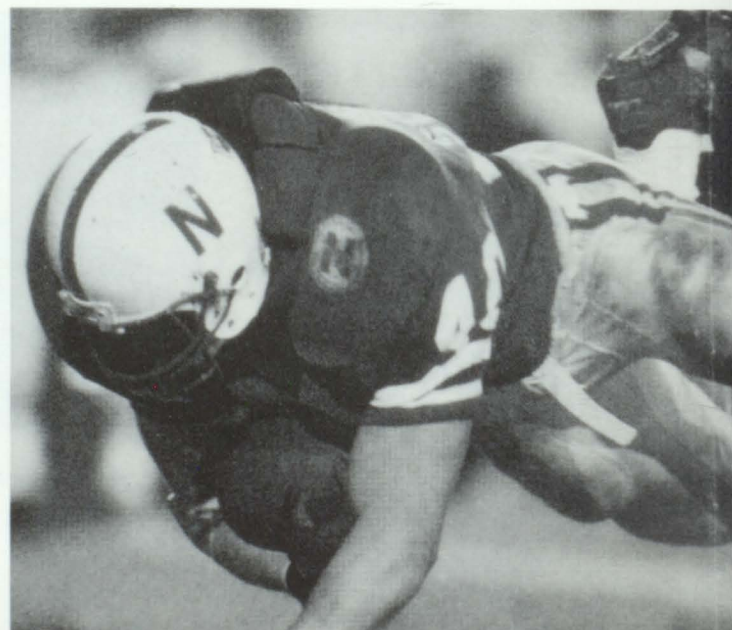

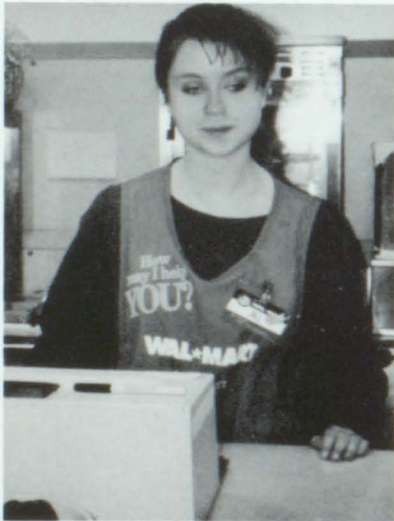
When the last bell rings and everybody rushes to the door, students aren't always going home. It's a start of another part of the day.

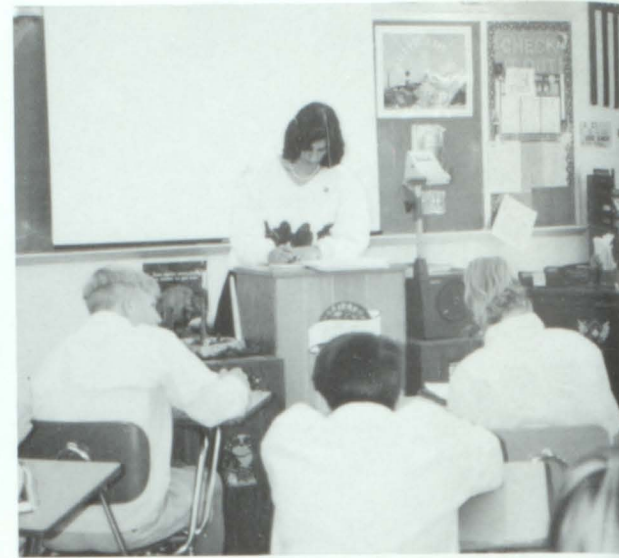


When you attend religion class at Scotus, you really toon in with God. From the minute you walk in the seventh grade religion classroom with Mrs.

