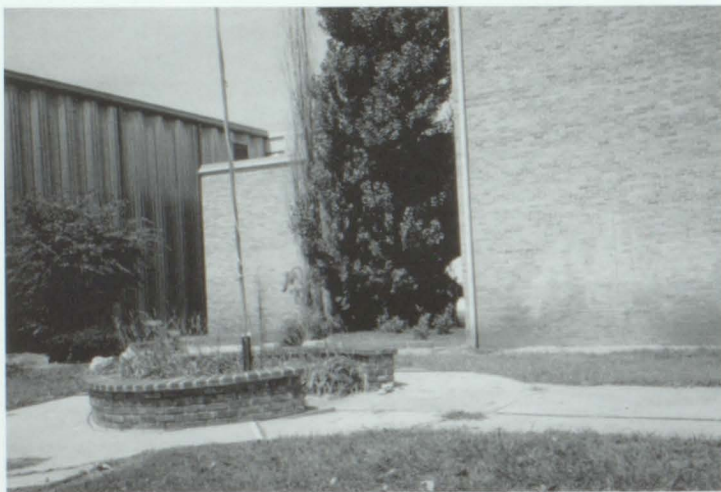




Scotus Reconstruction

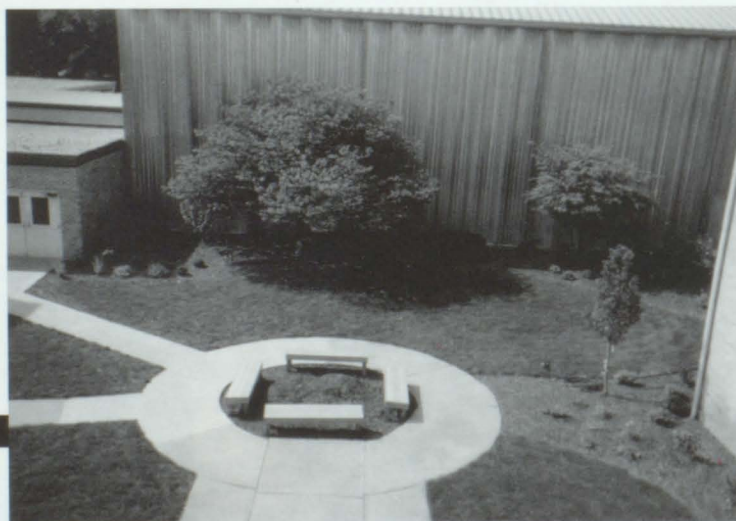

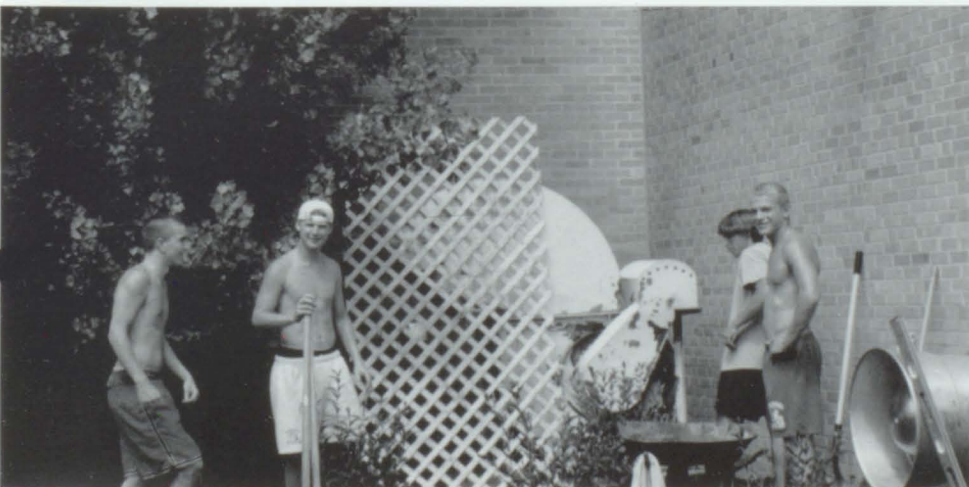

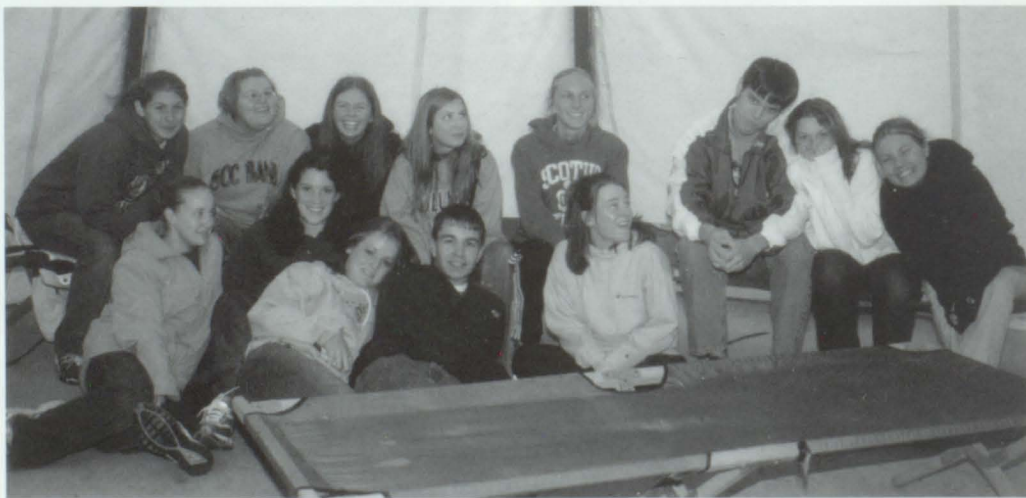

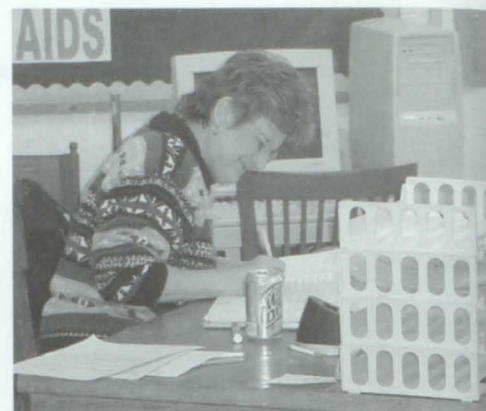


Faculty

