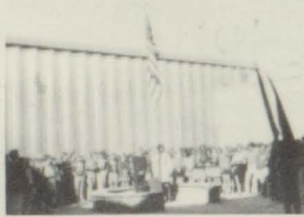
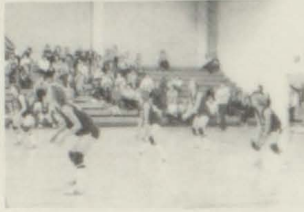
Remember Pizza Hut after all the games blowing out candles, walking the alleys and getting kicked out.

- 
- Sept. 12 Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini announced four conditions that the U.S. has to meet to secure the release of 52 of its citizens held hostage in Iran since November 4, 1979. One of the four was to release Iran's frozen assets.
- Sept. 19 A fuel explosion at an underground Titan II nuclear missile silo near Damascus, Arkansas, killed one person and injured 21 others.
- Sept. 22 Iraq and Iran conflict escalates into major warfare.
- Oct. 20 Greece rejoins NATO forces.
- Oct. 23 Some 60,000 members of the Screen Actors Guild and the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists ended their 94-day strike.
- Nov. 4 Ronald Reagan soundly defeated President Jimmy Carter in the presidential election. Reagan's electoral college vote was 489, compared to Carter's 49. The Republicans gained control of the Senate for the first time since 1956.
- Nov. 7 Steve McQueen died of a heart attack after surgery for cancer.
- Nov. 10 U.S. envoys arrive in Algeria to negotiate hostage issue.
- Nov. 12 The U.S. unmanned spacecraft Voyager I came within 77,000 miles of the planet Saturn.
- Nov. 22 Mae West died.
- Nov. 24 The MGM Grand Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada was destroyed by fire. 84 people died in the fire.
- Dec. 2 The U.S., European Economic Community, and NATO warn the U.S.S.R. against an invasion of Poland.

- April 21 Grain embargo against Soviet Union is lifted.

