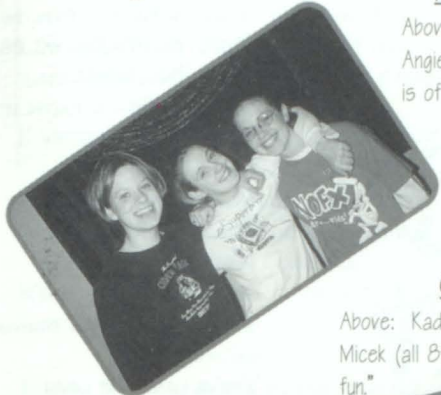

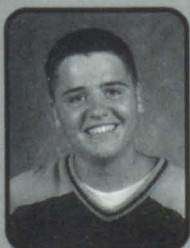

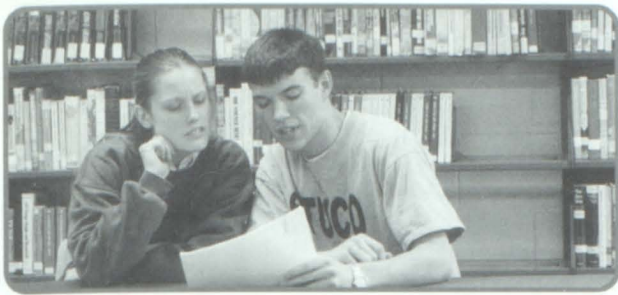

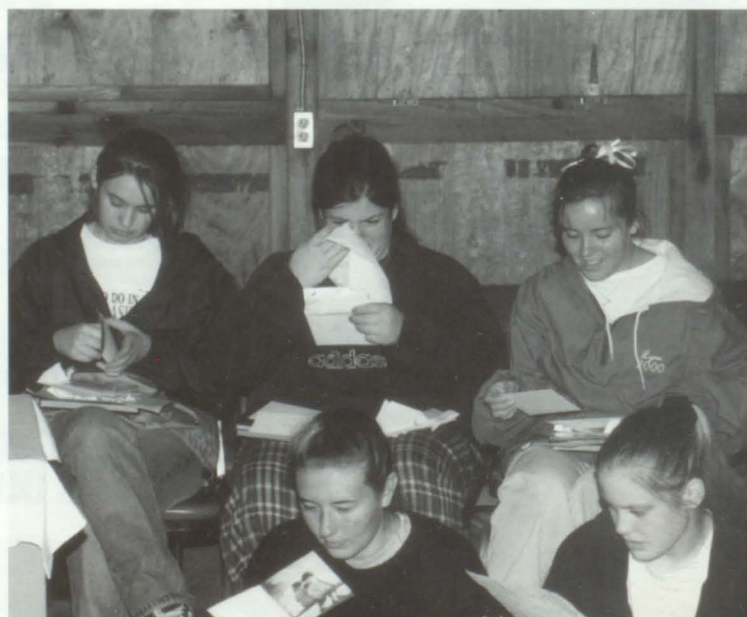

