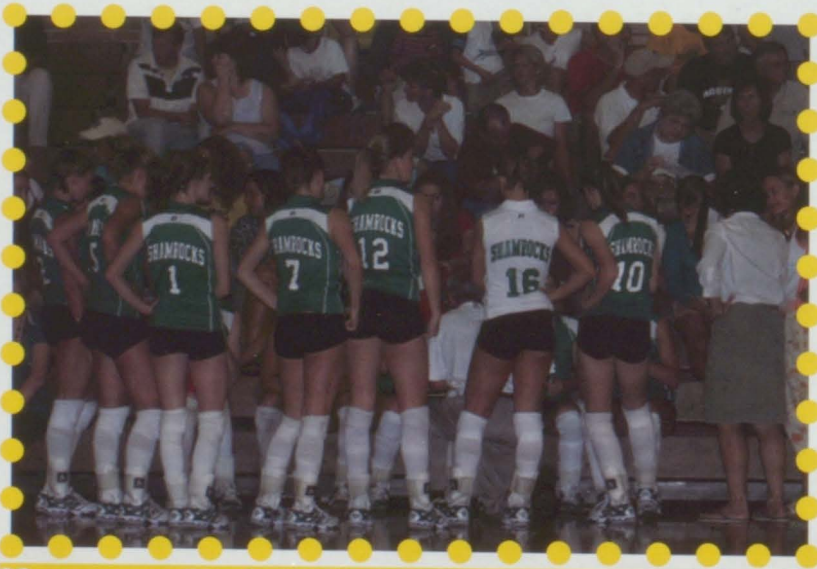
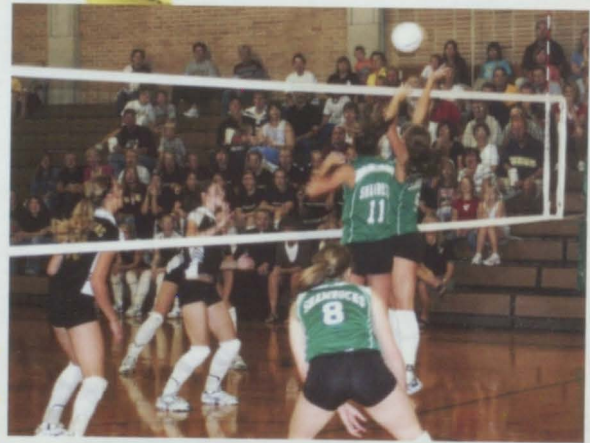
# VARSITY VOLLEYBALL