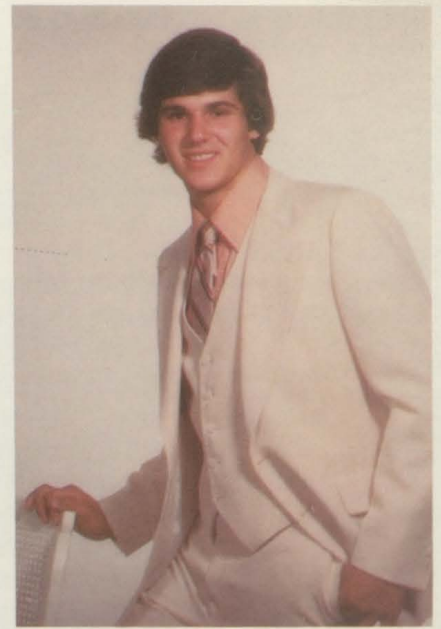




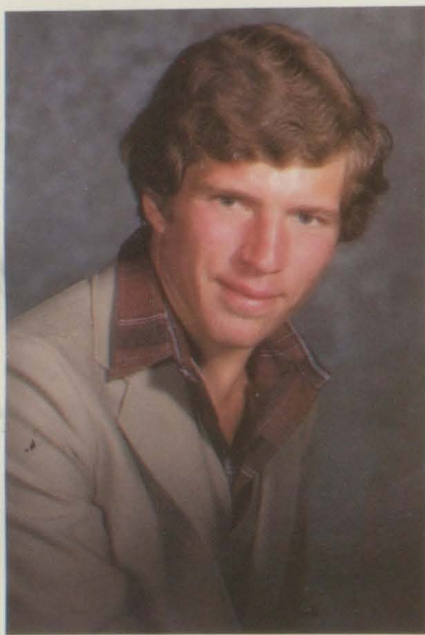

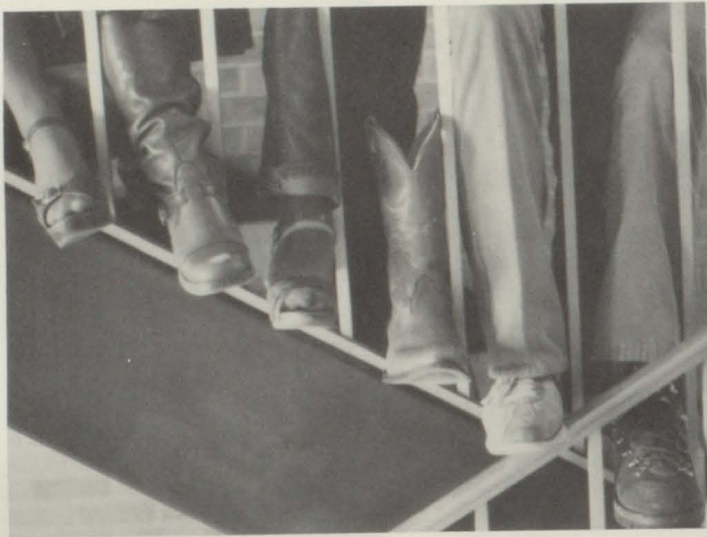
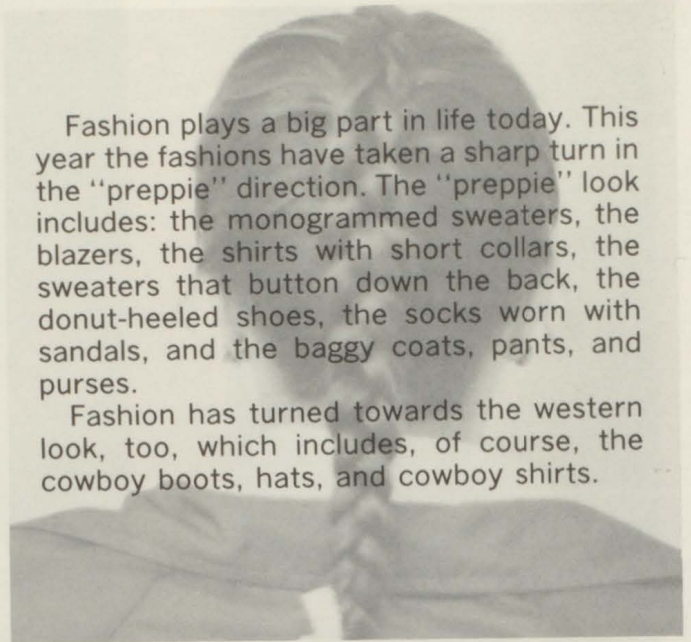


# Fashion

This year's Junior-Senior Prom