Cloning became a more highly debated topic. Reasons people support cloning range from the production of new organs for people who are ill to infertility due to of cancer treatment.



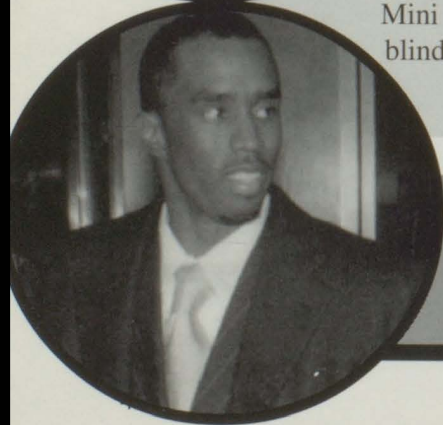
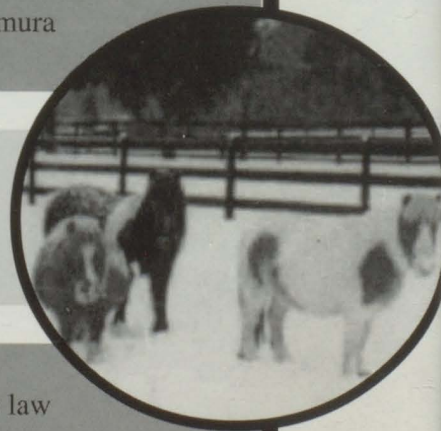

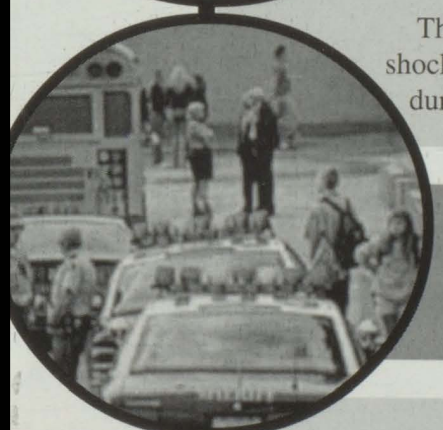
A U.S. submarine, U.S.S. Greenville, crashed into a Japanese fishing boat. The collision resulted in nine Japanese deaths.

The controversial debate whether to allow free access to Napster and free music affected millions of people in the country.



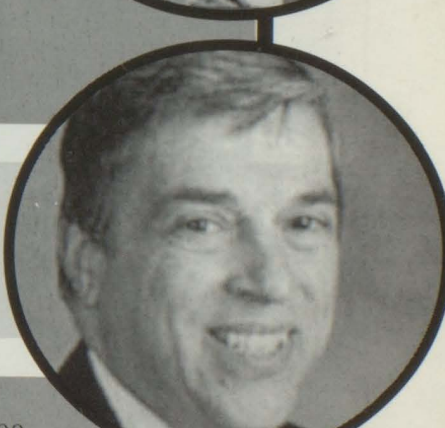

The day ended with a gathering around a bonfire.

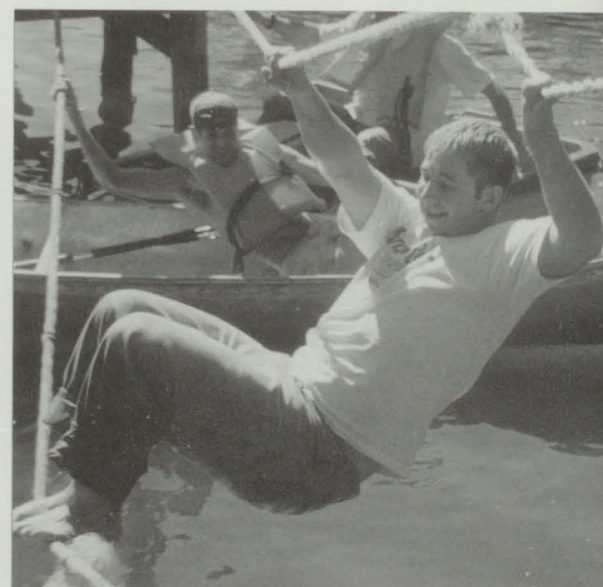

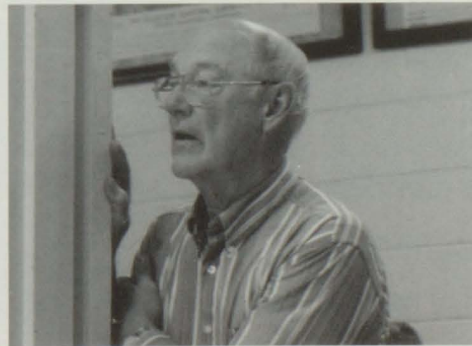
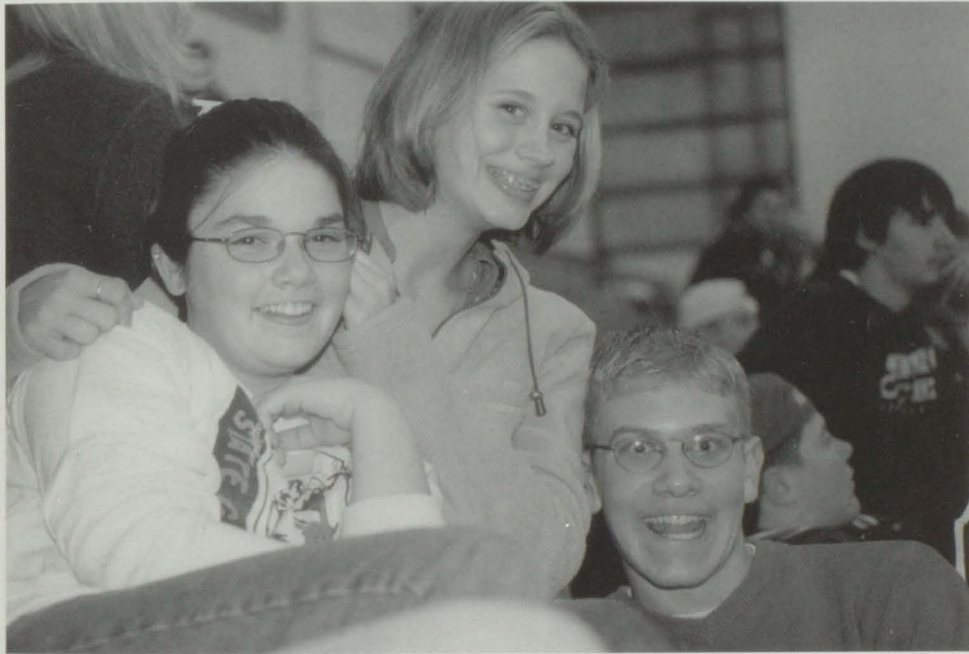
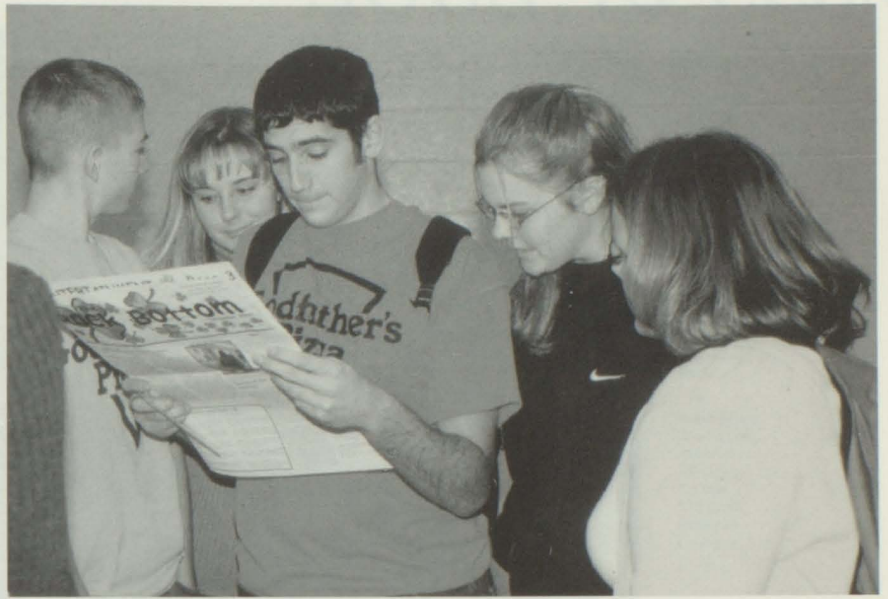
Hitchin' A Ride

