As the Shamrocks won the district game, playing worse than expected against Wakefield, the outlook for state appeared doubtful.

Coming into the State Tournament they knocked off two strong opponents. Before the first day was done, Wahoo Neumann and Norfolk Catholic were sent packing. Coming back into the Coliseum, where the Shamrocks had lost two years previous, they would face Grand Island Central Catholic, who had handed them two losses earlier in the season.