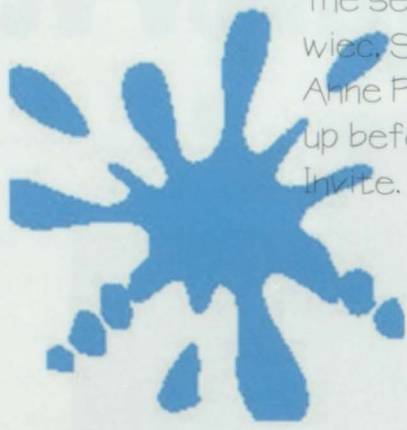

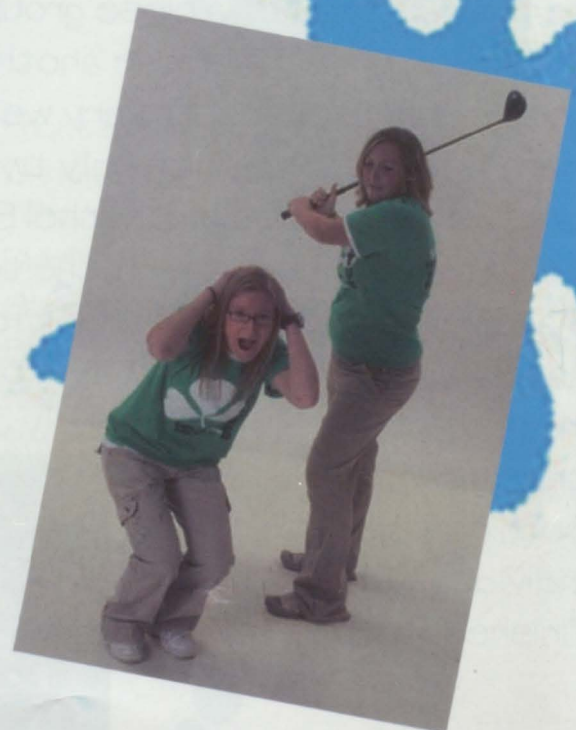


## GIRLS GOLF

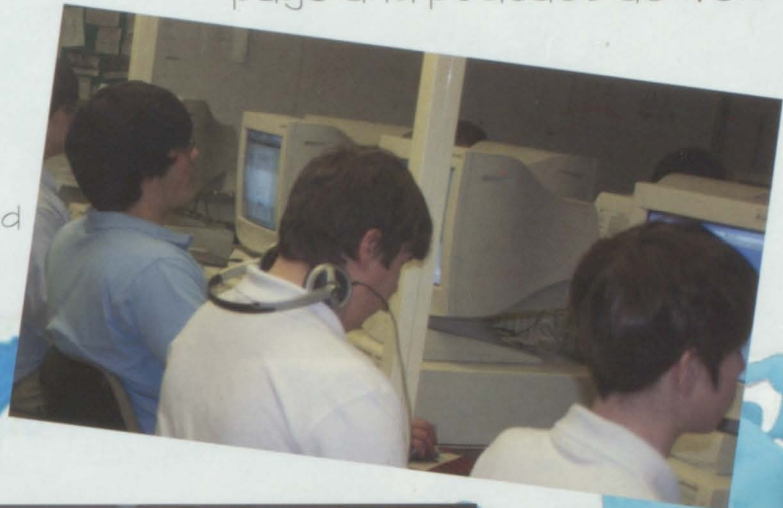

# FALL PLAY ARSENIC AND OLD LACE

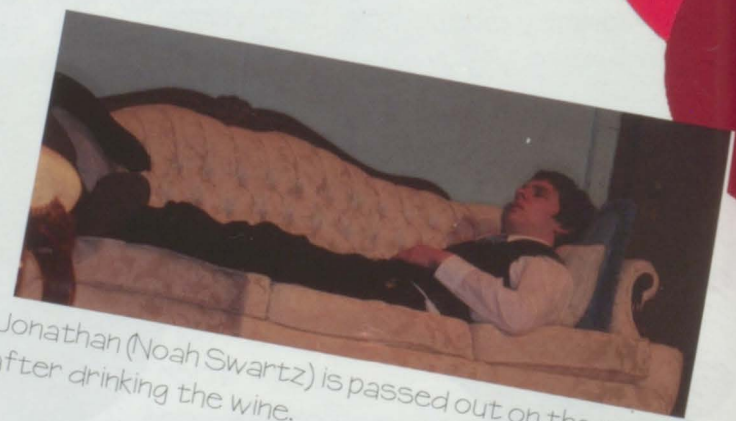

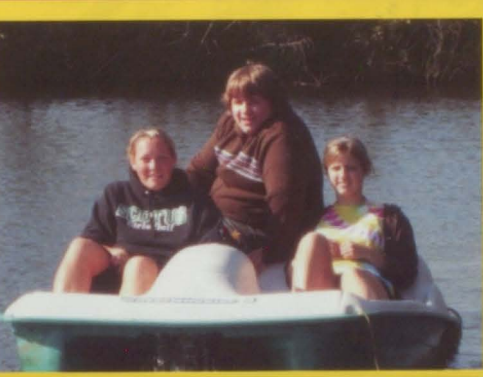
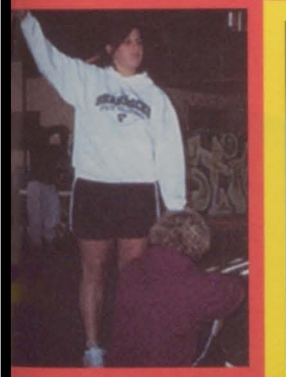
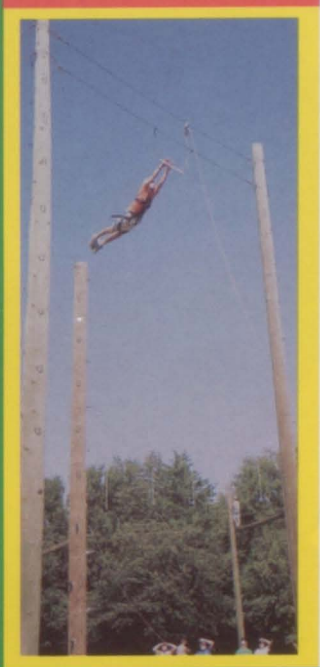
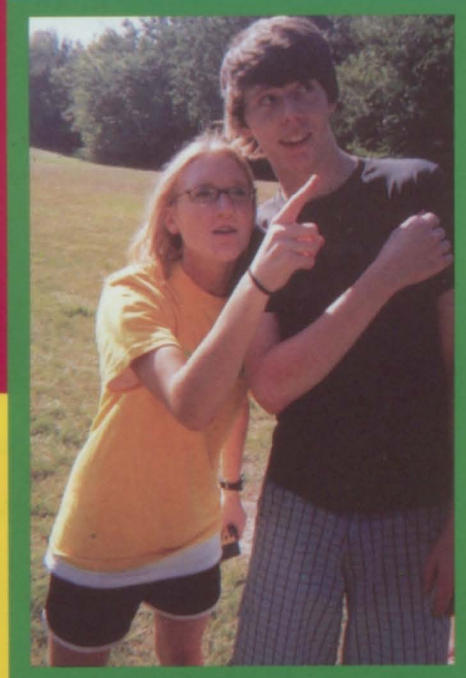
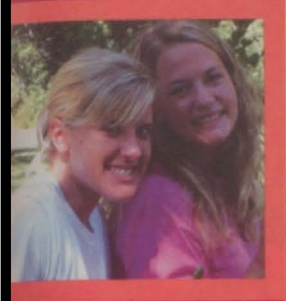


# SENIOR RETREAT