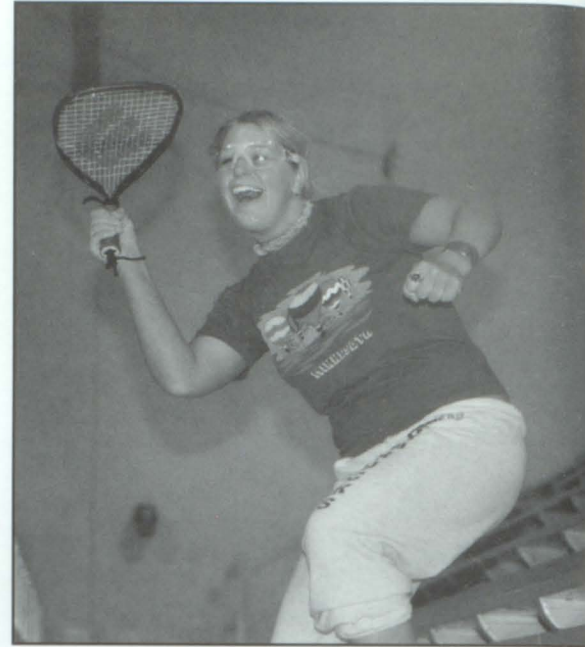

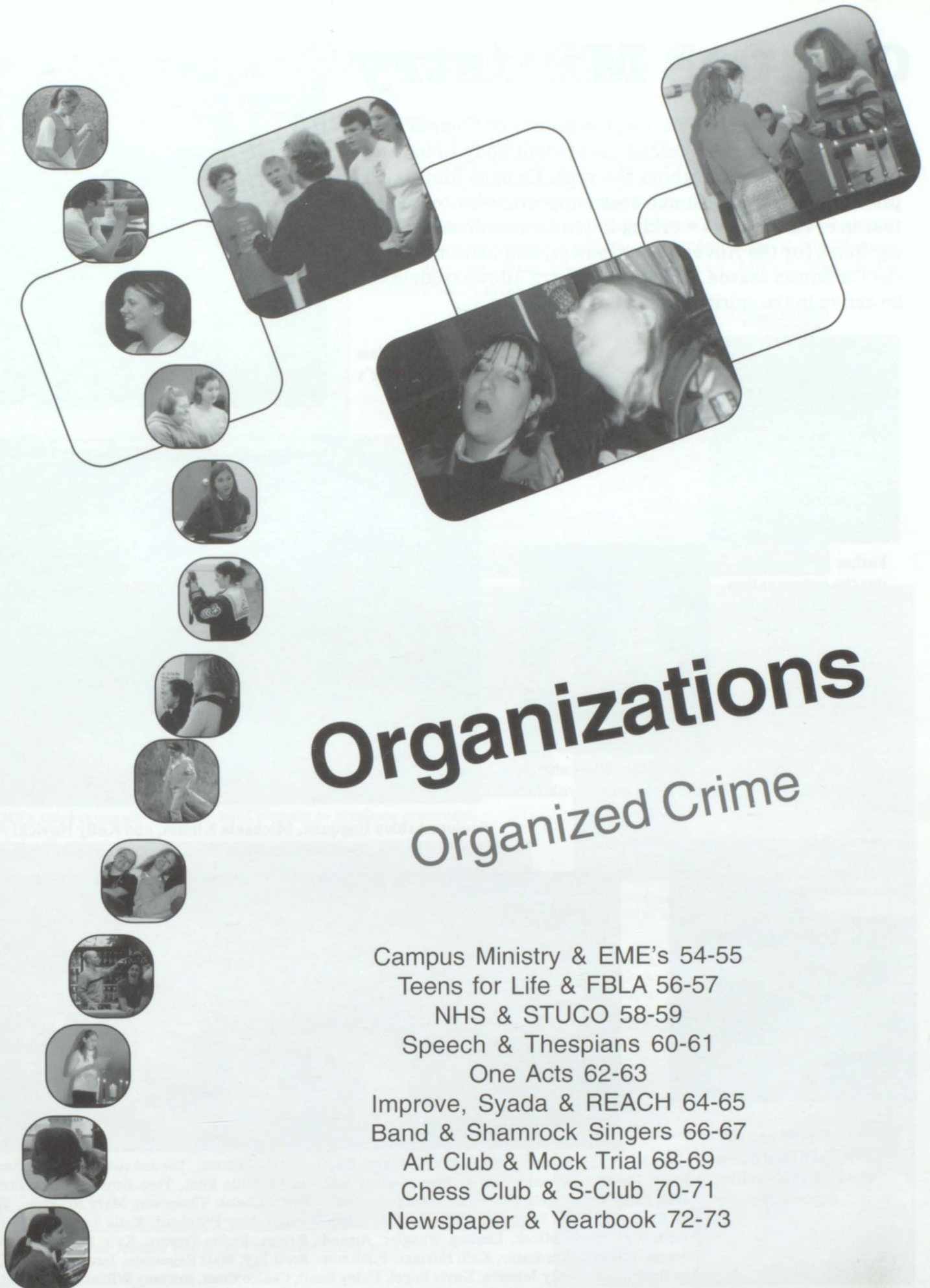

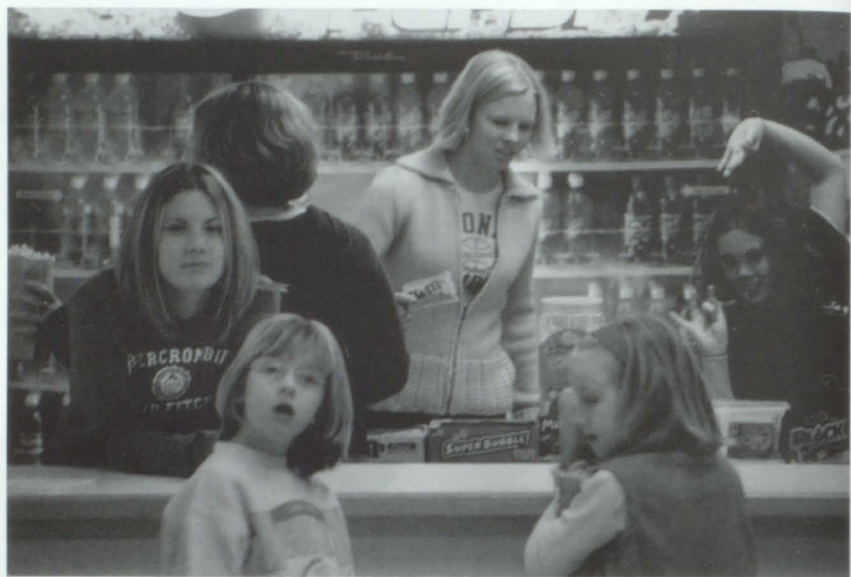

Teens 4 Life

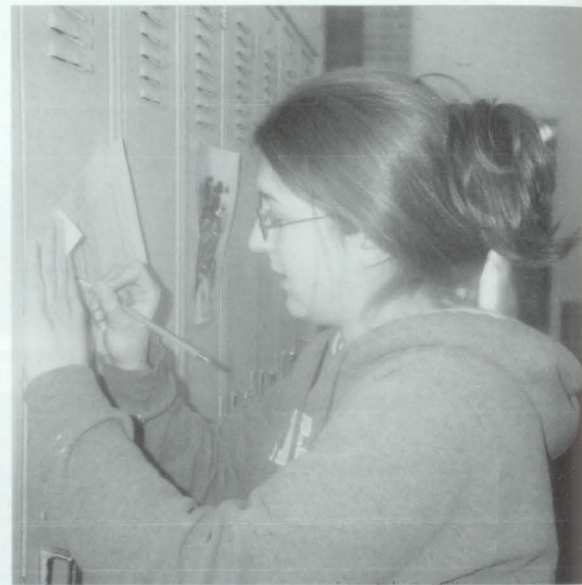

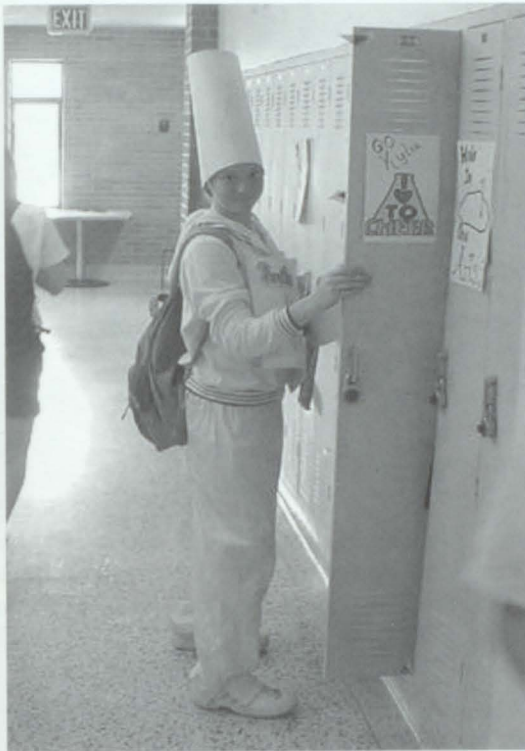


Thespians

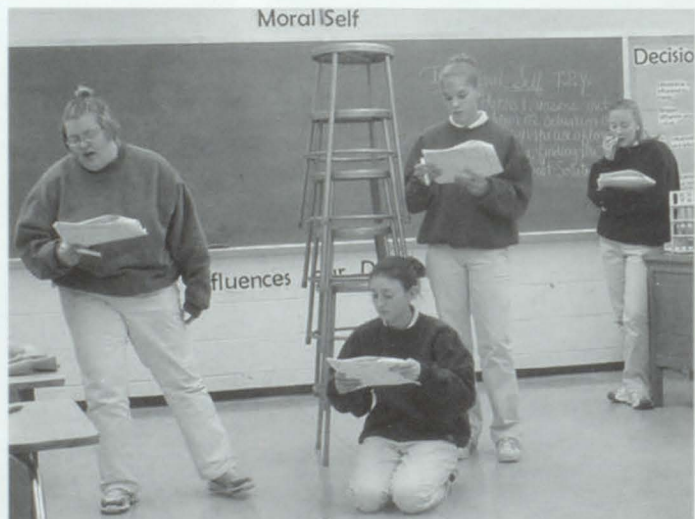