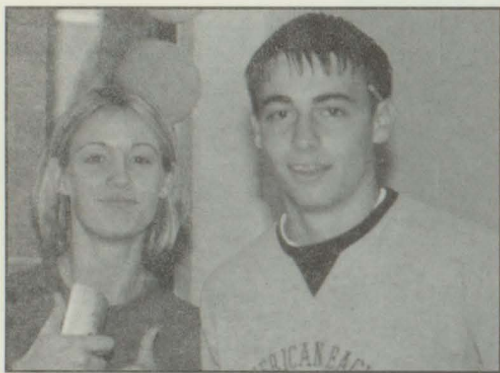

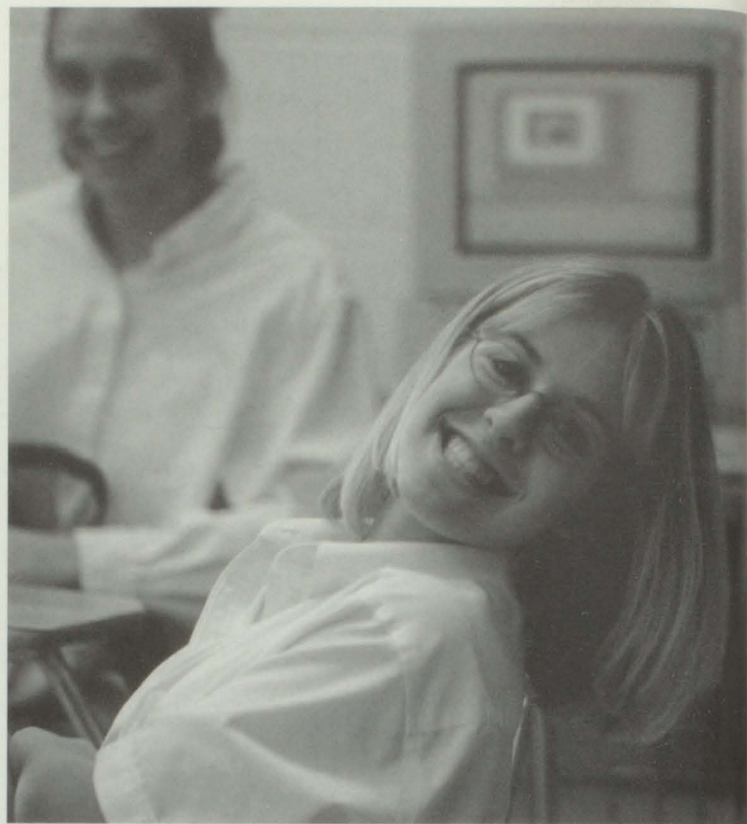
Mathematics

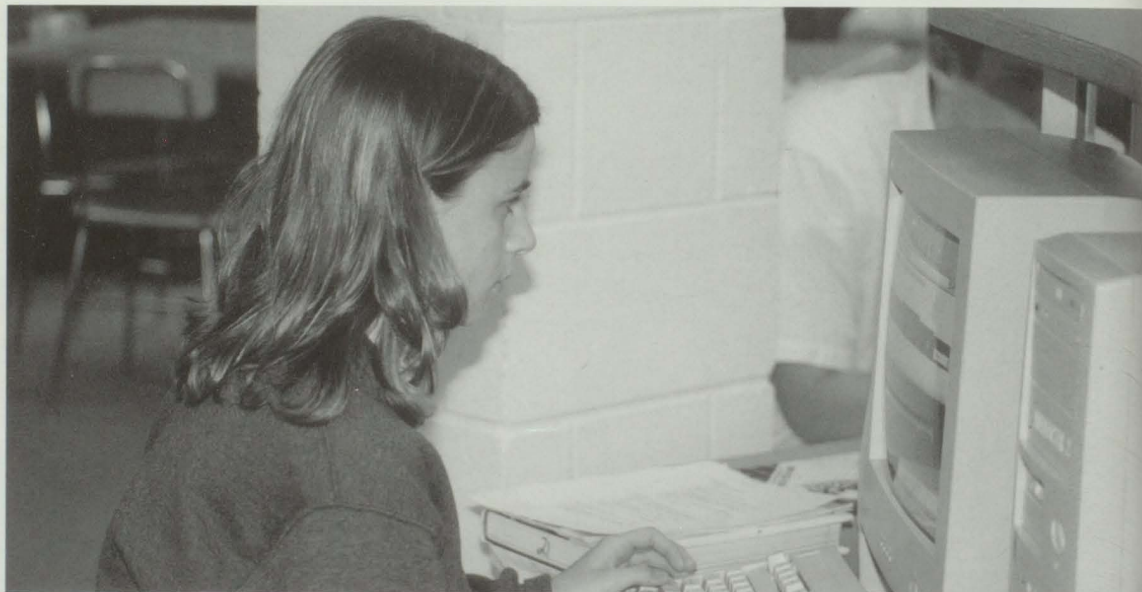

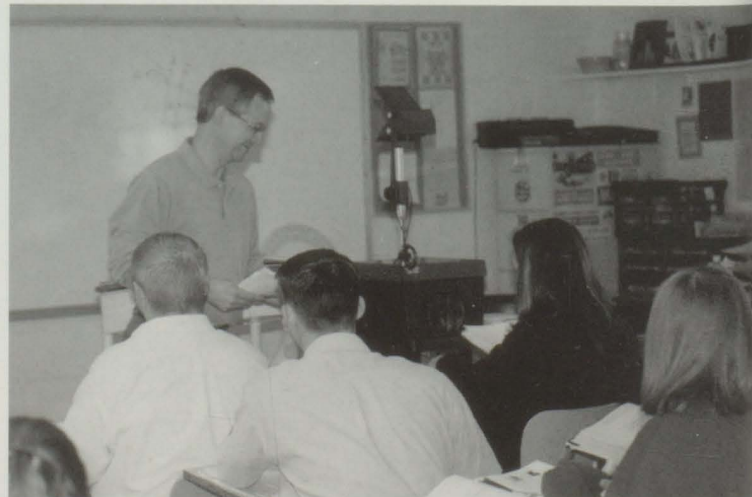

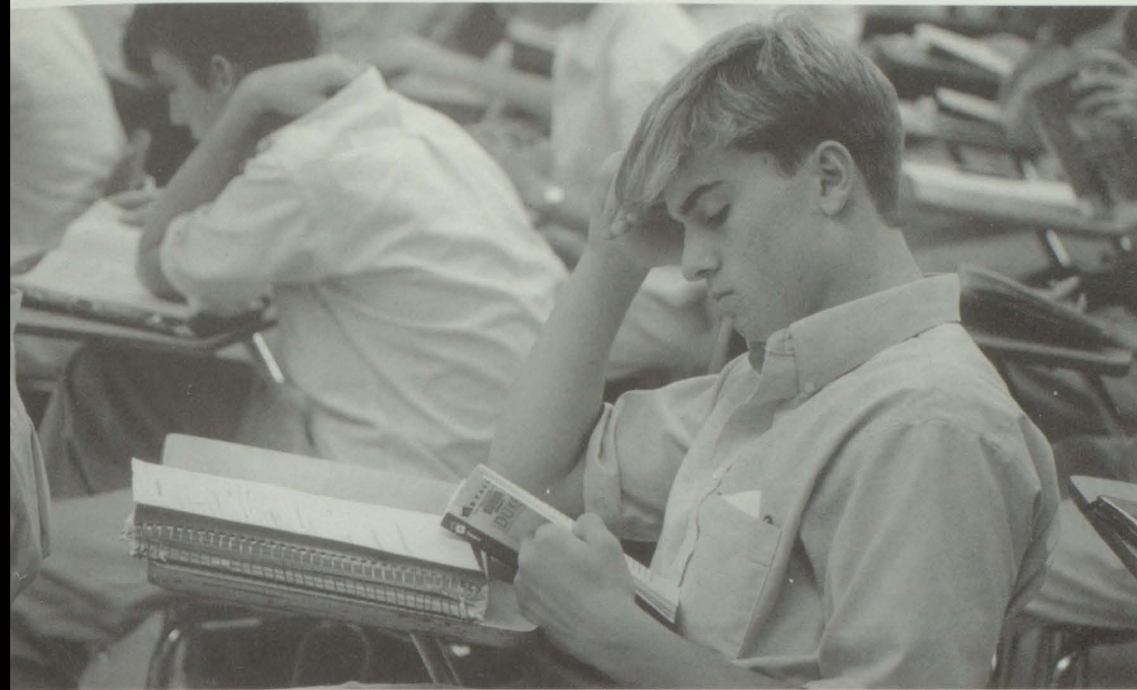


Above-right: Junior Angela Fisher checks over her computer work before she prints.

