For many years, the legend of the Scotus ghost has roamed through the halls. Stories of all kinds have been told. Most are simply not true, but occasionally you'll hear one that makes you wonder.

Who is this ghost, you may ask. How did she get here? Why is she here? These are some of the many questions asked. Some of these questions cannot be answered and many of the answers are merely theories.

Many people have given their ideas to whom the ghost may be. Some say that the ghost is a nun. This theory stems from the story that once a fire started in the school and the nun was trapped in the tunnels below. These theorists say that she was burned to death and now roams the halls of Scotus. Another idea claims that the ghost is actually not a nun, but the mysterious little boy in the picture on this page.

The most believable theory is the one about a young girl who died before she graduated. Kitty Kavanaugh, a talented drama and art student, may be the ghost here at Scotus. In 1895, the first class from St. Francis Academy (now known as Scotus) graduated. Kitty was supposed to graduate, but she came down with an influenza epidemic and died only a few short weeks before graduation.

Many people believe in the ghost because of their experiences with it. One teacher here at Scotus saw it on the staircase late one night. Another former teacher said she always saw a shadow of a person at the top of the stairwell. Yet another former teacher said that while she was in her room she heard an unhuman sound come over the speaker. Later, when she put her key in the keyhole, the key turned by itself. A former student claims that once, while going to his locker after drama practice, he felt a strange presence behind him. He thought it was the priest of Scotus at that time so he began a conversation, but there was no answer. A bit alarmed, he turned around and saw a shadowy figure. Now, very frightened, he ran to where the other students were and looked back, but saw nothing.

In 1980, ghost hunters were brought into Scotus. There, they found a presence in the journalism room, the art room, the keyboarding room, Fr. Wayne's office and a staircase. Most reported encounters have occurred at or near these same places. Furthermore, items have been reported missing from these rooms. But not to worry, the ghost hunters said that the ghost was a friendly ghost.

We will probably never really know is there is ghost or not, so in classic Ripley fashion, you can choose to BELIEVE IT OR NOT!