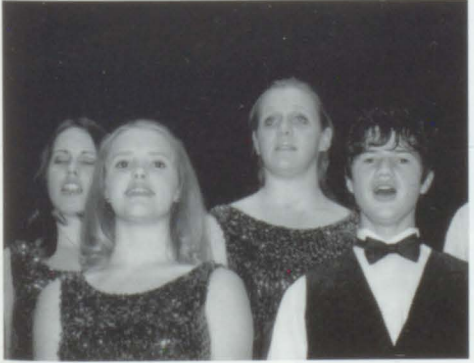

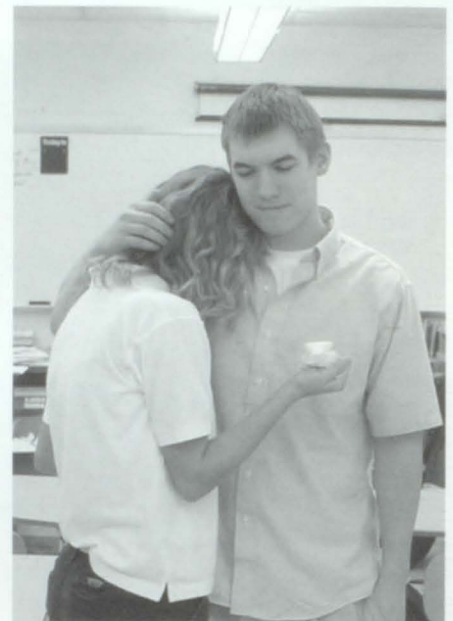

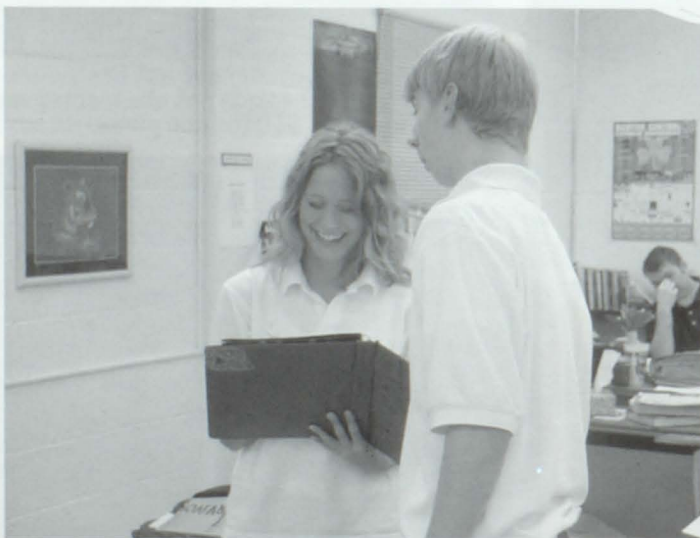

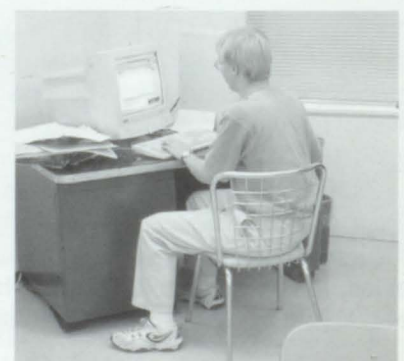

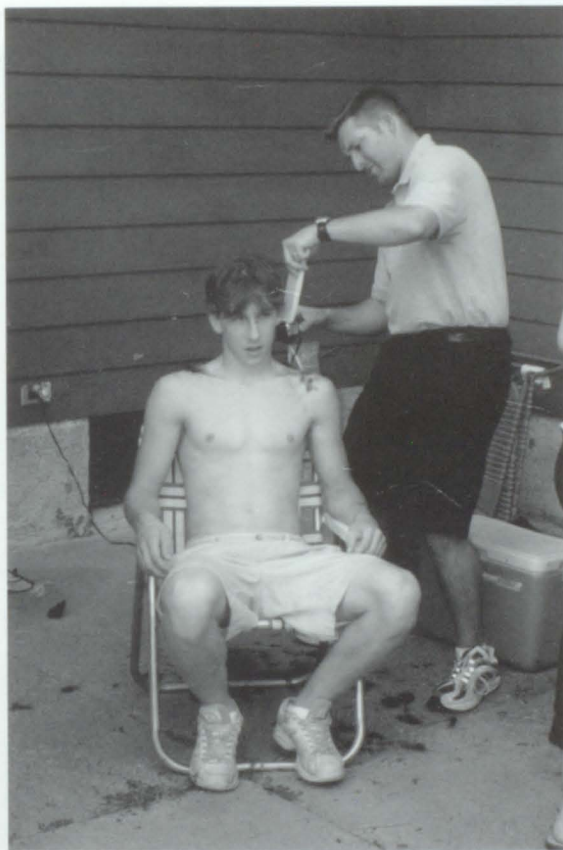
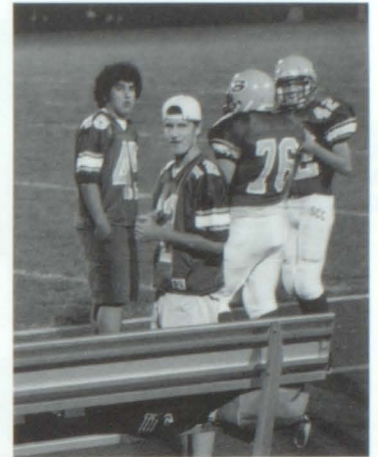