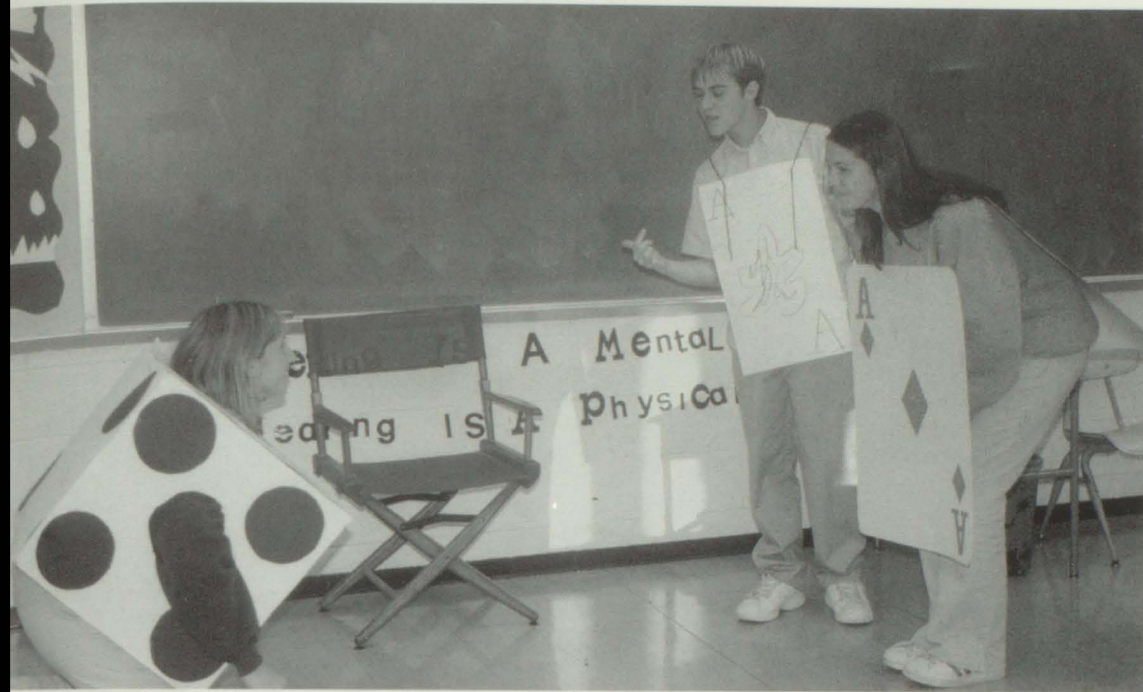

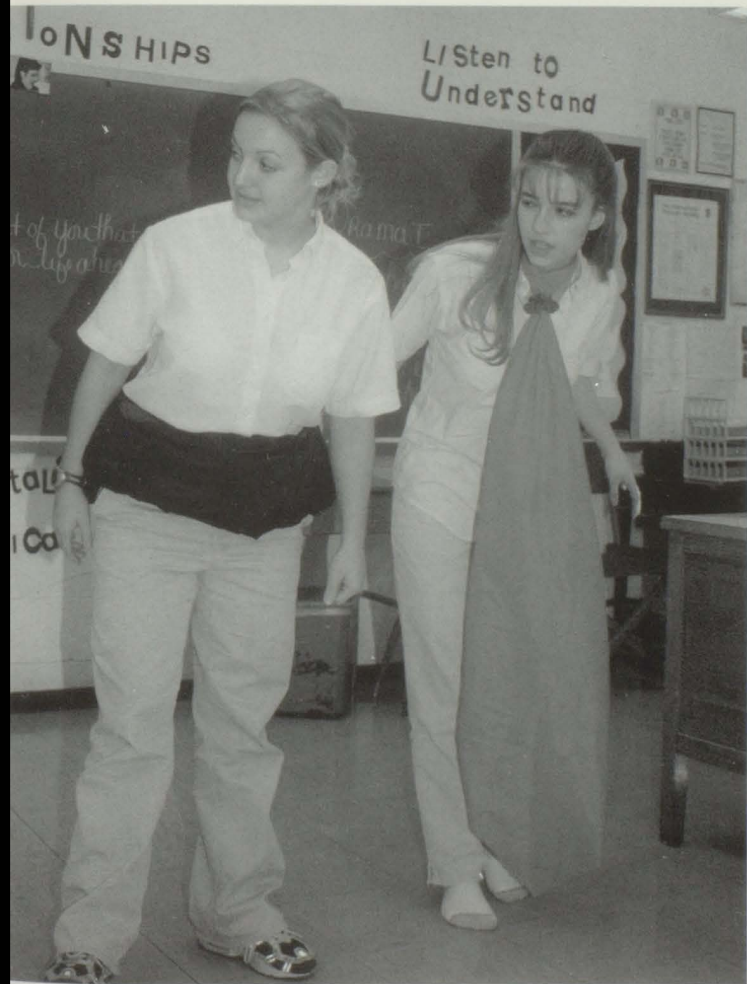


Fine Arts

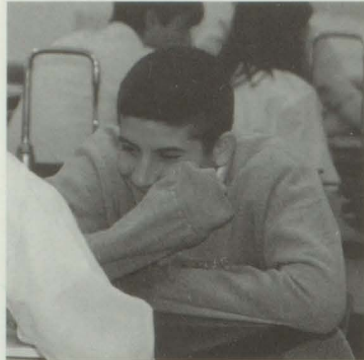

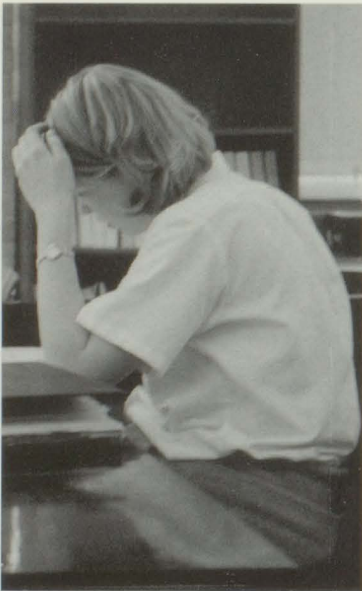

