Their class sponsor was Mr. Dan Mahoney.

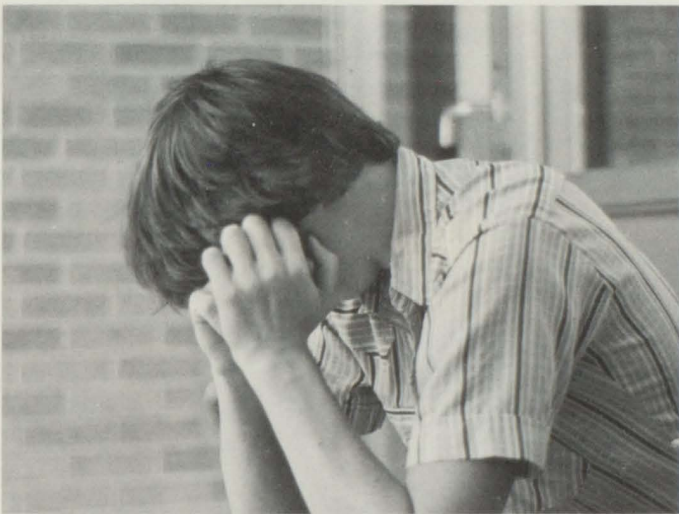

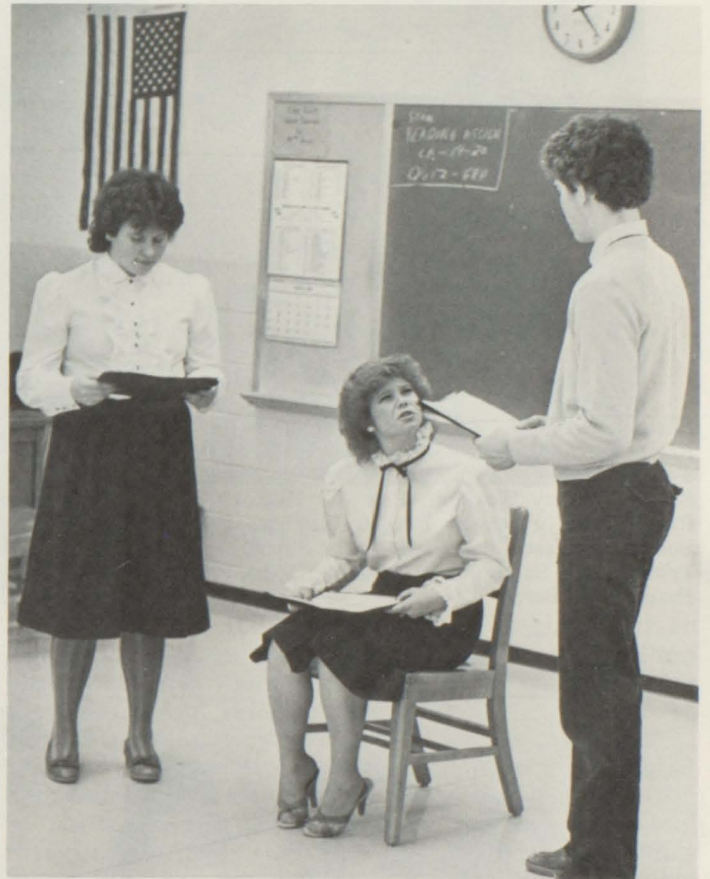

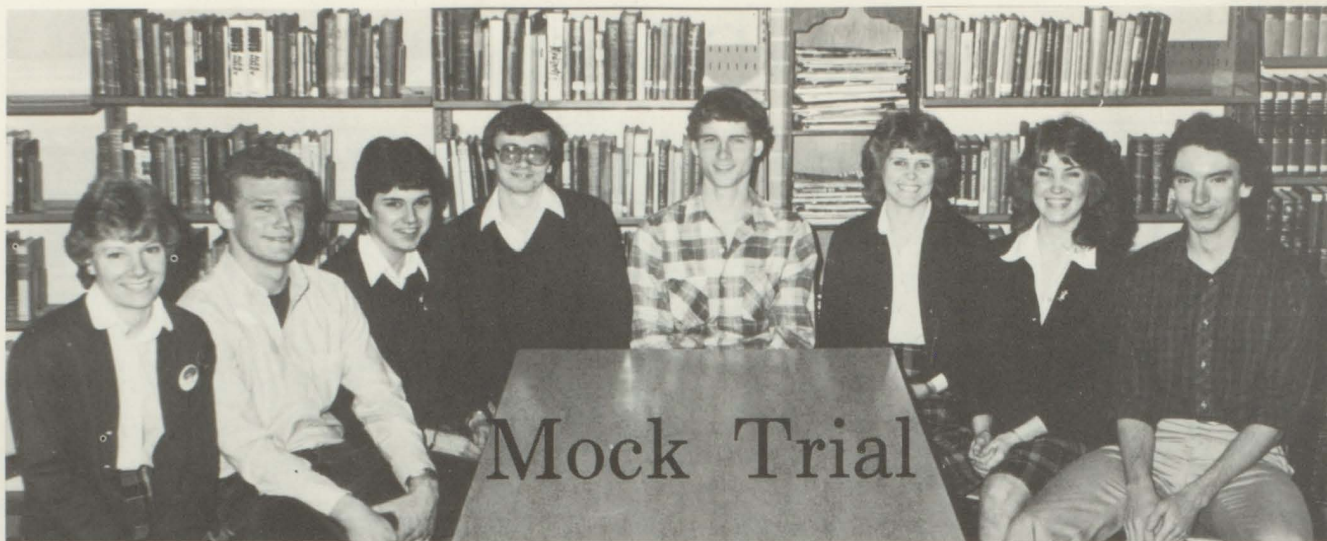
1983 was the beginning of an Art Club at Scotus. The club, initiated by Mrs. Nancy Wrage, is to let students see and appreciate art.
