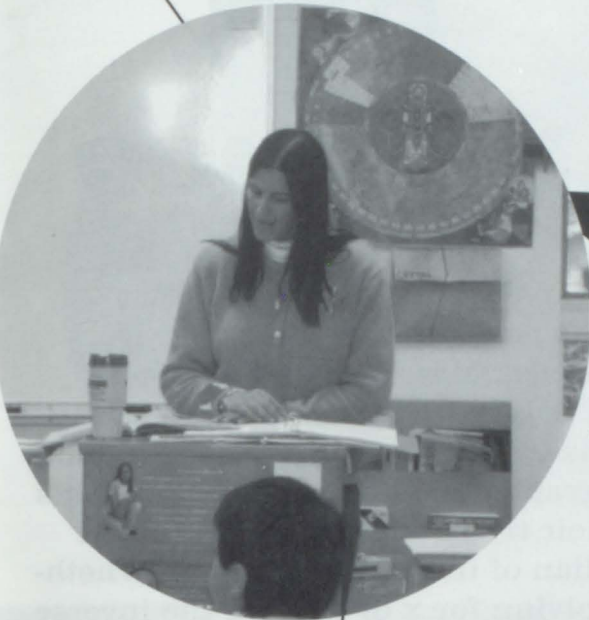
Physical Education and Social Studies

Family and Consumer Sciences and Languages



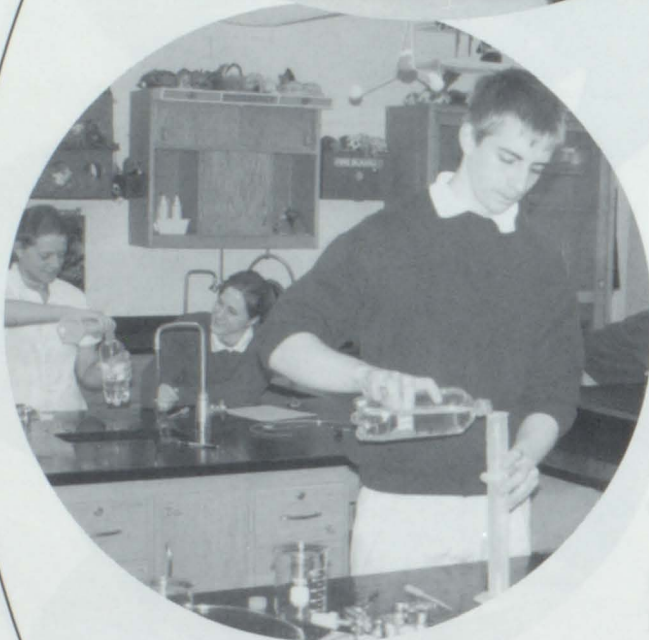