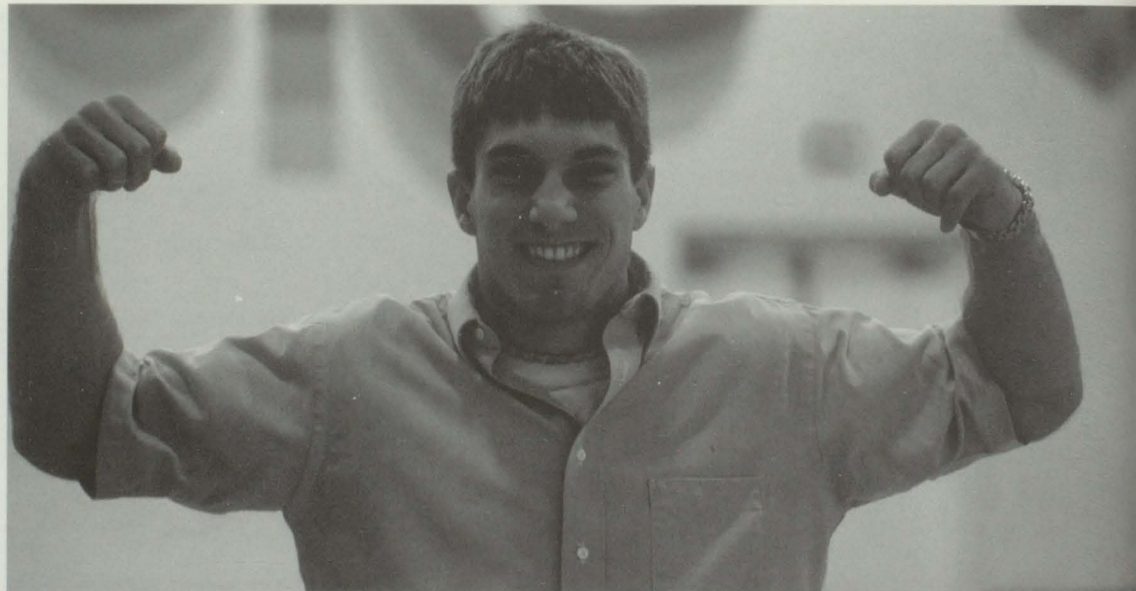

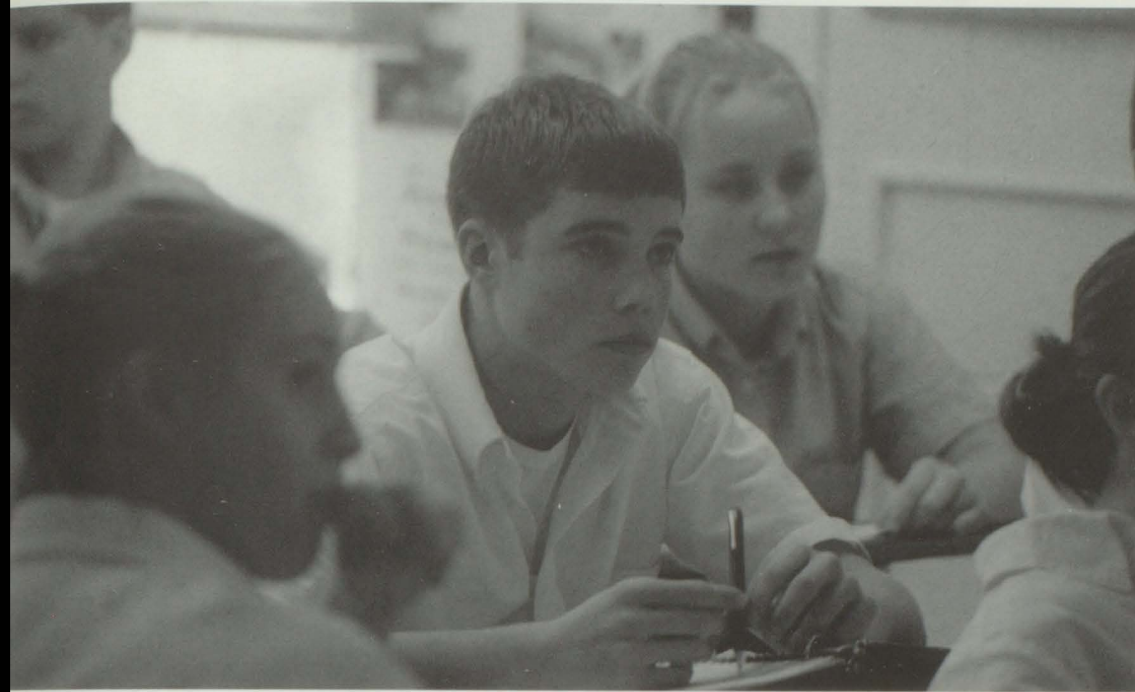

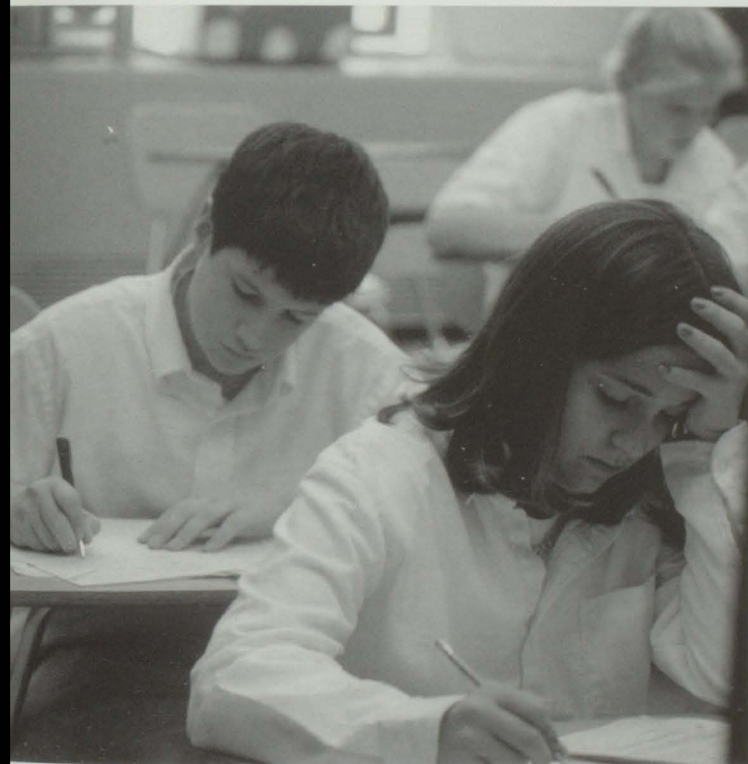

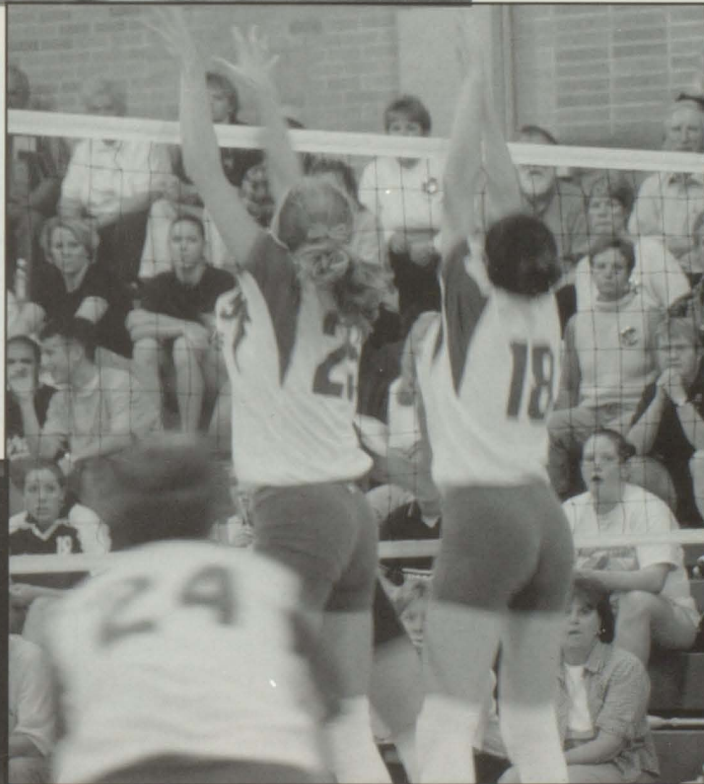