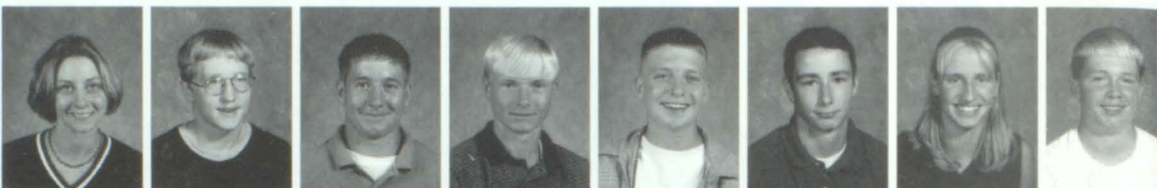


# Juniors

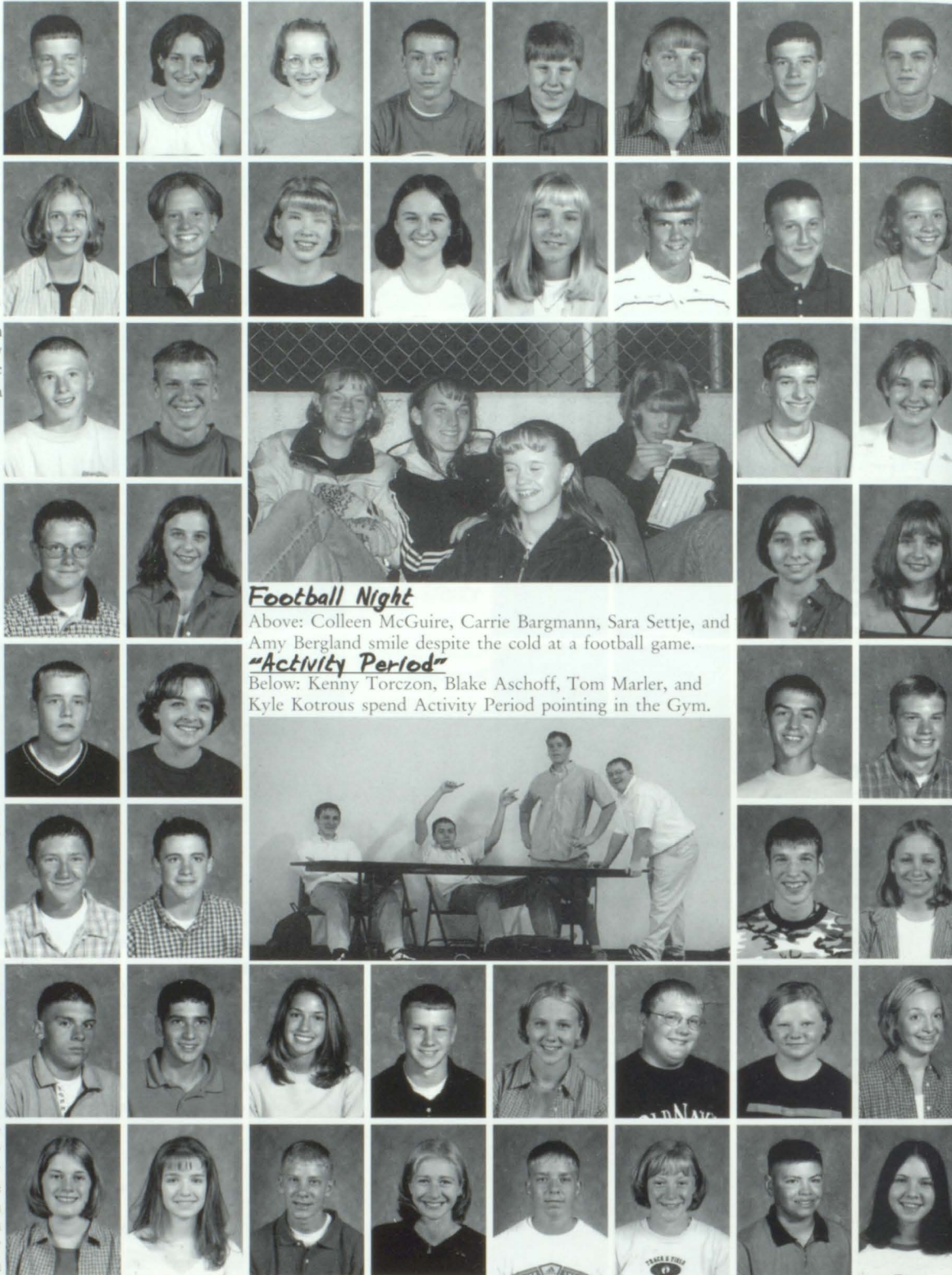


# Sophomores

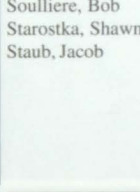