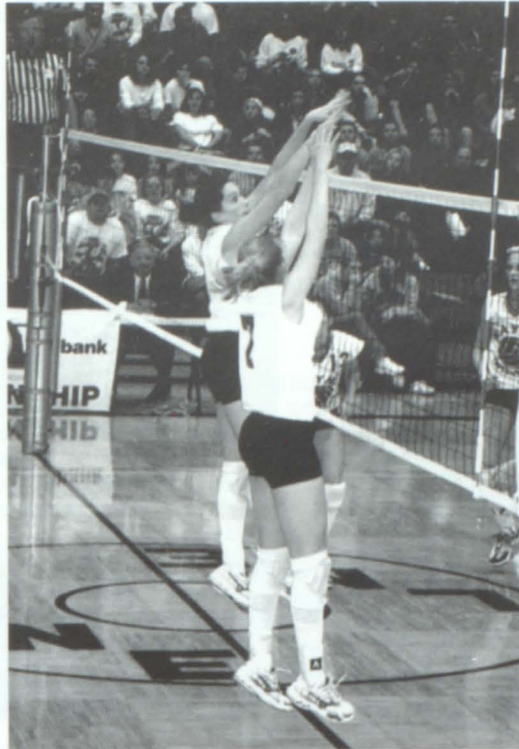

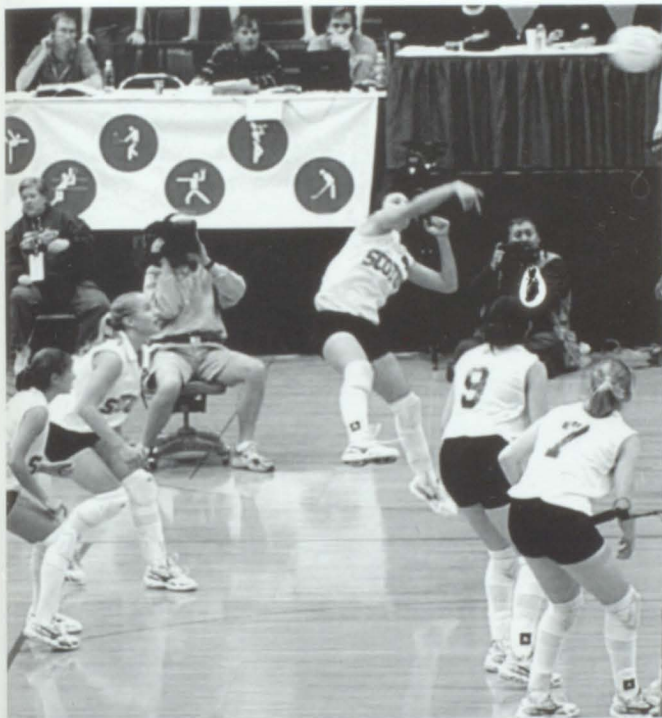

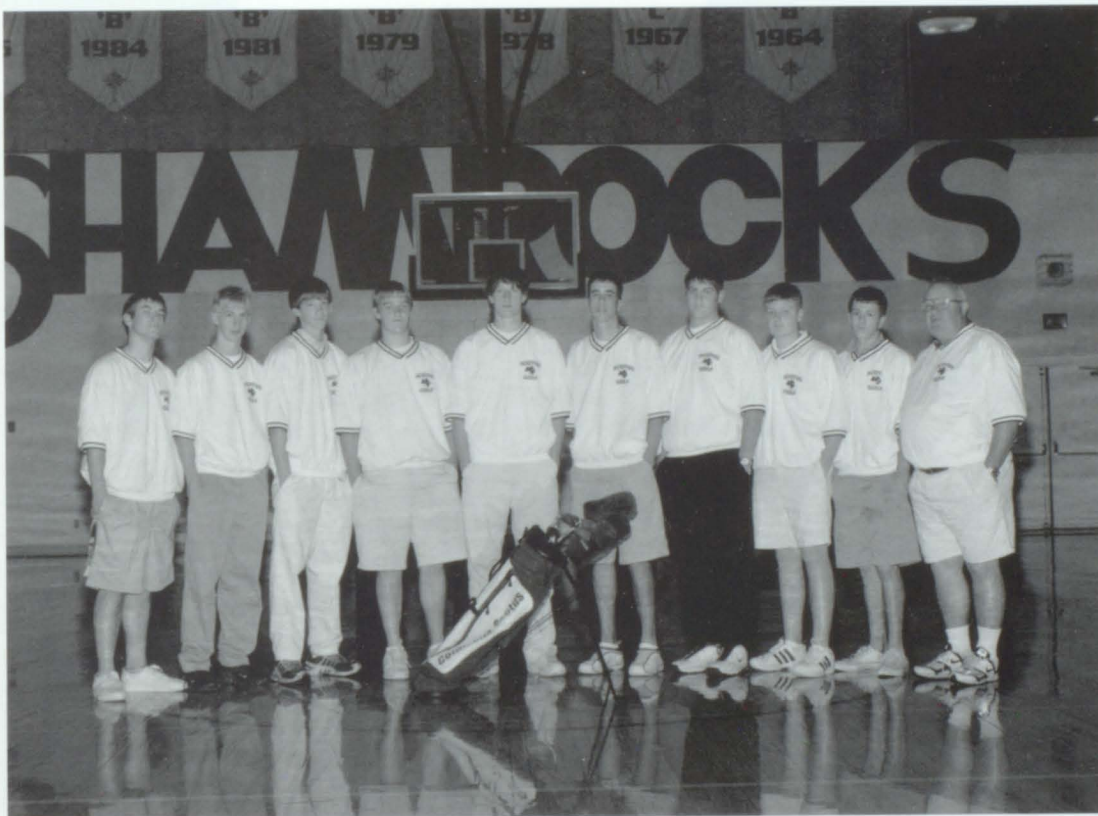

Baseball