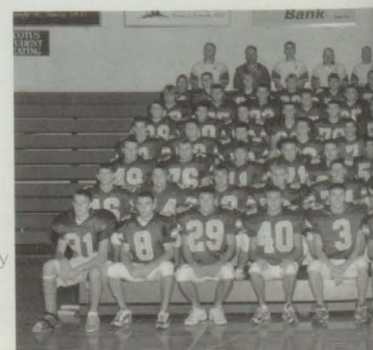

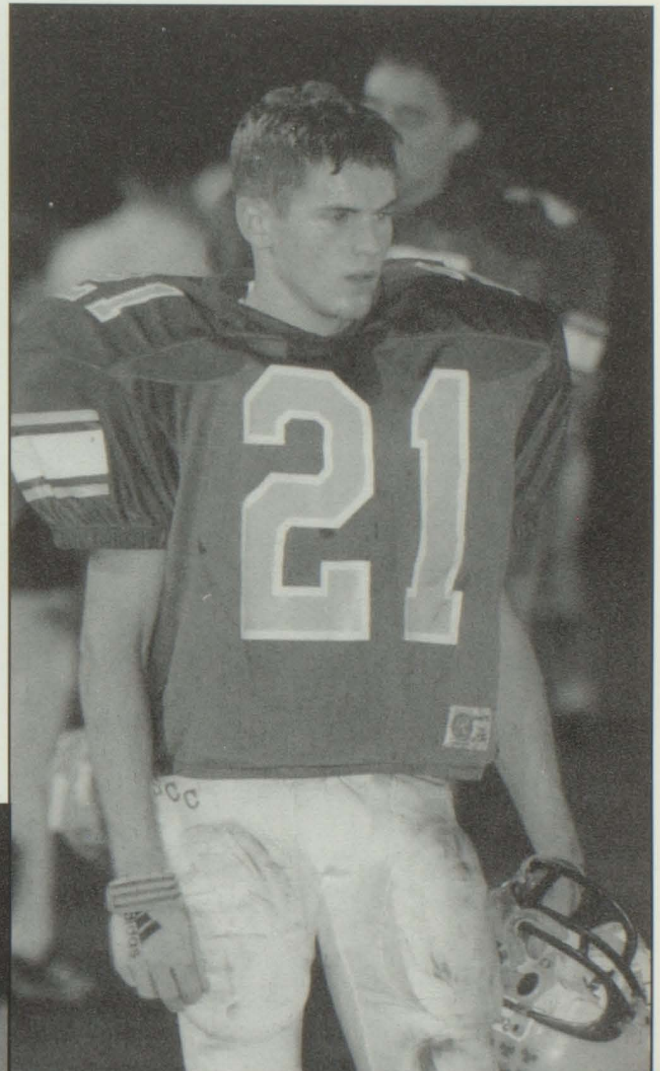

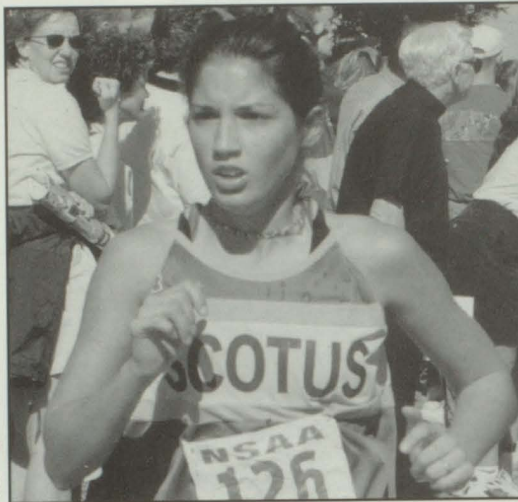
SCC girls go undefeated and take home the State Championship