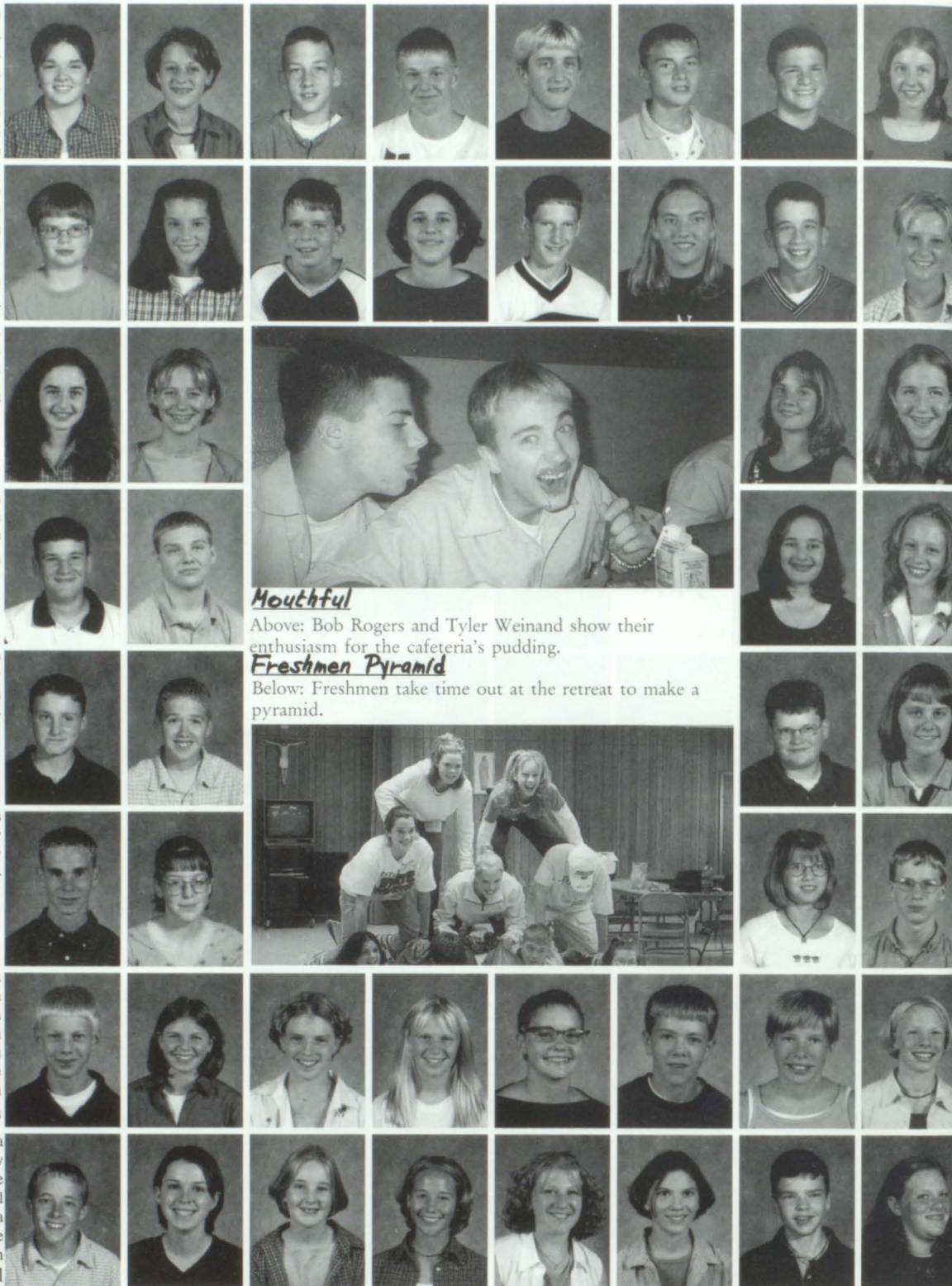


# Freshmen

Geometry is taught by Mr. Petersen, who also teaches Advanced Math. Mr. Lahm teaches Advanced Math along with Mr. Petersen,