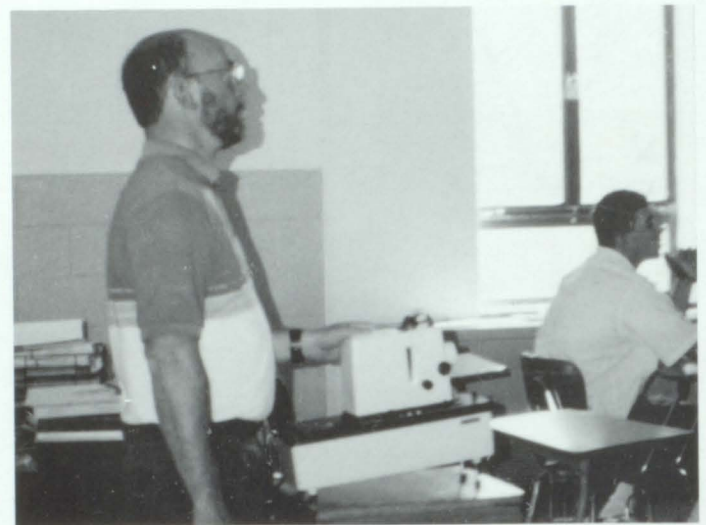

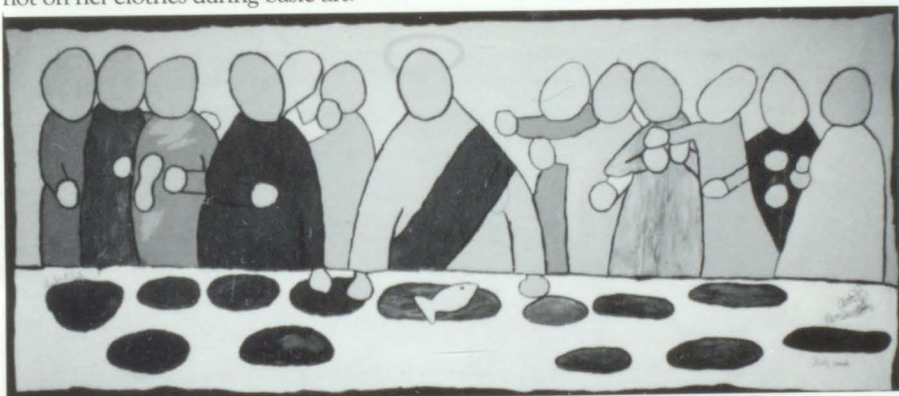

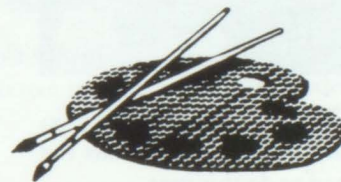

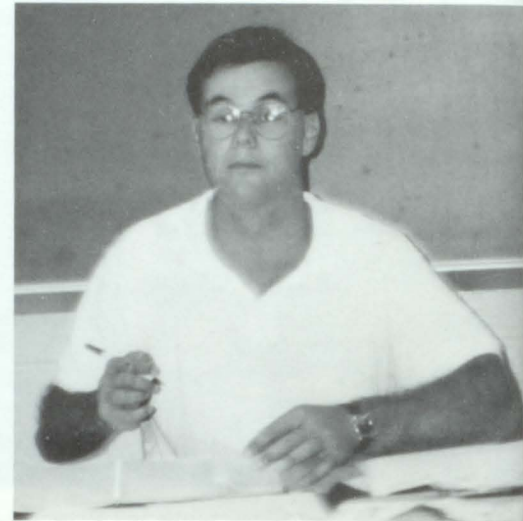

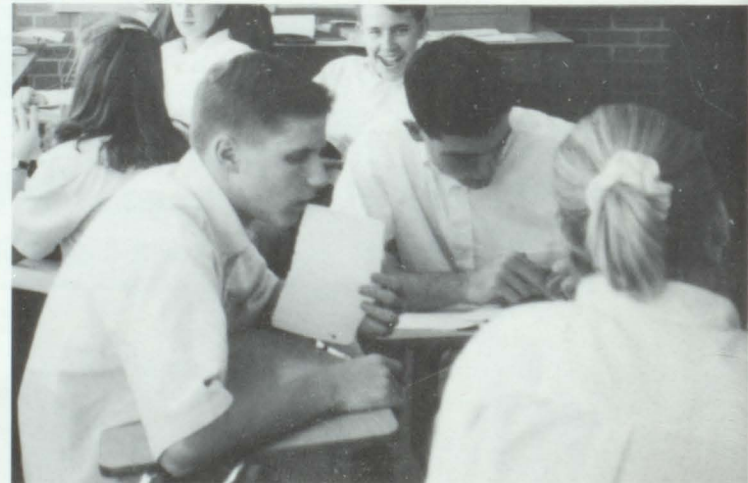

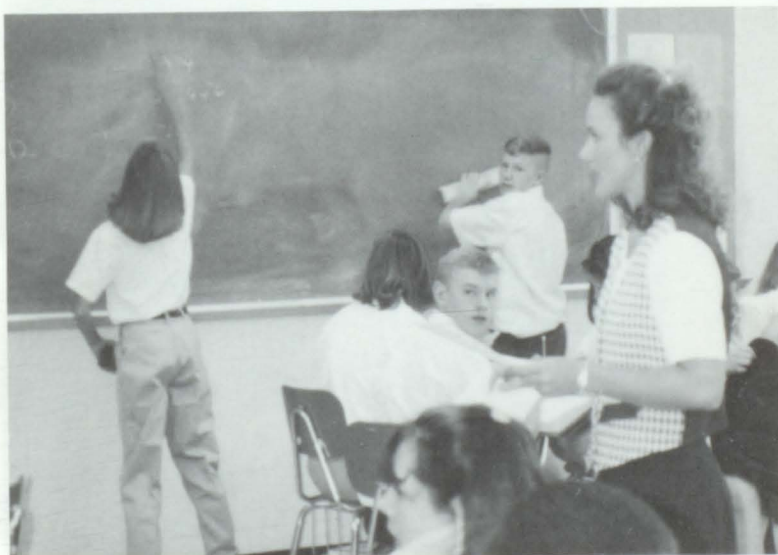


When you think of mathematics, you think of functions, equations, story problems, and most of all lots of numbers. Here at Scotus you are required to take 2 years of mathematics in both junior and senior high. The great thing that Scotus offers is a variety of ways to receive your credits.

In the high school you are offered six different math classes. Your choices include basic math and algebra I taught by Mrs. Blaser, algebra II taught by Mr. Lahm, geometry and advanced math both taught by Mr. Petersen, and finally calculus taught by Mr. Salyard. In junior high on the other hand you must take seventh grade Math with Mrs. Pekarek, and at the end of the year each student takes a placement test to see whether or not they can skip eighth grade math taught by Mrs. Blaser or take algebra I with Mrs. Pekarek. No matter what classes you end up taking, you can't say you weren't offered a variety of ways to get your mathematics education.