turned out to be a very formal gala with the boys wearing tuxes or three-piece suits and the girls dressed in spring formals.

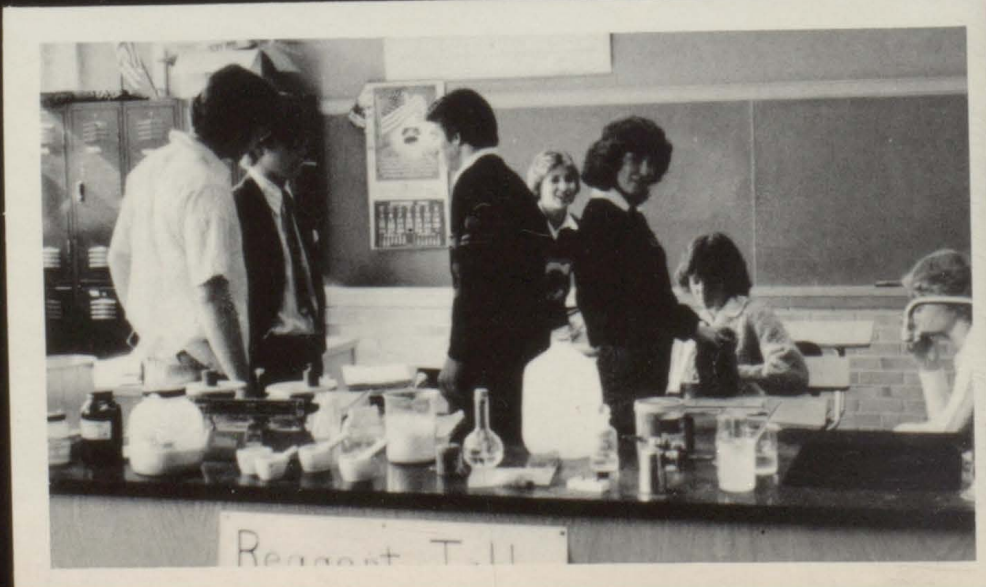
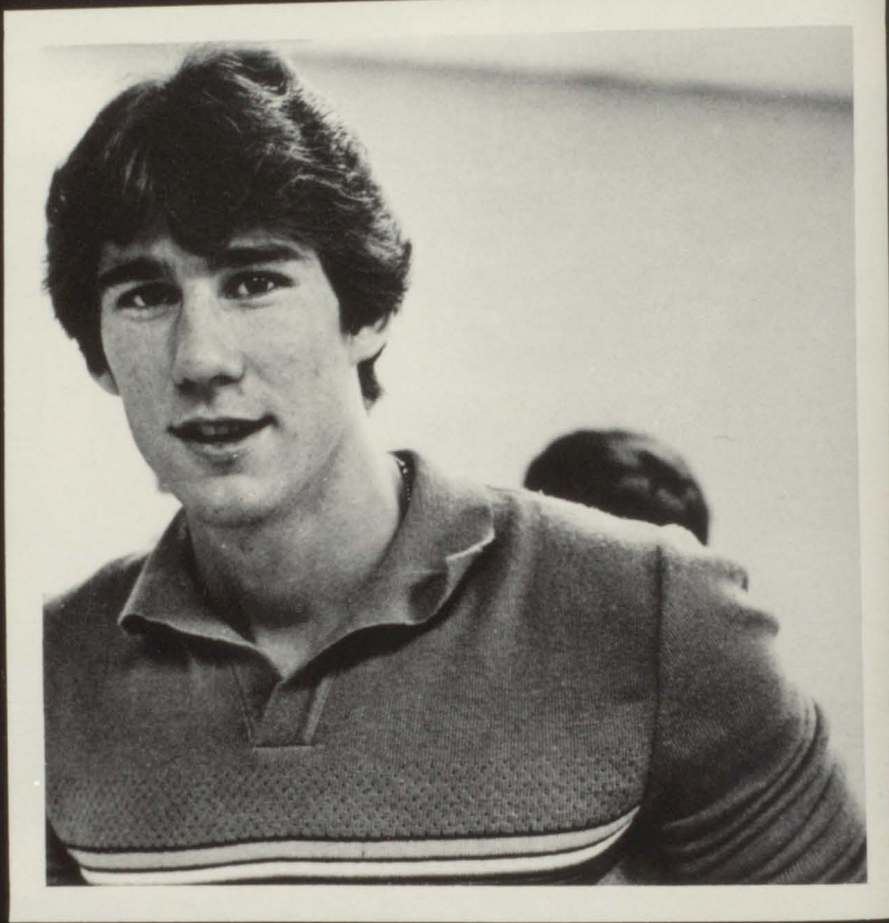