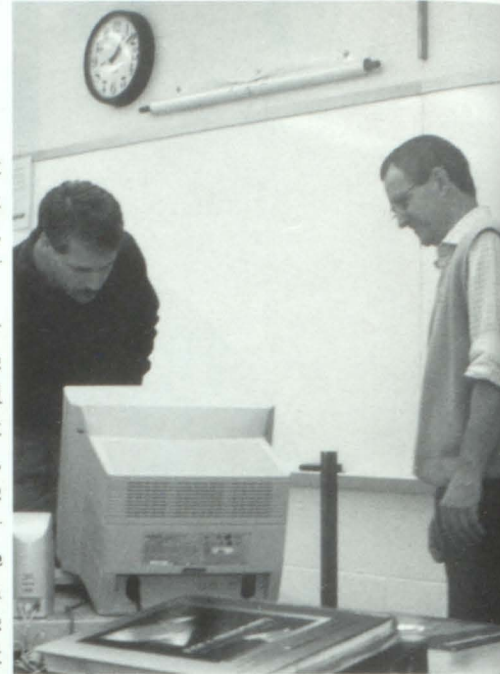
and he also teaches Algebra II. Just when you thought you were done with the math department, here comes Mr. Salyard with Calculus.

Mrs. Salyard teaches Keyboarding in the Junior High years. Scotus has received a new Gateway 2000 lab that will surely keep us up to date for years to come.

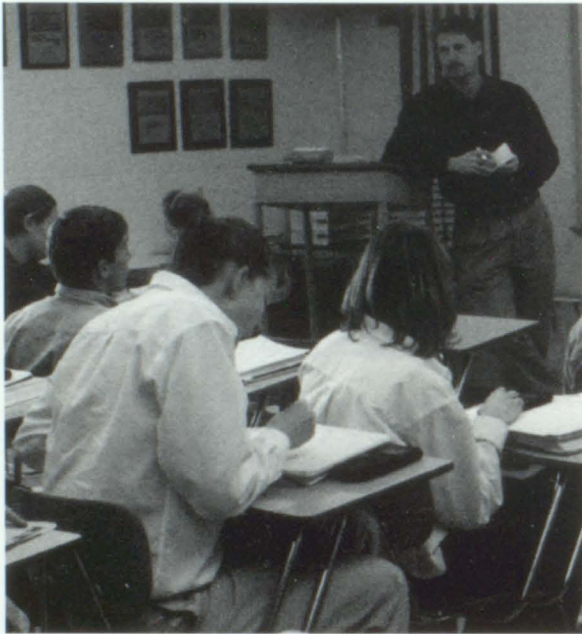

in Mr. McGill's class. You have the option your senior year to take English 12 with Mrs. Zanardi or AP English with Mrs. Schaad.