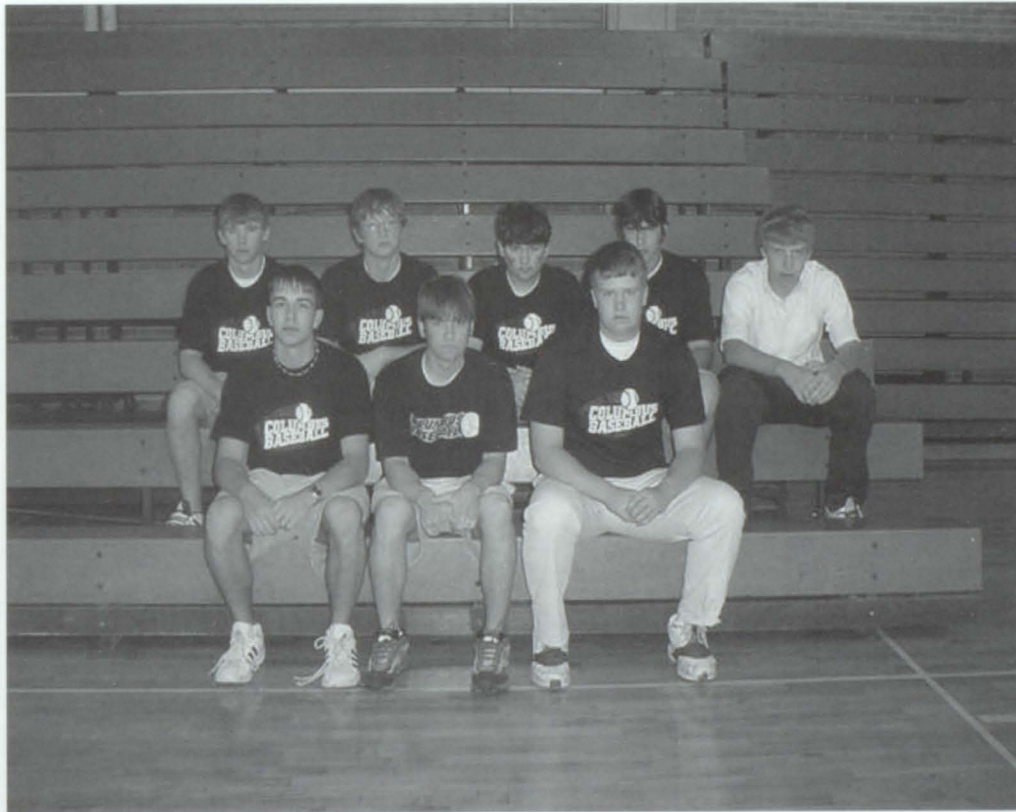

Girls Tennis

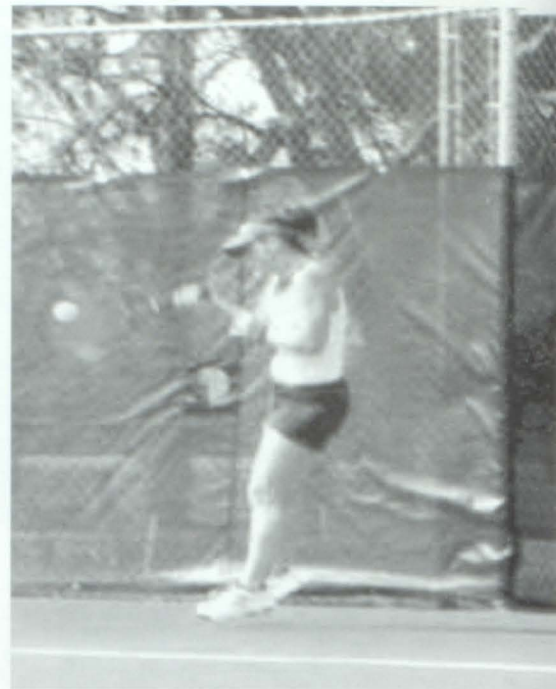

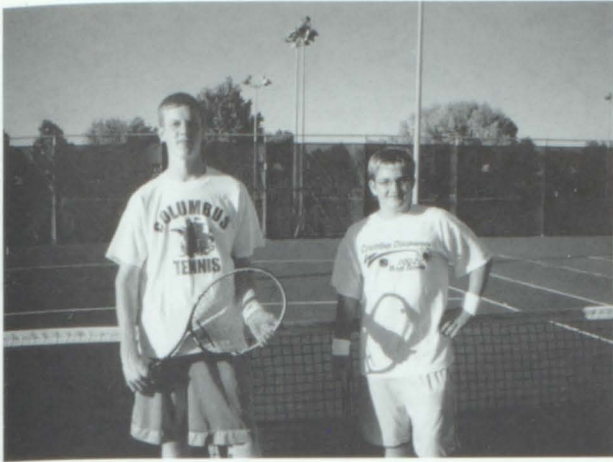

