students added to the evening with their displays and presentations.

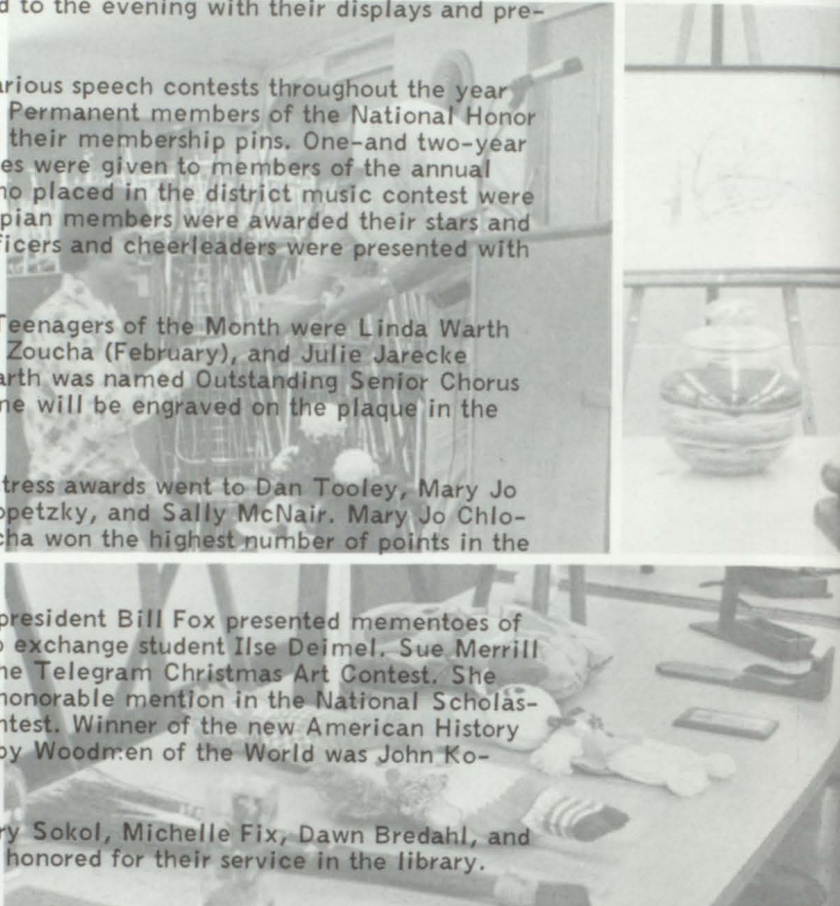
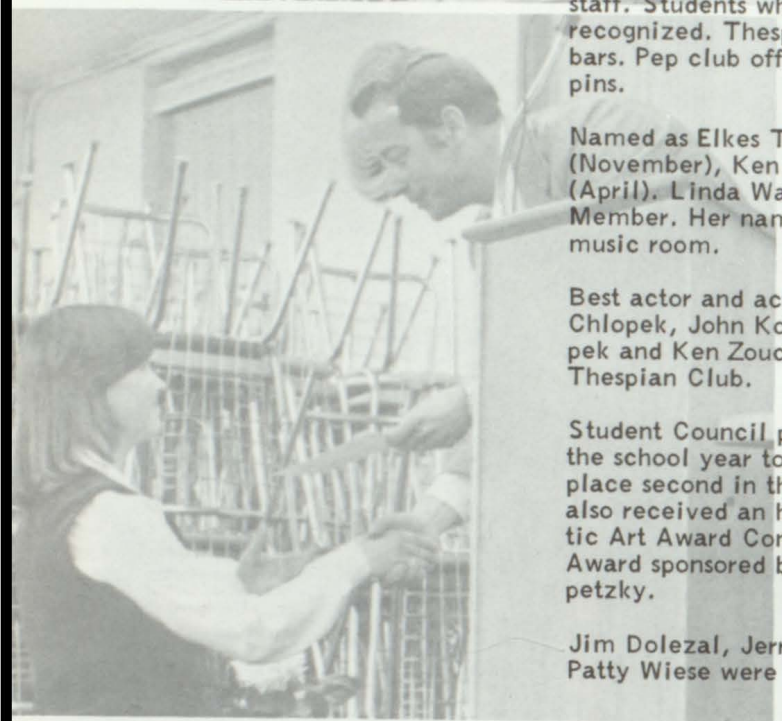

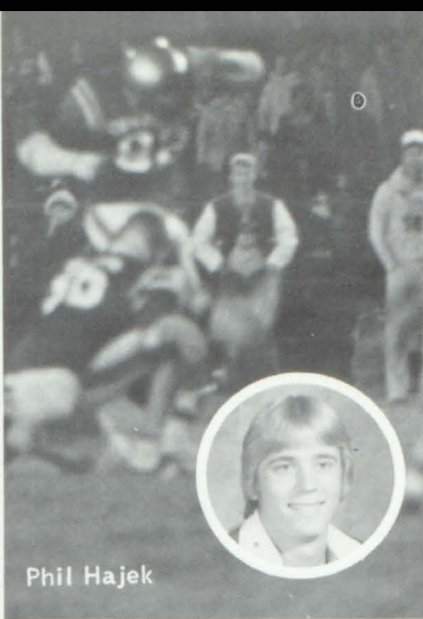
1978 SHAMROCK FOOTBALL SEASON



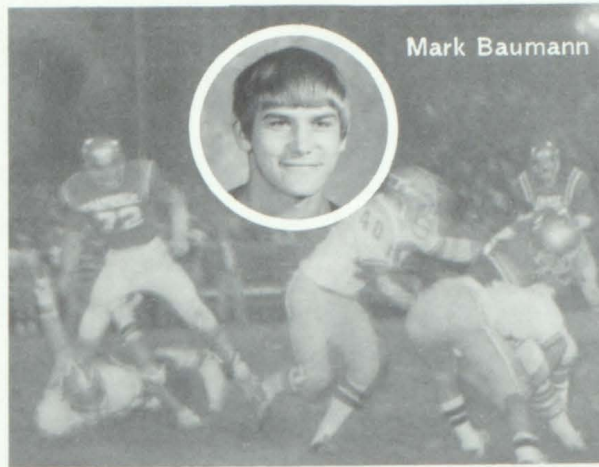