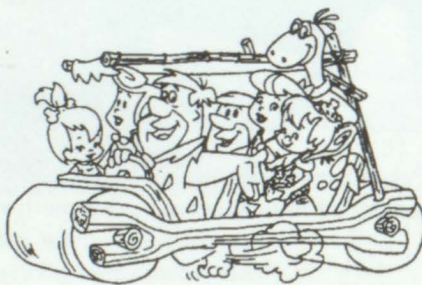

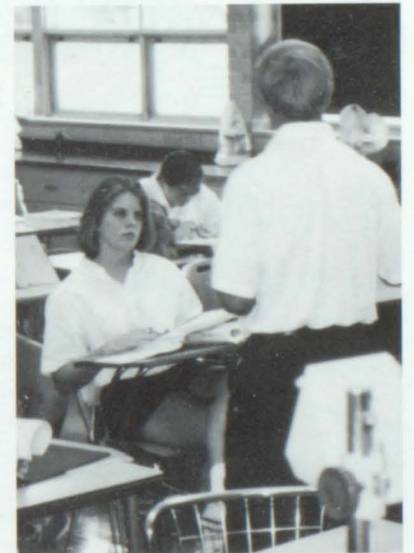

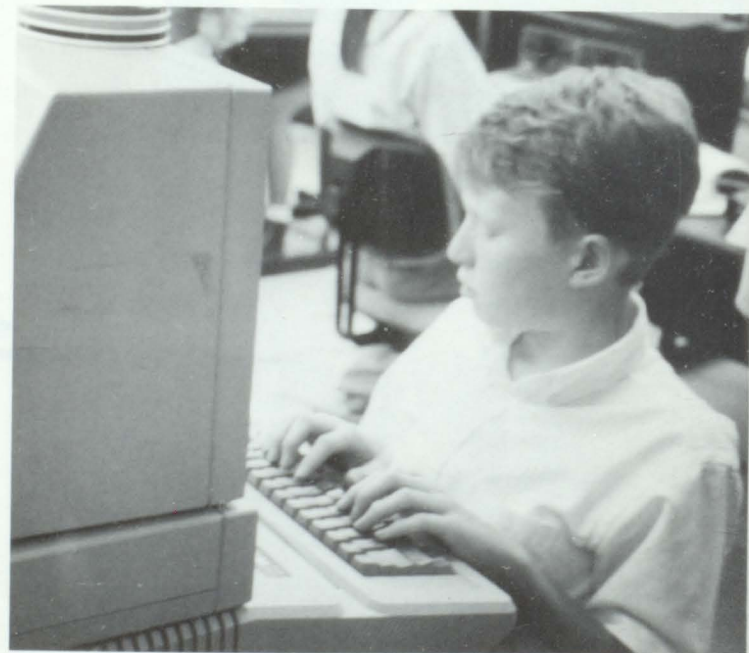


(right) Matt Moseman finishes his Keyboarding II assignment while Jill Robak asks a question. (lower left) The Keyboarding I class warms up for their timings.

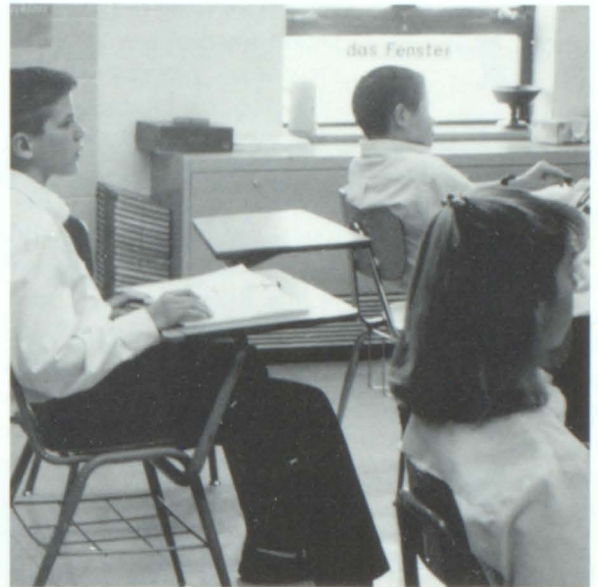

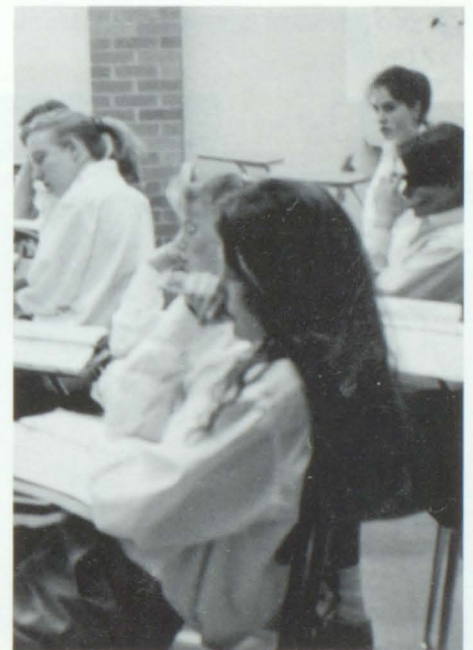
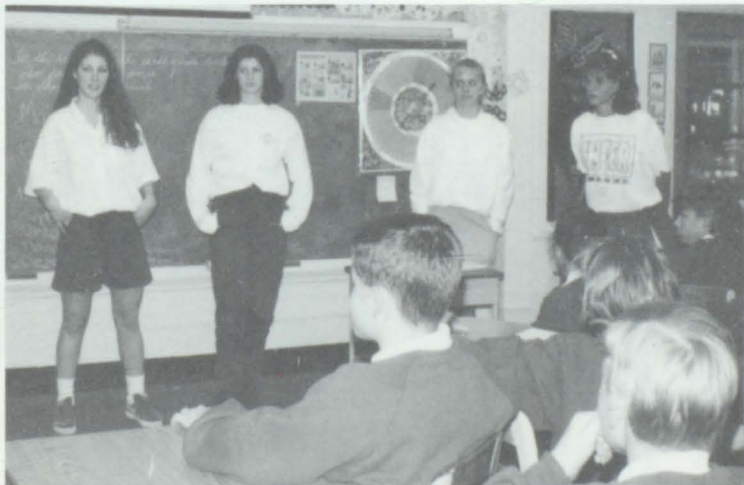