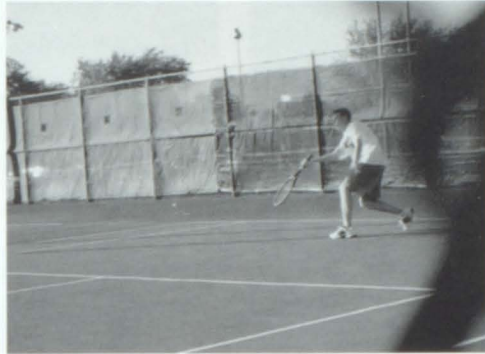

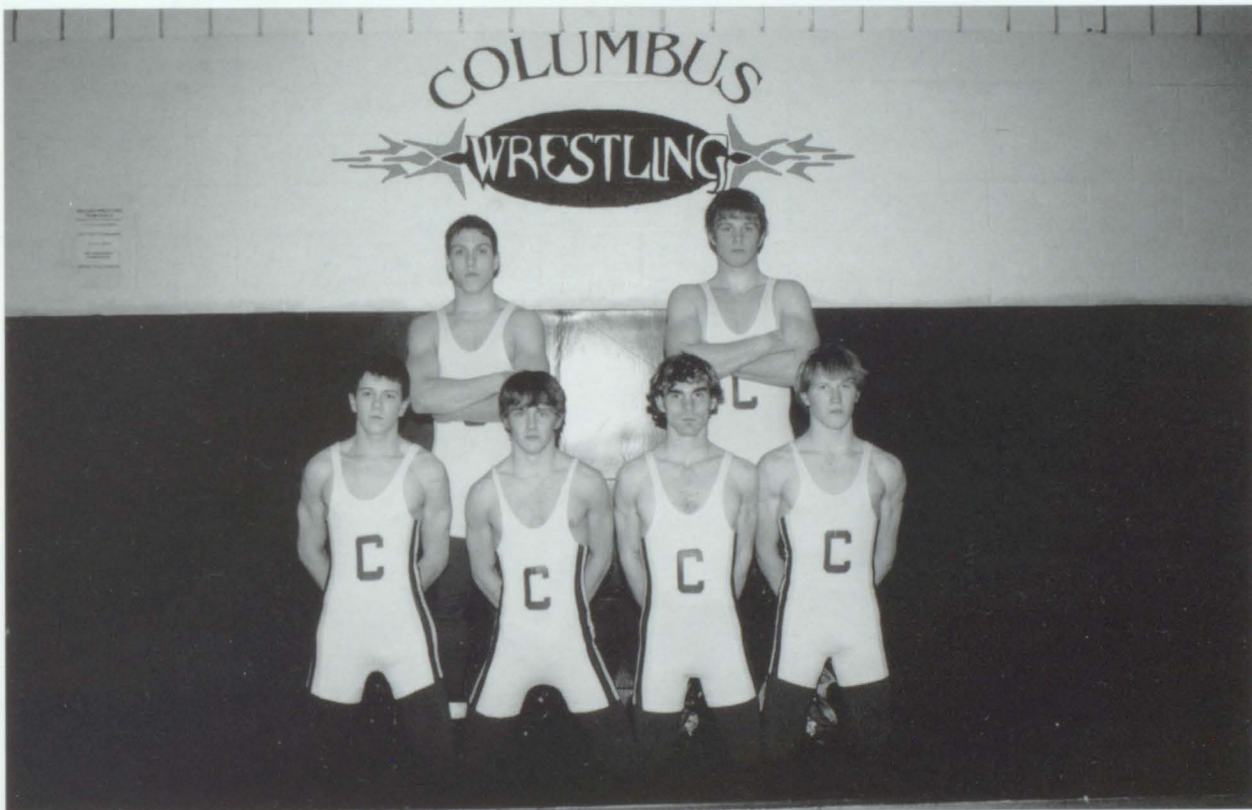

Boys Basketball

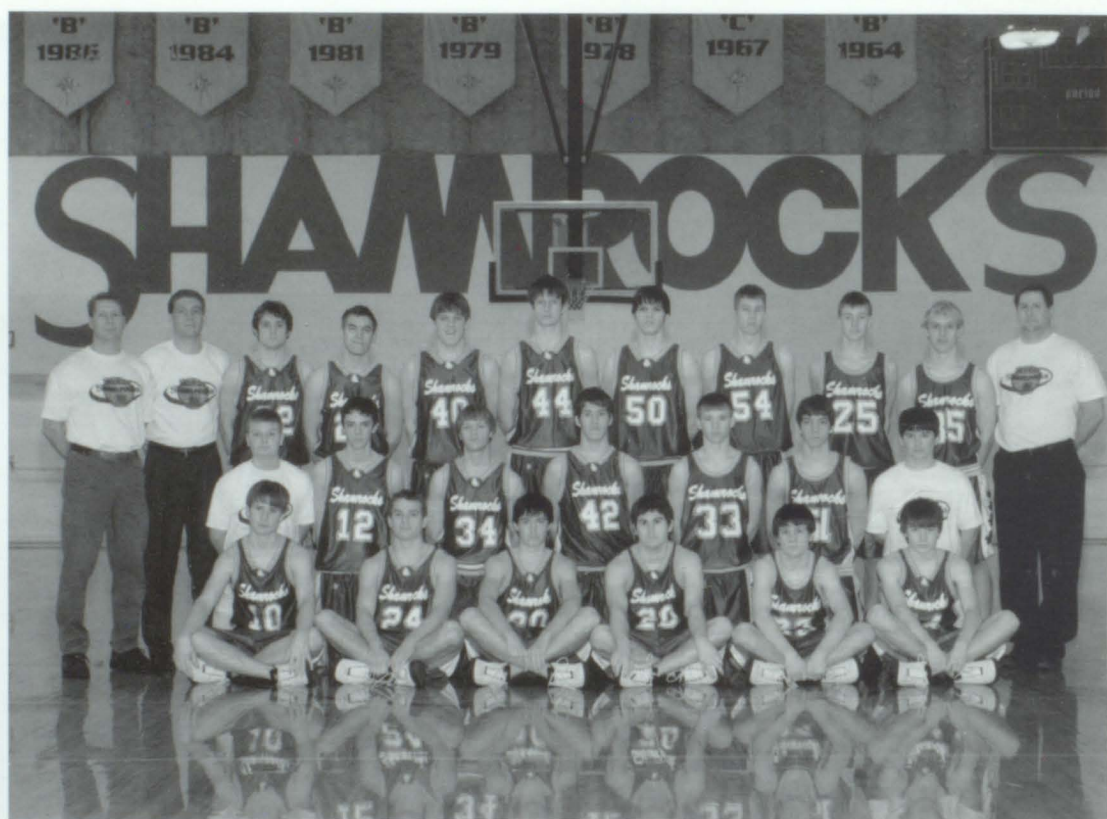