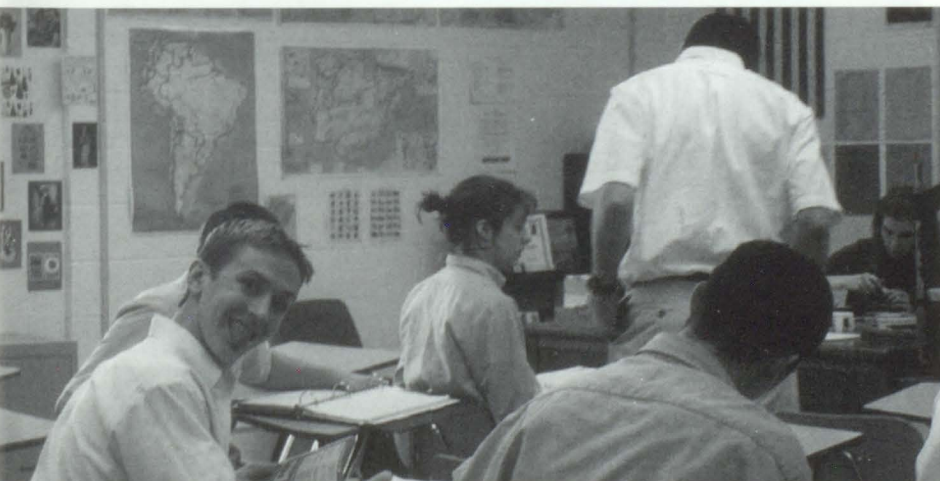

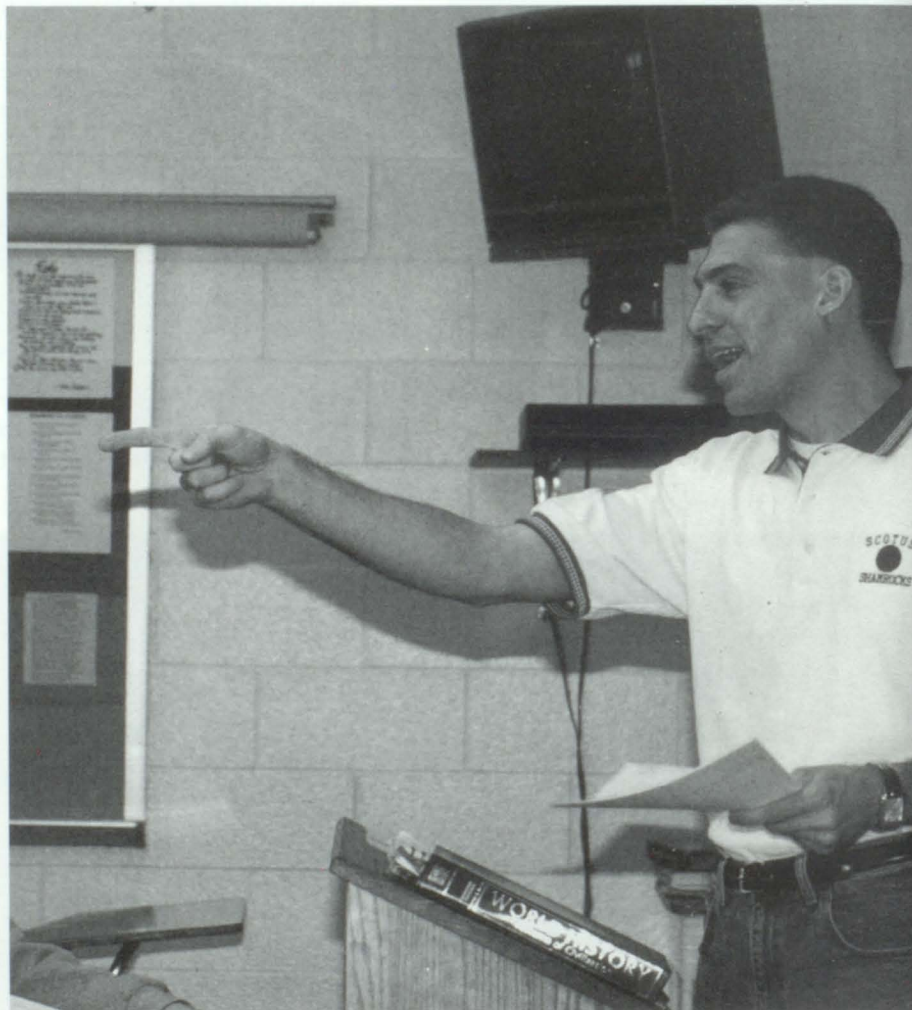

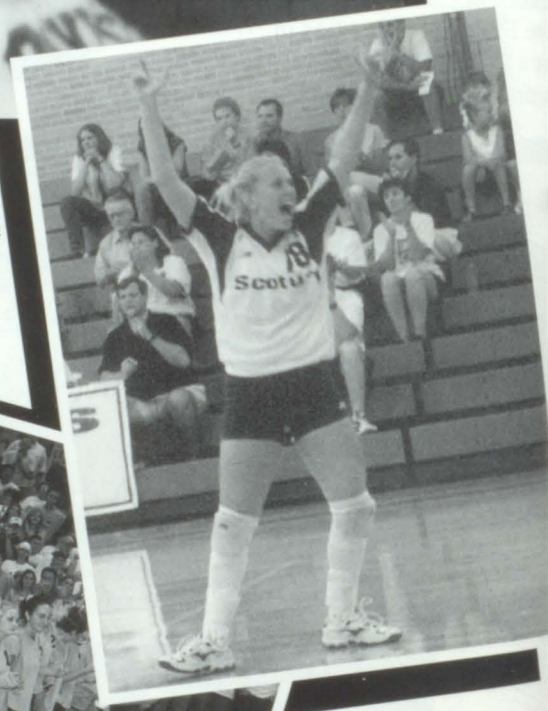