From working on the first aid dummy doll to sewing the locker caddies, the home economics department of Scotus has its variety of activities and projects. In 7th and 8th grade the life management classes teach you basic "on your own fundamentals." Mrs. Johnson teaches her 7th and 8th grades some of the main concepts a person should know in life such as food, preparation, proper intake, sewing etc ... Students also have the opportunity to take advantage of three high school courses that will expand their knowledge of the basic concepts. 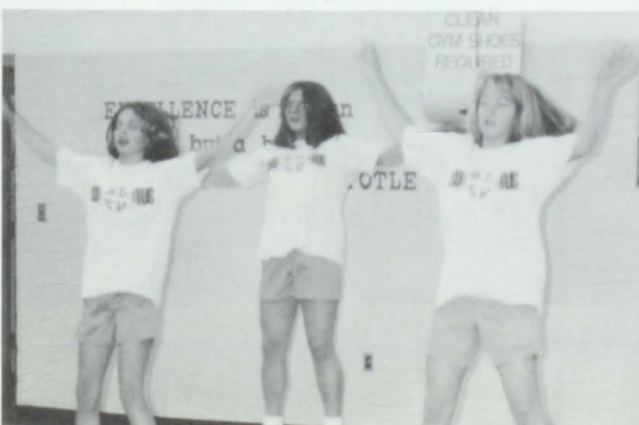

Students here at Scotus are required to take four years of physical education classes. Besides taking P. E. from 7th grade to 10th grade, students have the chance to take additional P. E. classes such as weight training, wellness, and advanced P. E. The four years of P. E. class focus on physical fitness, co-ed or intermixed learning in the gym, dance techniques, strength, and personal health factors. Weight lifting is a new class added to the Scotus curriculum. Its schedule focuses solely on strength training of the body. Students are in the weight room four days a week concentrating on technique and reps. Wellness is a class taught by Mrs. Tooley which focuses on the well-being of the human body through fitness, toning, proper food intake, and good health habits. Mrs. Tooley and Mr. Puetz both take their turns at the advanced P. E. level. They teach students sports they can enjoy once they are out of school. At Scotus, physical education plays a big role on how well we are eating, working out, and taking care of our bodies. 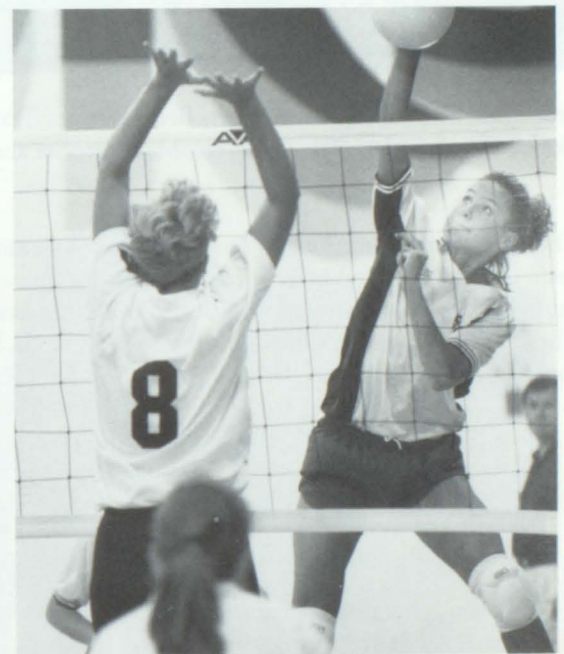