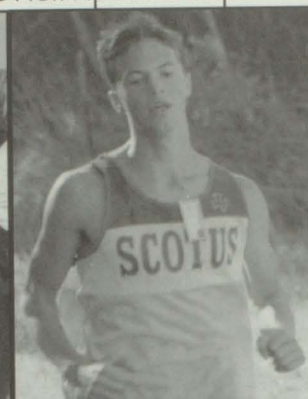

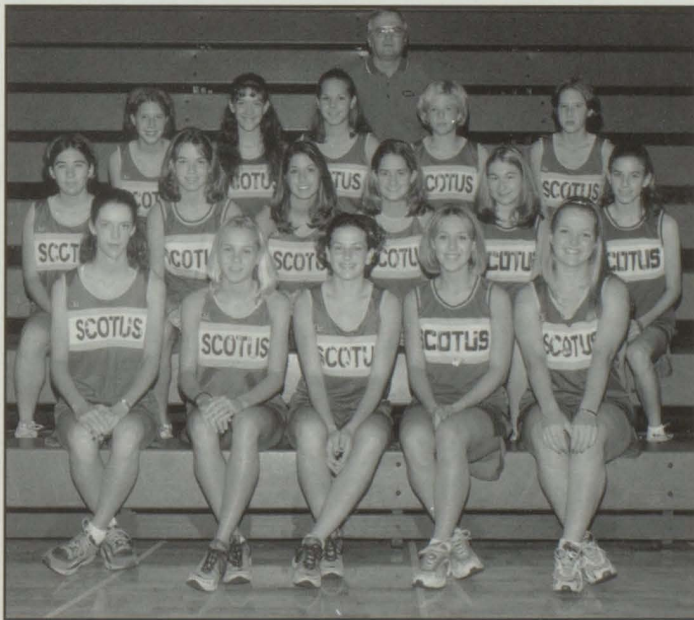
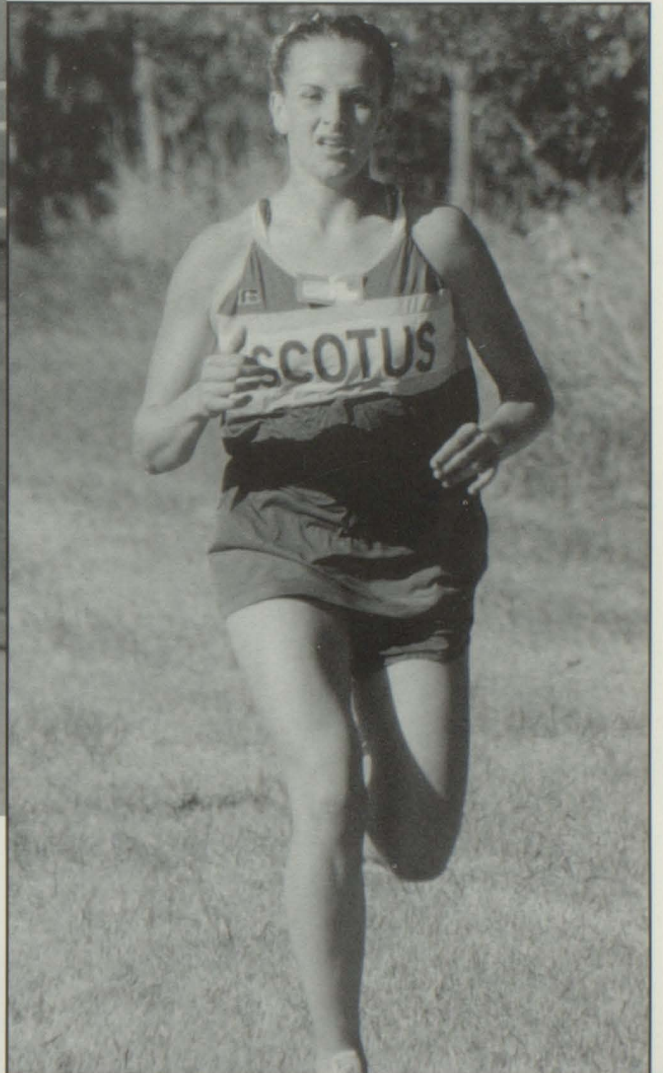

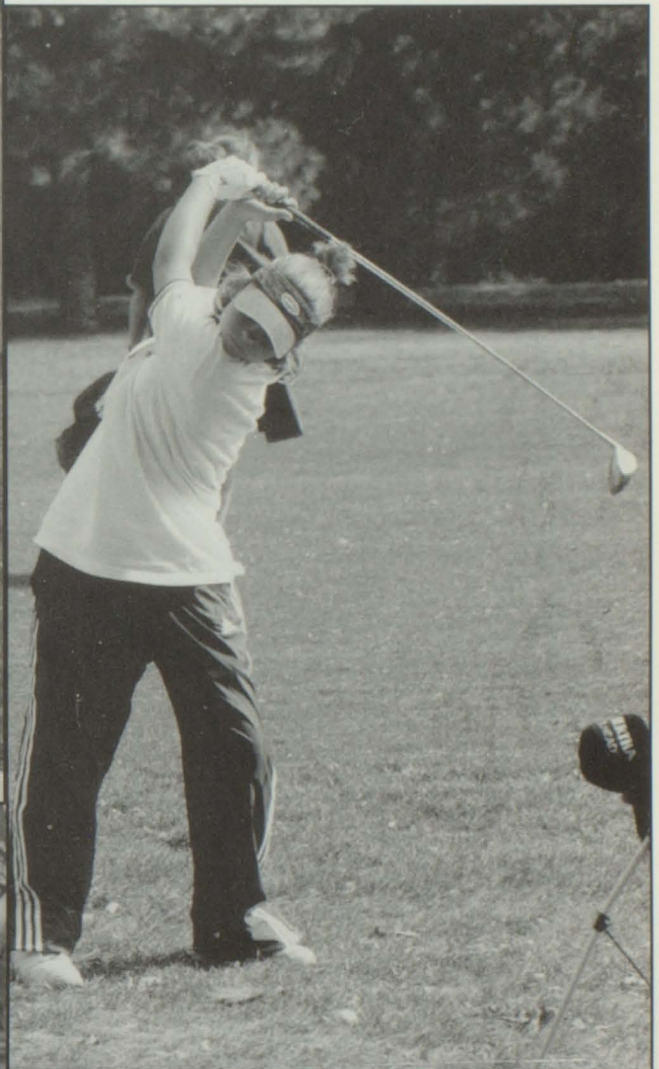

Senior Tom Gerhold returned to the swimming pool after a time of absence. Gerhold lapped up some very impressive times and places for the swim team.