# 1999 Volleyball

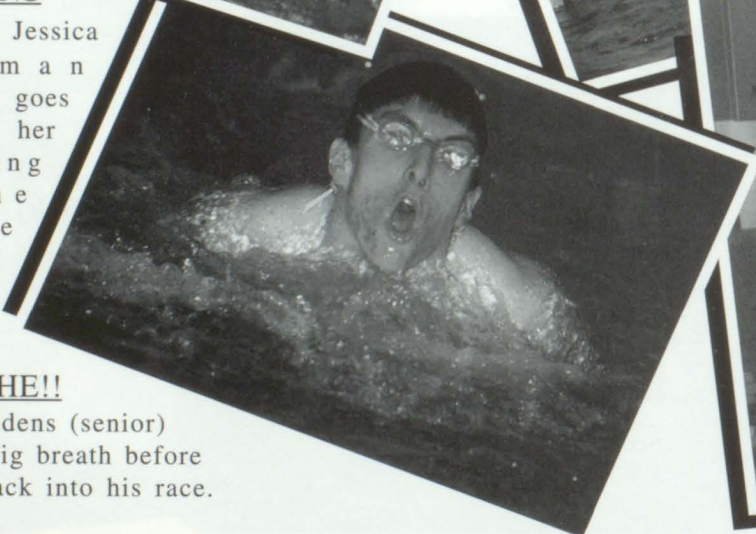

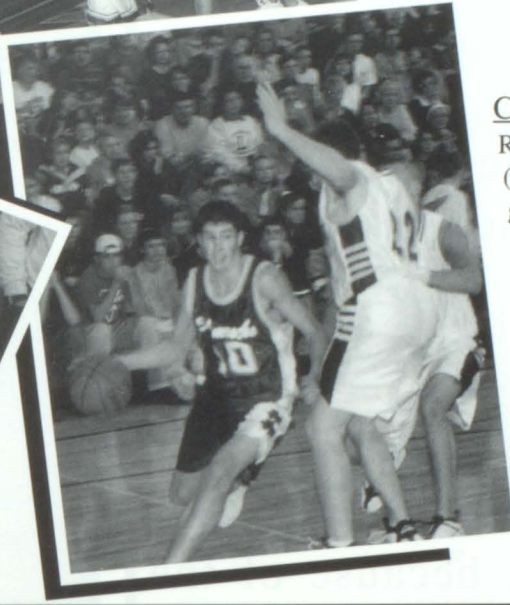

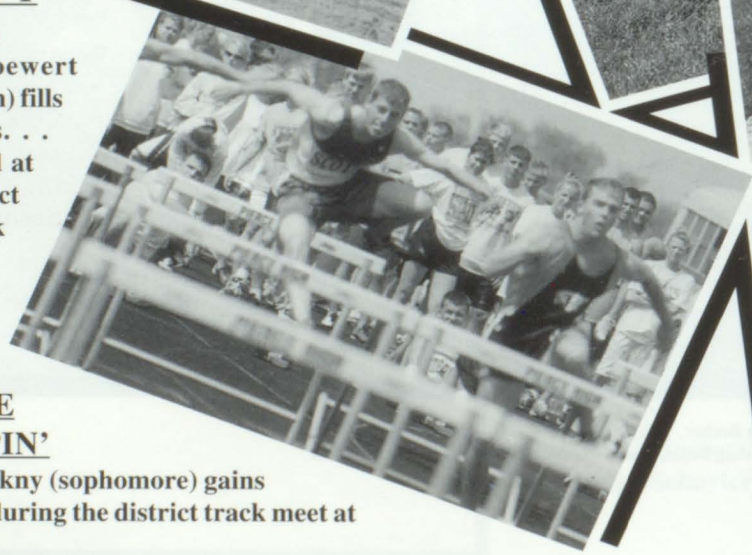