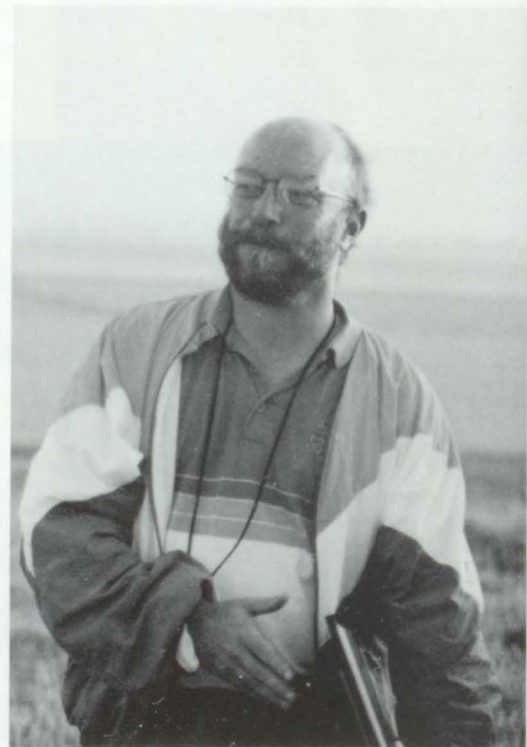

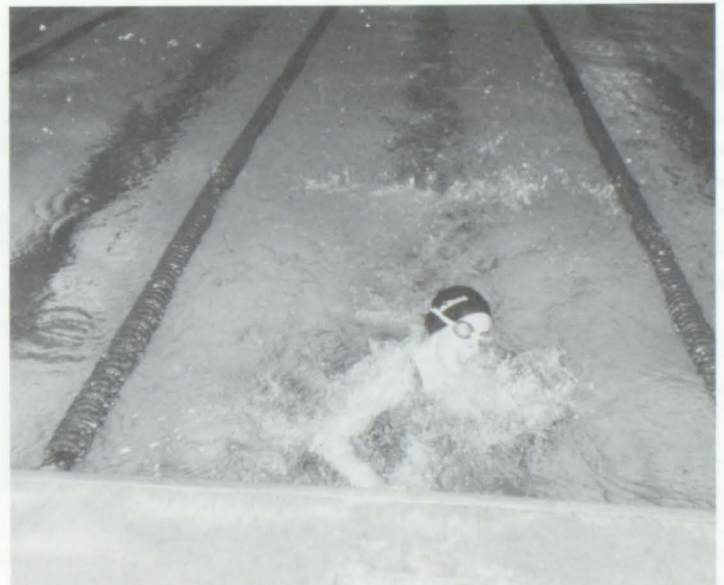

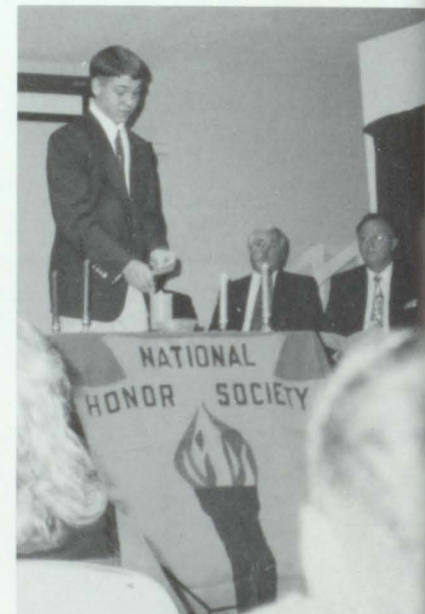

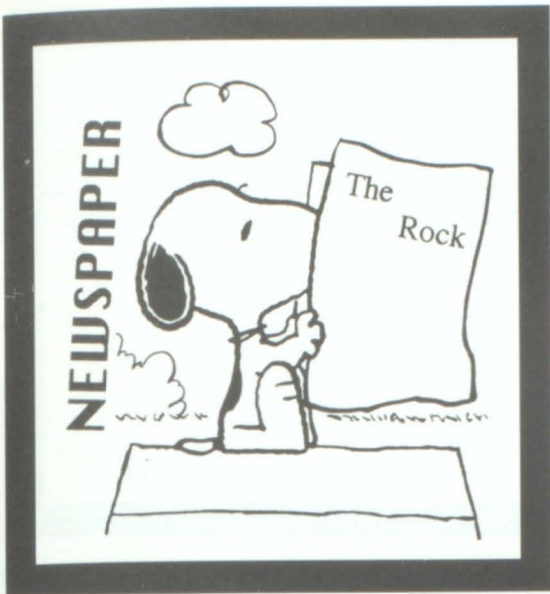