However, the Prom evening did not end there, the festivities continued well into the morning hours!!!





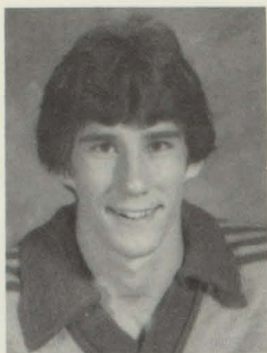

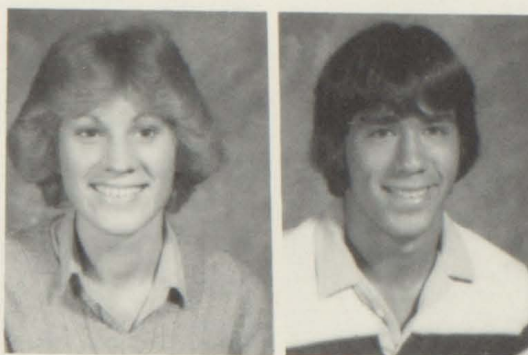


# Junior Memories

The team was Centennial Conference Divisional Champions with a 3-0 record, and they placed 2nd in the Centennial Conference Tournament.

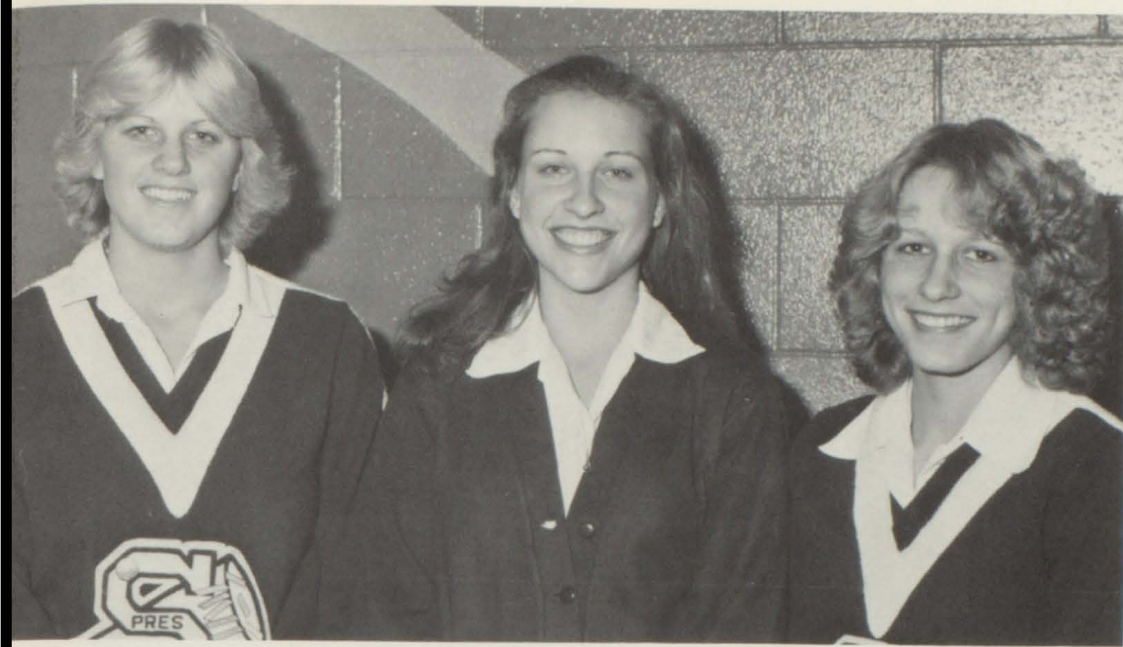

An all school pep rally, derby hats, green handkerchiefs, and green balloons, were included in the Scotus scene before state, and also an actual Irishman mascot!

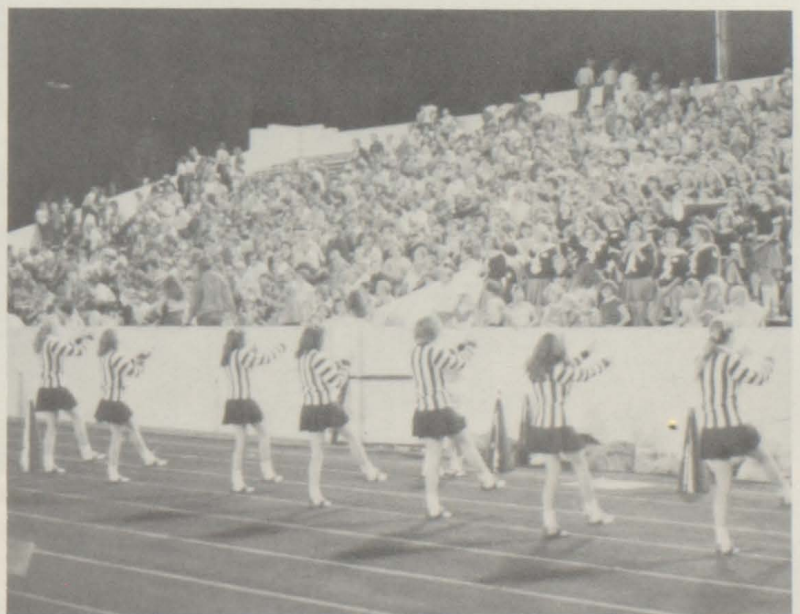

**Scotistics** came out once every month during the school year. This provided consistency for our readers and advertisers.

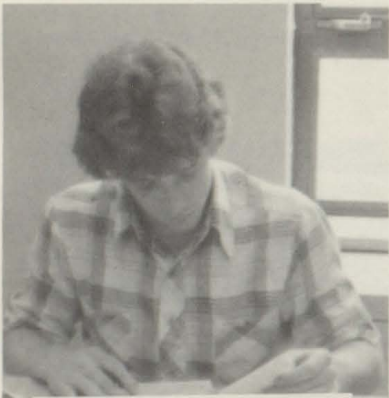

The musical was a tremendous success in each of the three performances.

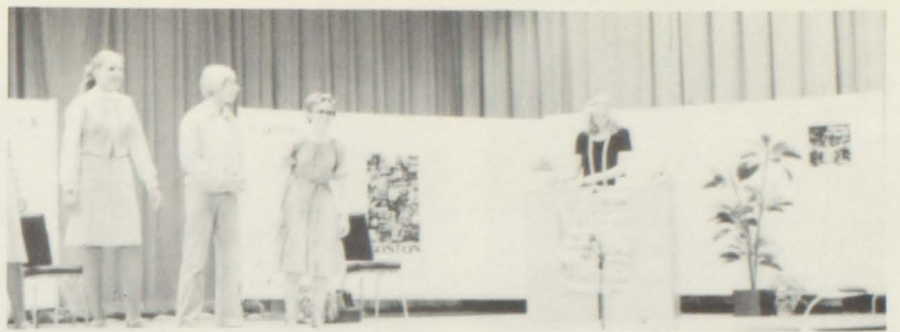