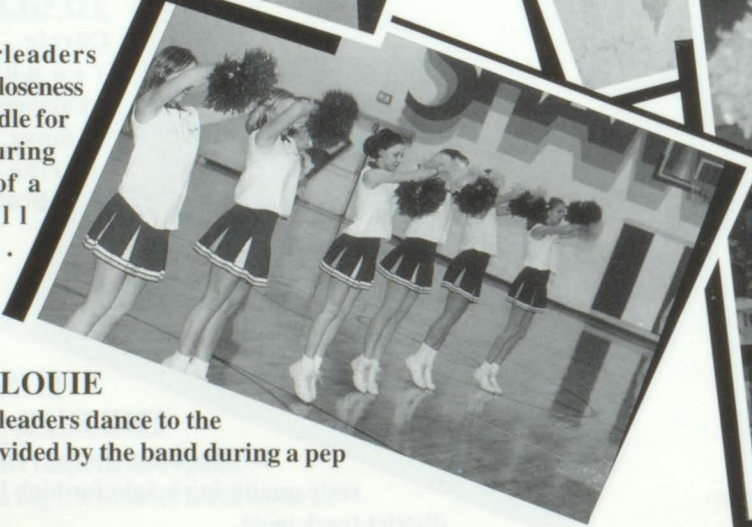

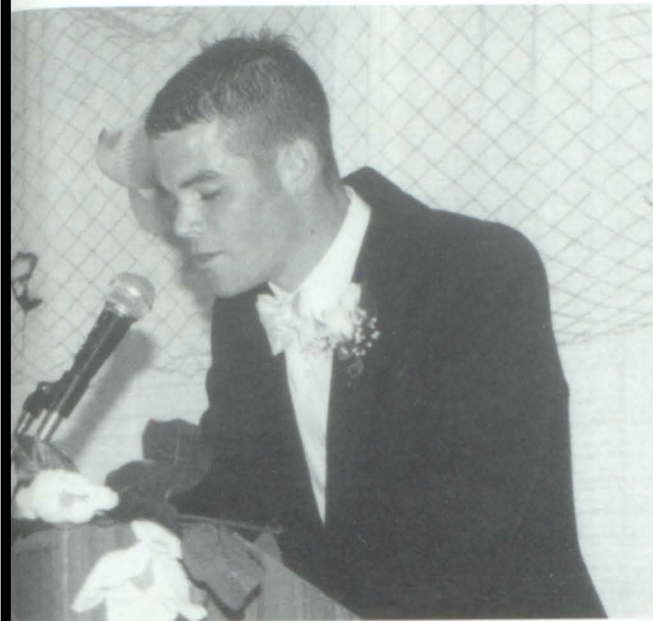

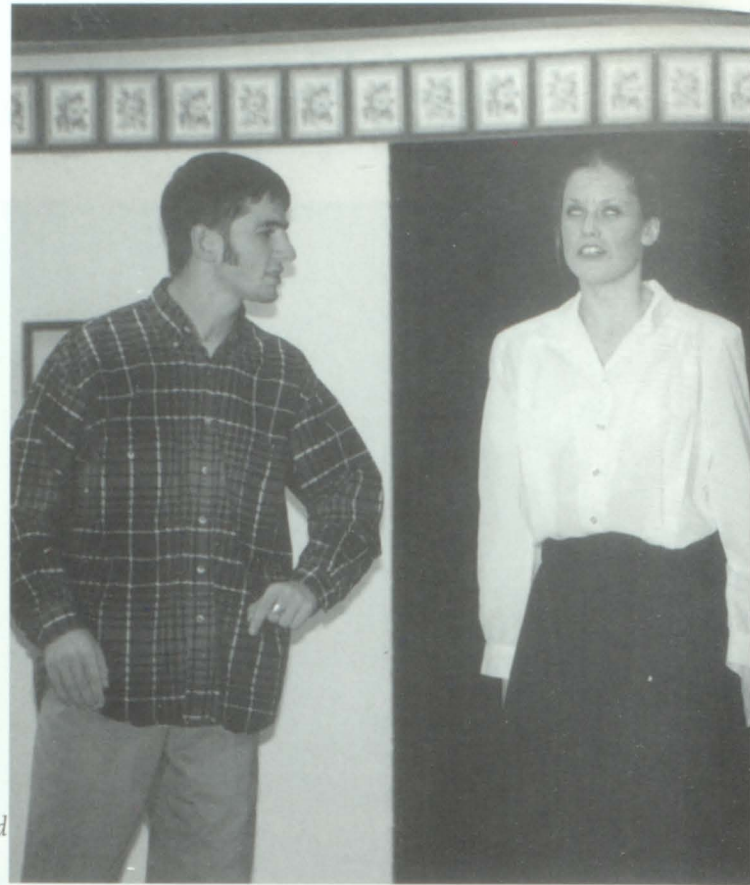