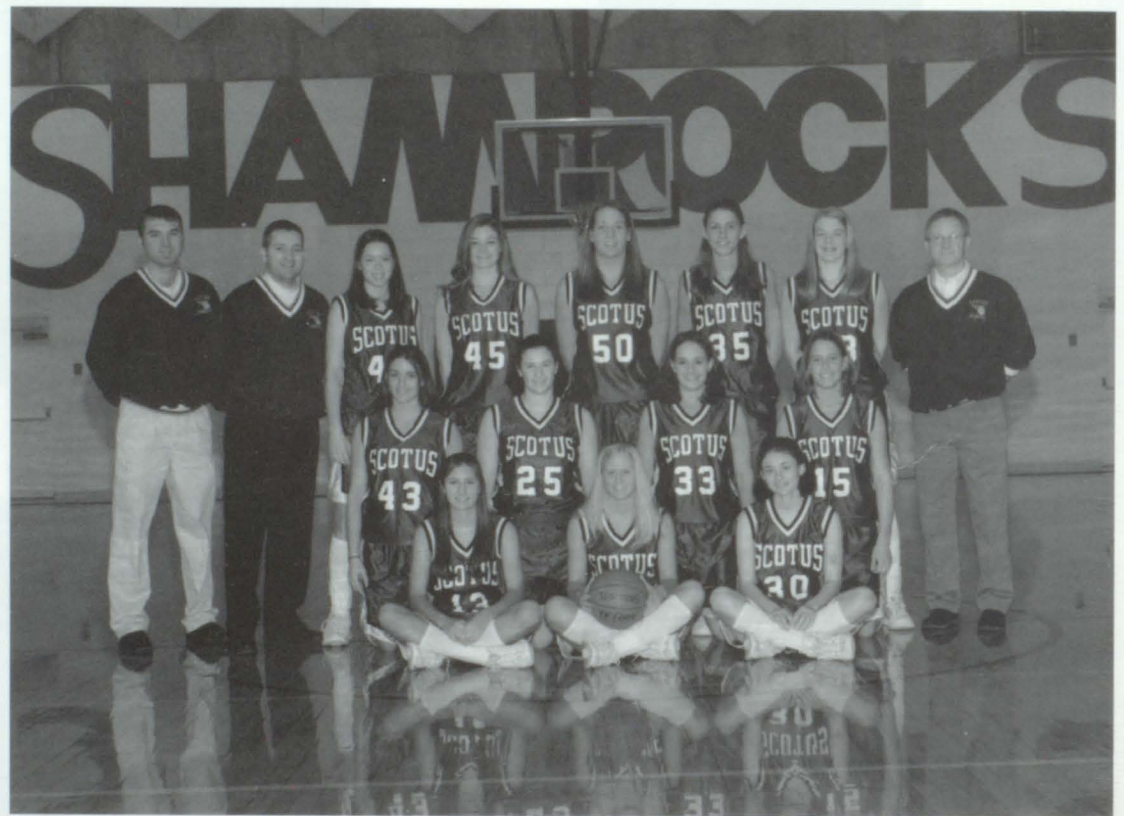

Girls Soccer

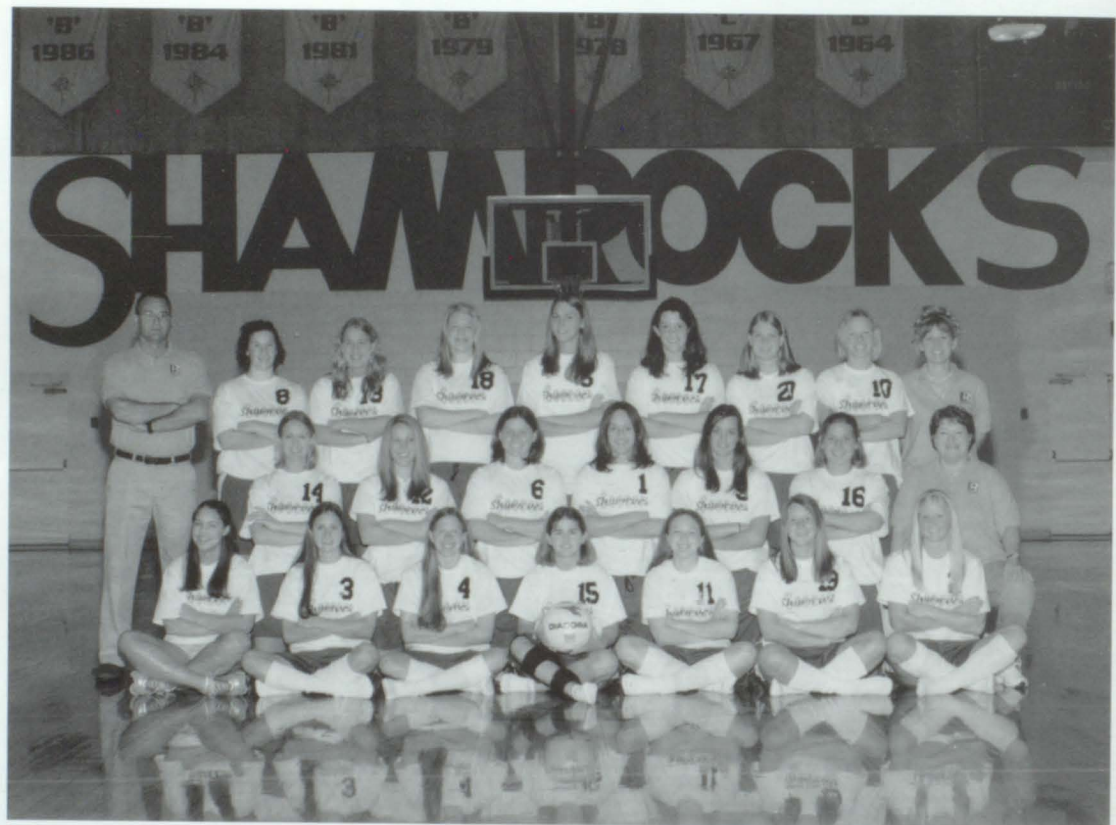

Girls Track

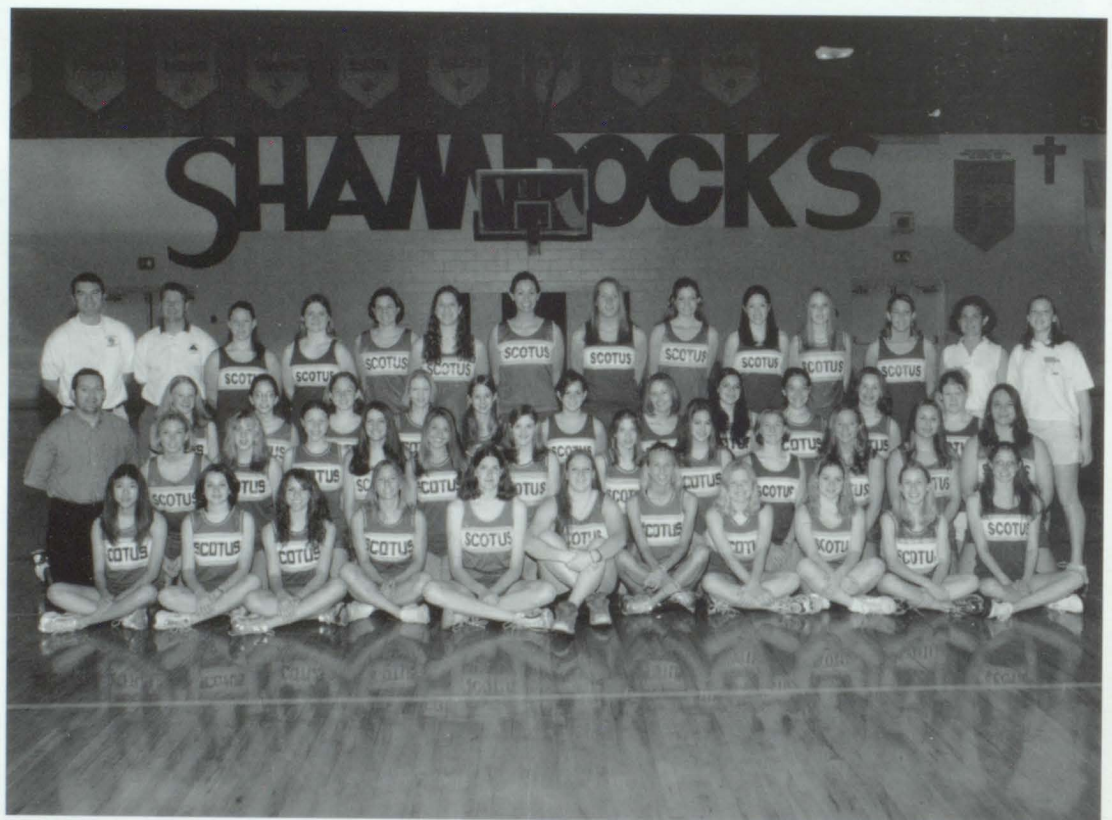