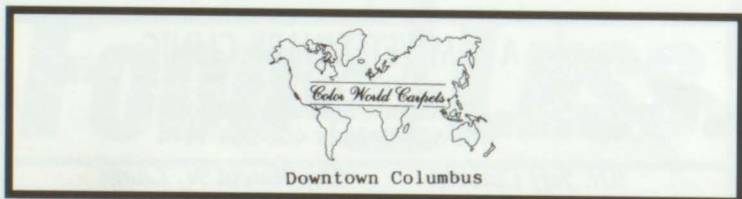

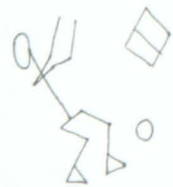

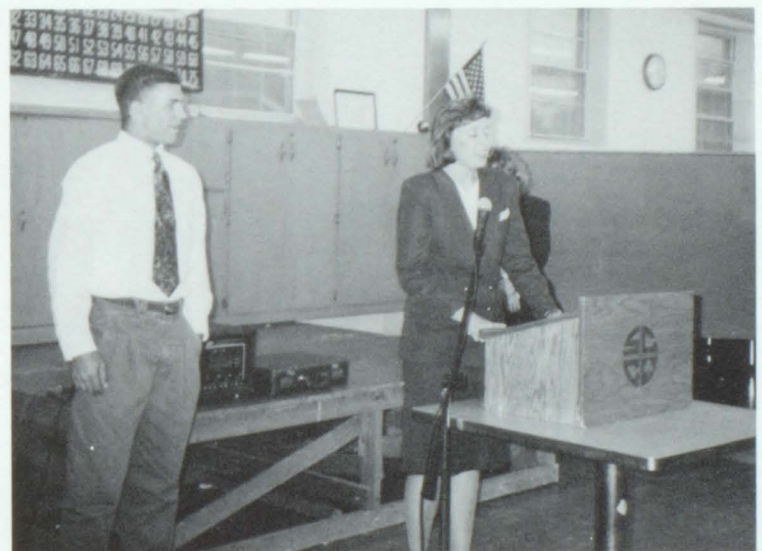

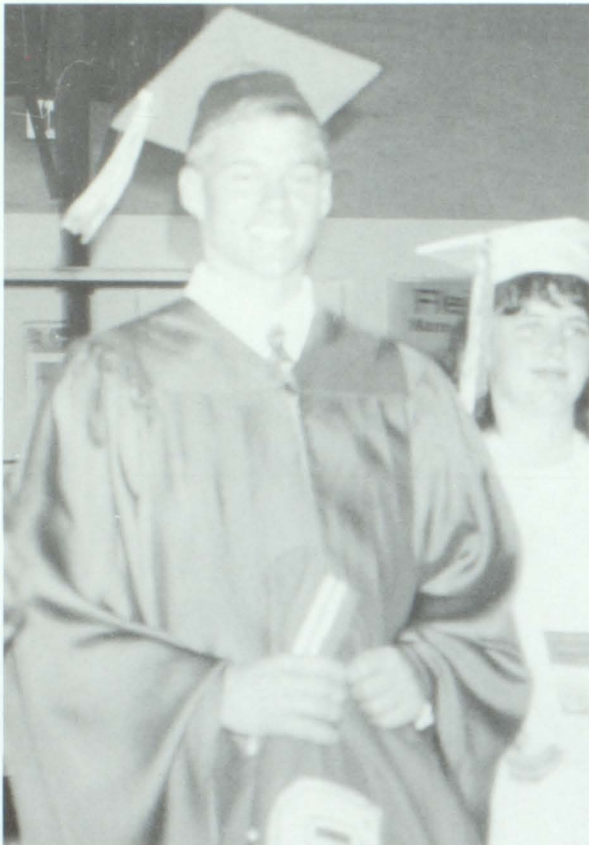




"One by One"