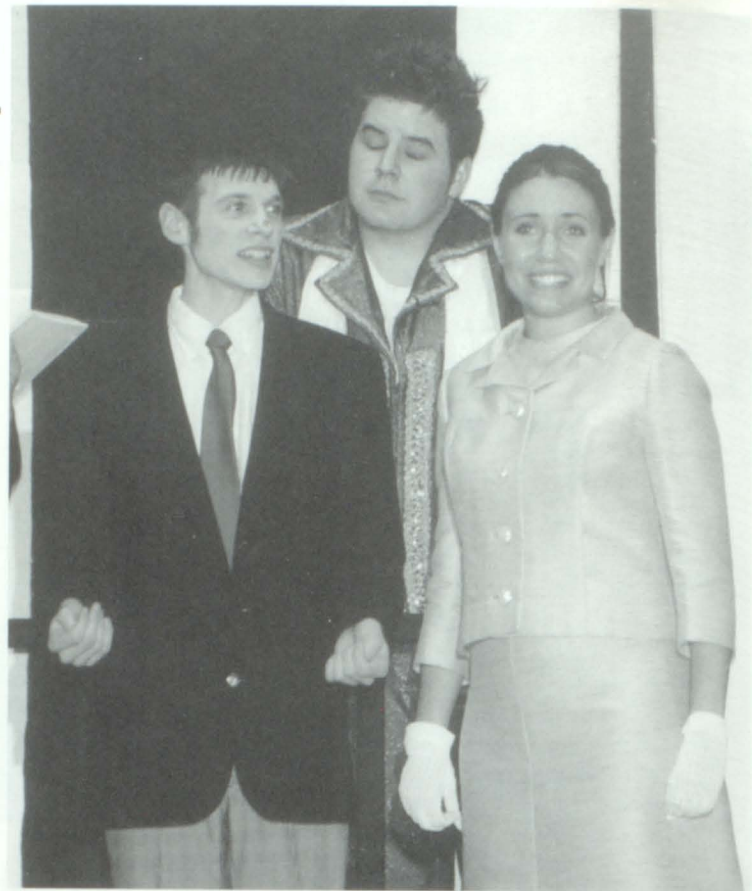

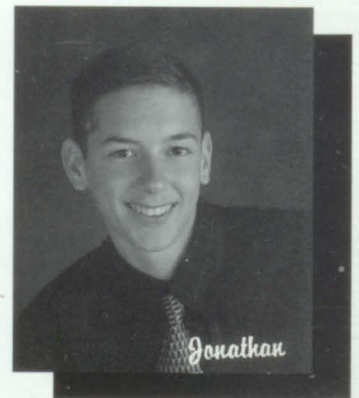
## Wesleyan Scholar's Institute