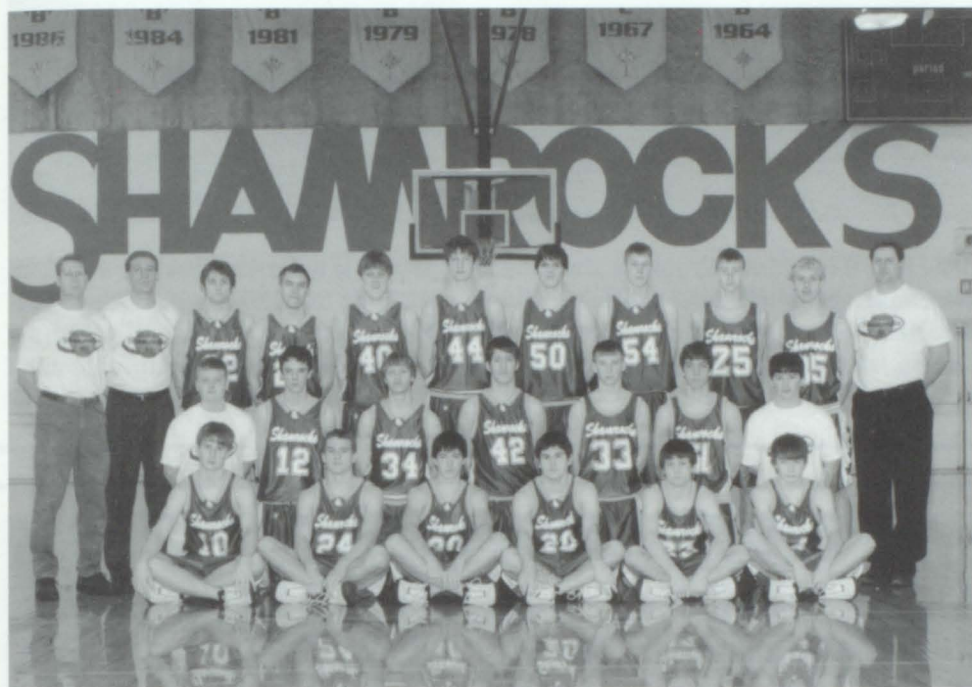

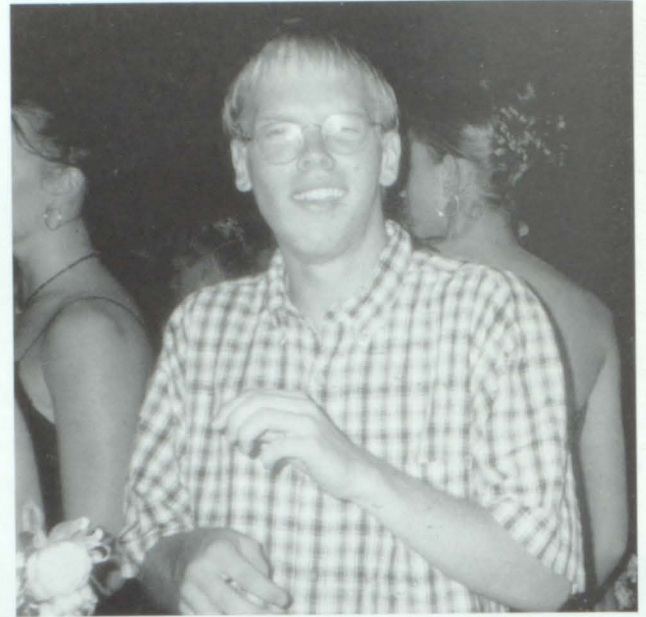

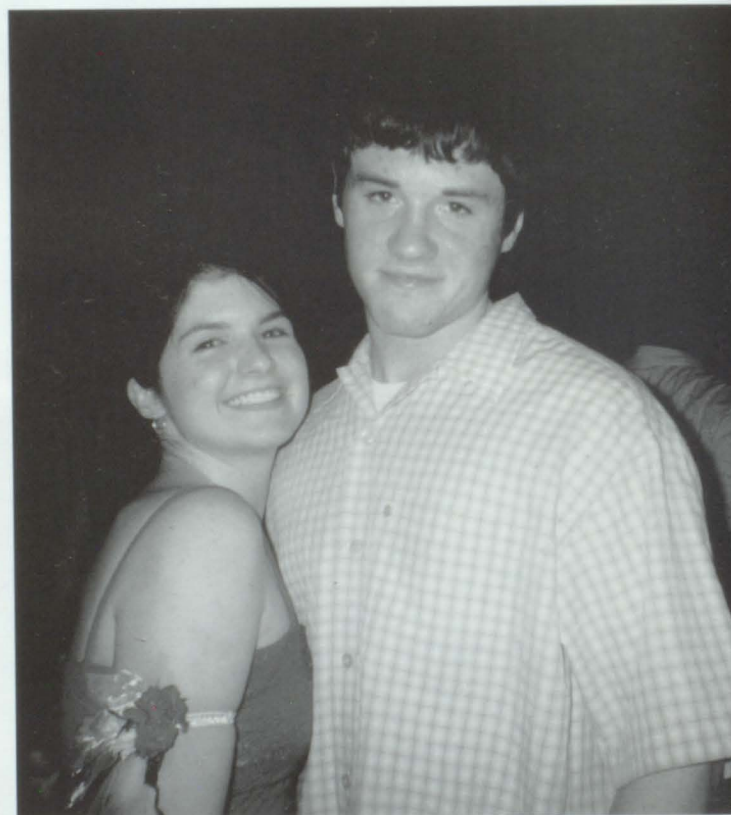