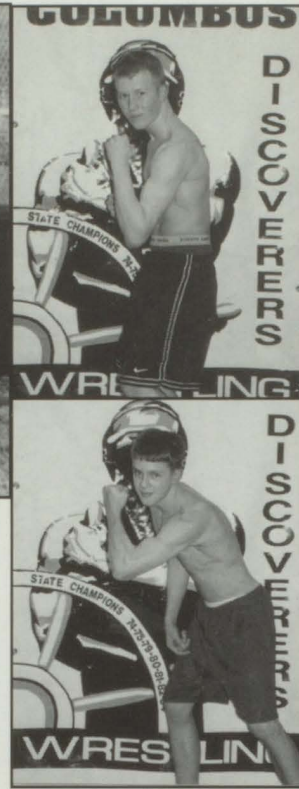

SCC boys show determination and success

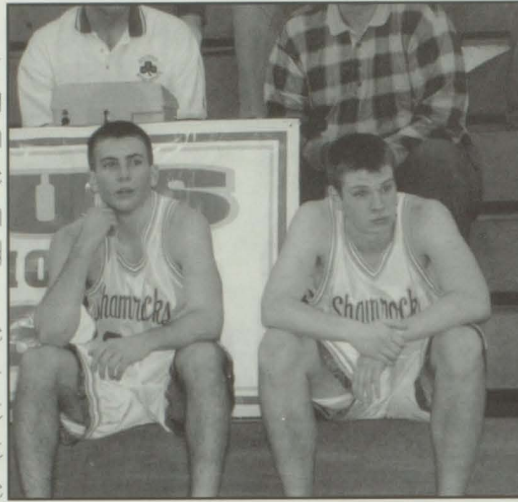

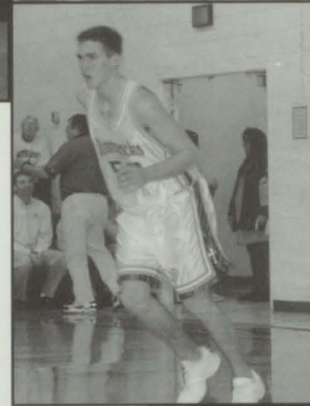

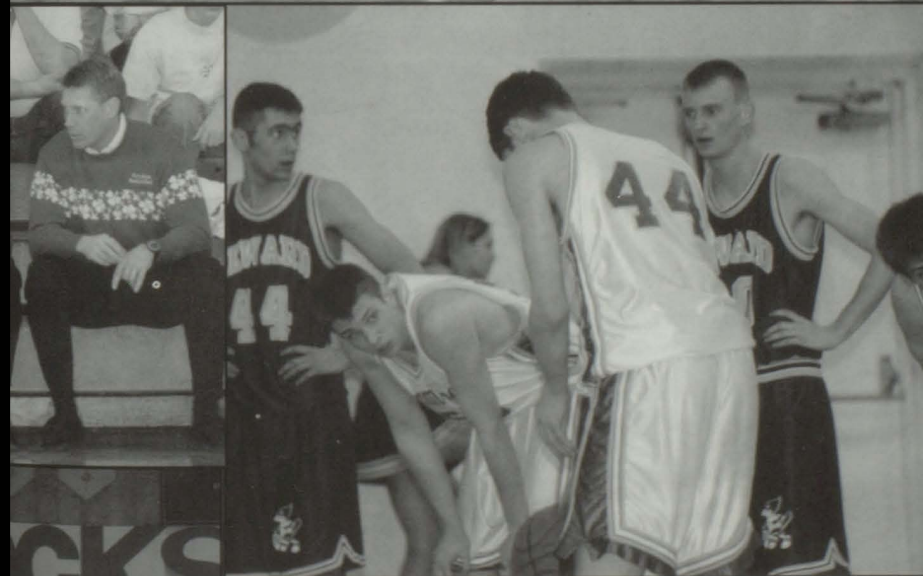

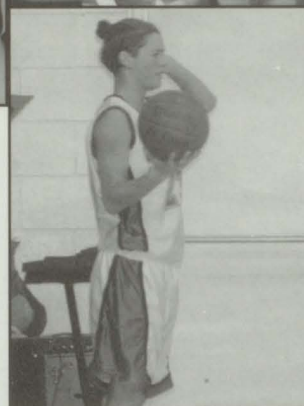

The girls soccer program seems to always get their job done on the field.

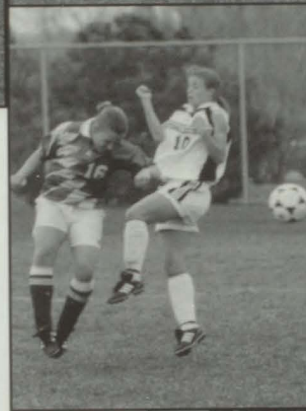

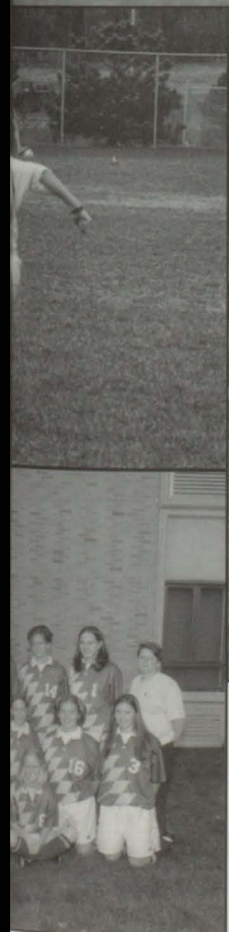

Being the last season for head coach Chris McGill, it seemed only fitting to bring home the state championship and the boys did just that. It was an awesome way for Mr. McGill to go out.

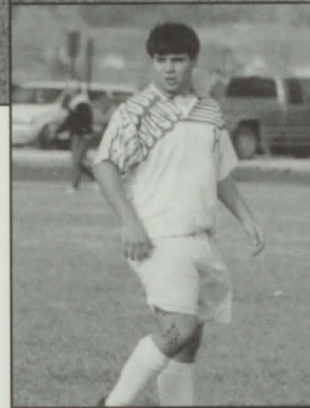

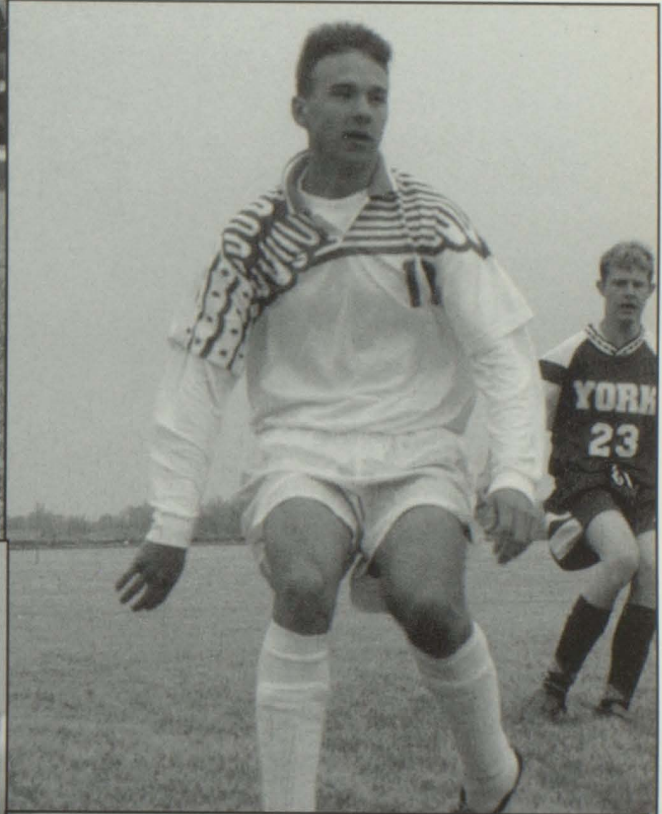

The Flag Corps team self-choreographed every routine and performed during halftimes of both football and basketball games.