Math and Science

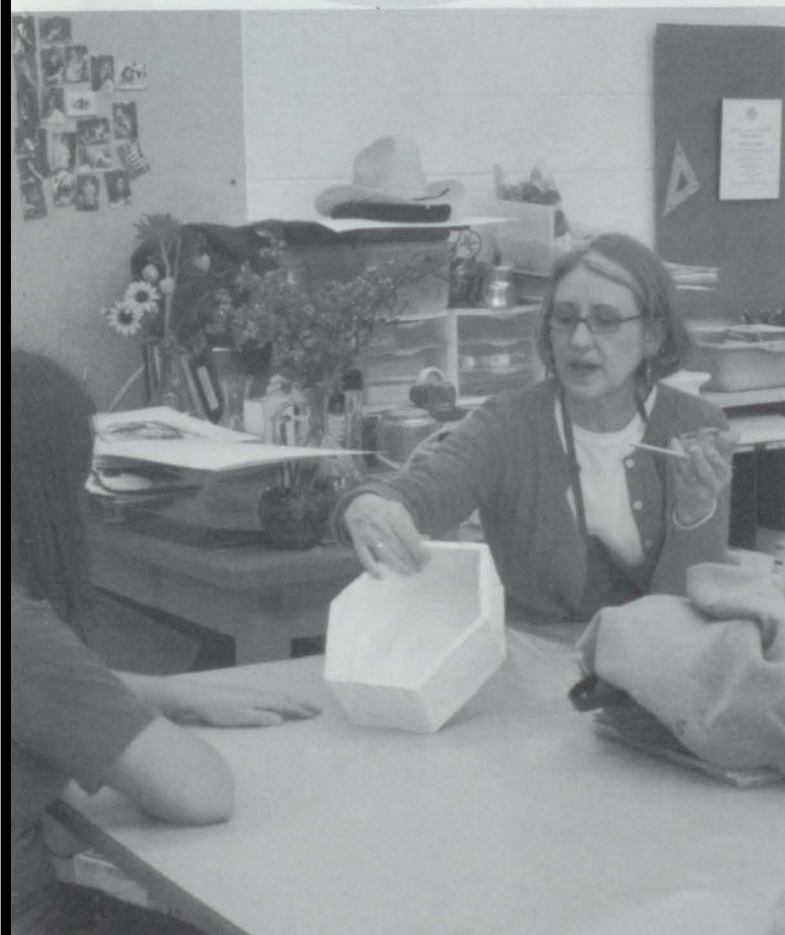

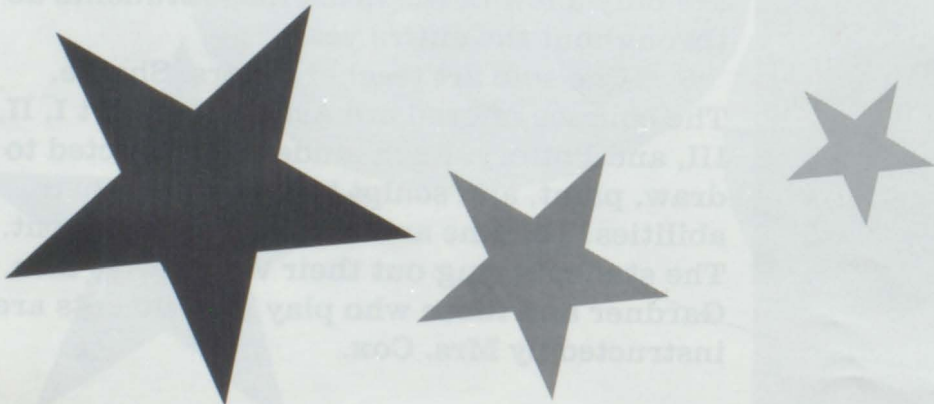
Religion and Art

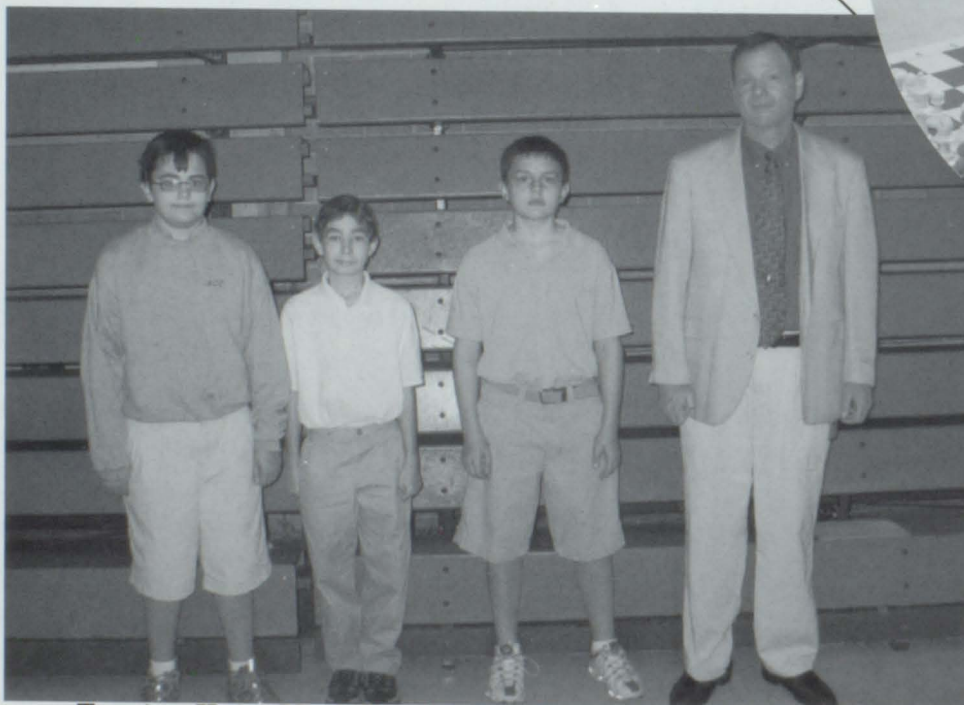
TTADA
