Sept. 12 Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini announced four conditions that the U.S. has to meet to secure the release of 52 of its citizens held hostage in Iran since November 4, 1979. One of the four was to release Iran's frozen assets.
Sept. 19 A fuel explosion at an underground Titan II nuclear missile silo near Damascus, Arkansas, killed one person and injured 21 others.
Sept. 22 Iraq and Iran conflict escalates into major warfare