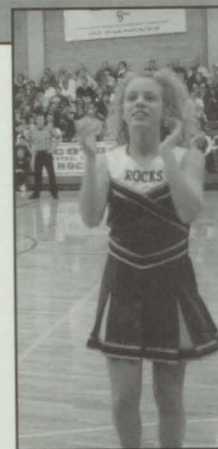

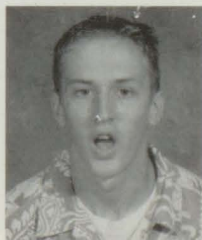

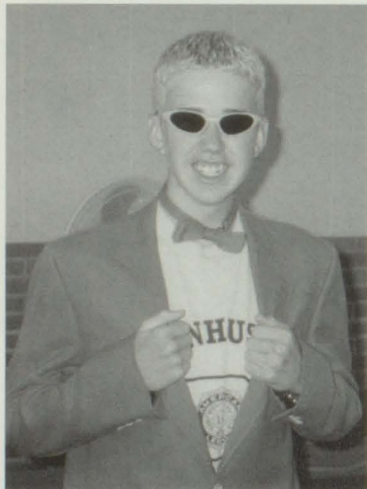

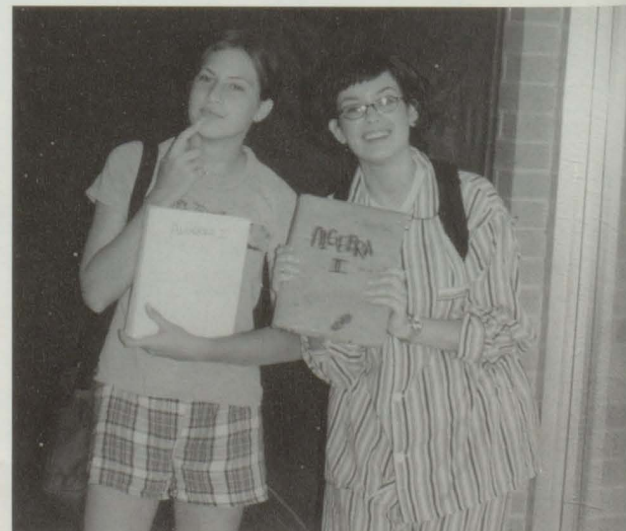

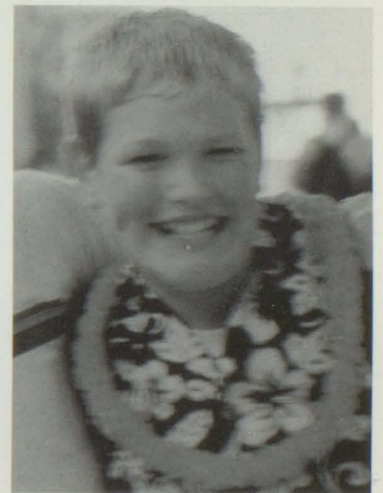

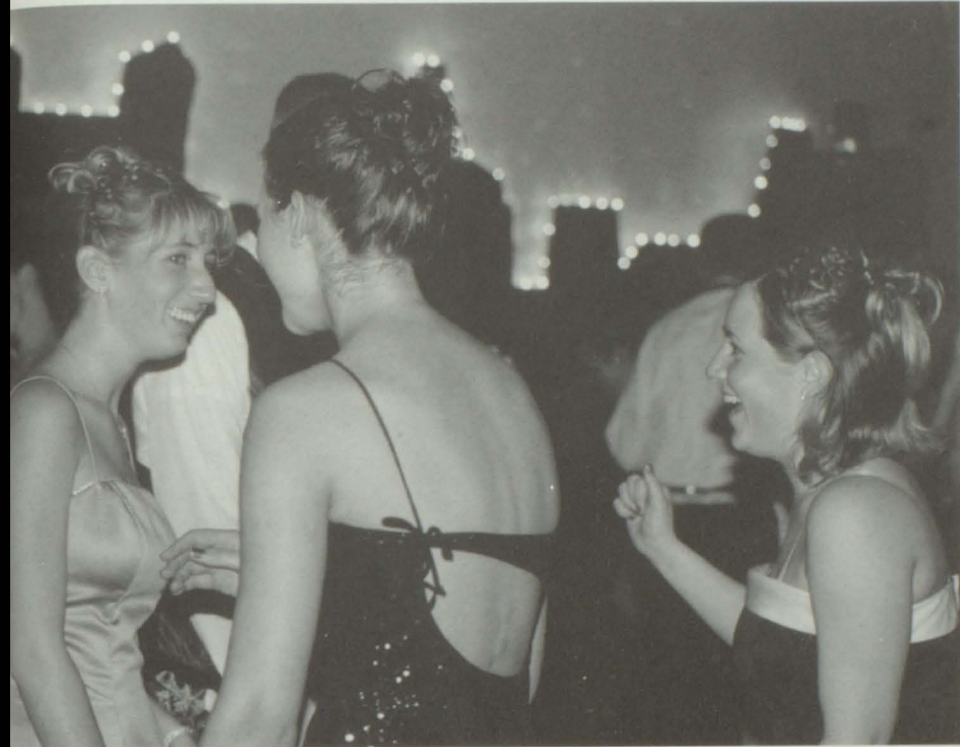

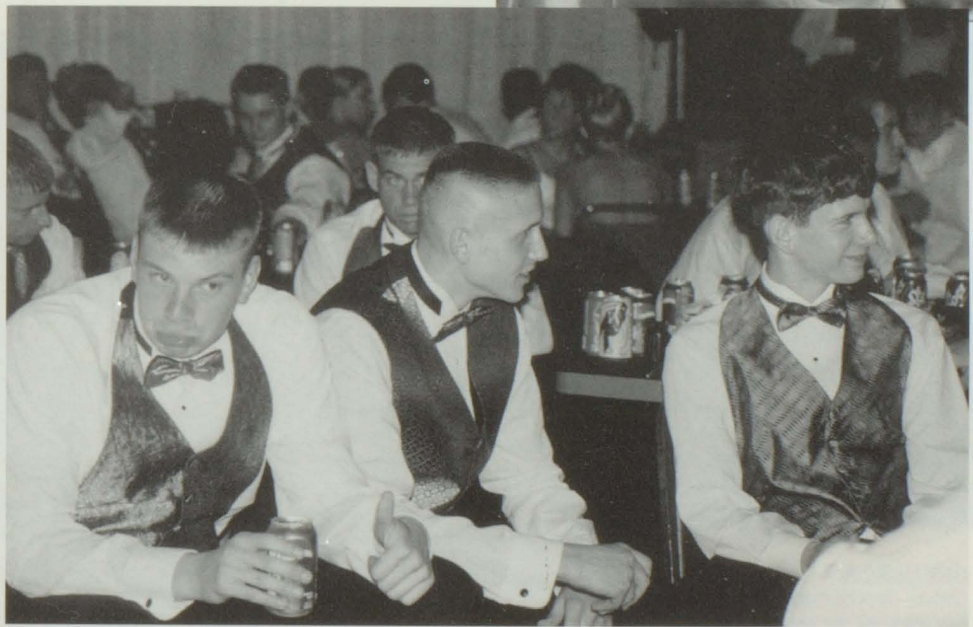

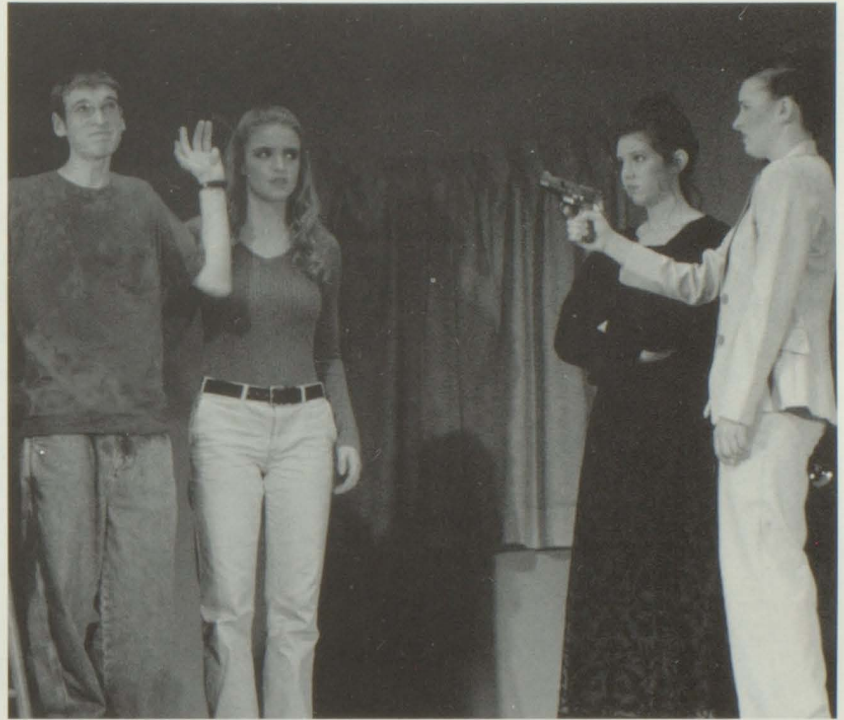

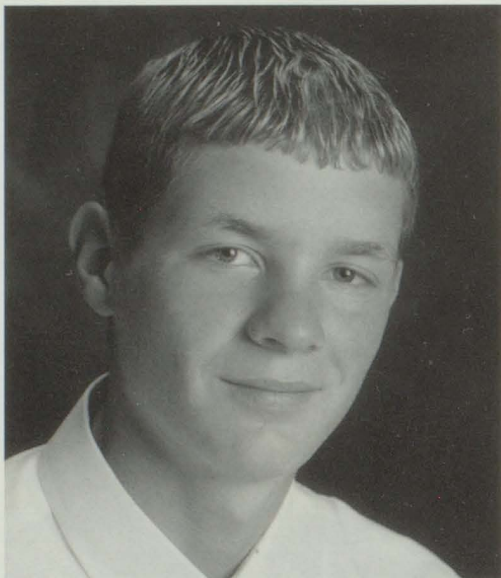
