Listening to speakers like Aaron Davis and Youth for Christ inspired many students.





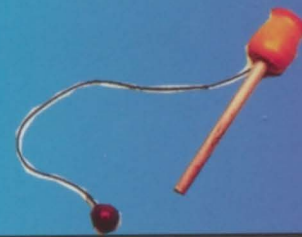
# LANGUAGE & MATH

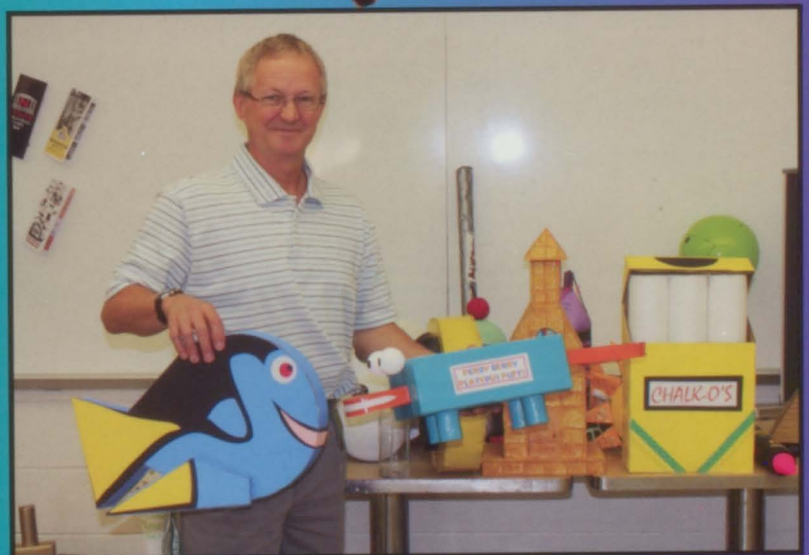

Abbey Schieffer, Trey Stuthman, and Forrest Casarez suited up to joust in Mrs. Schaad's class.

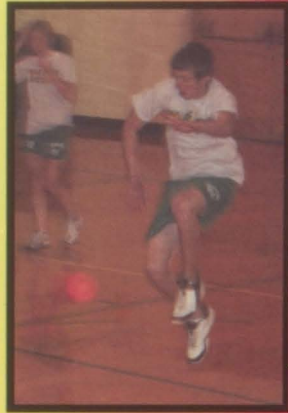

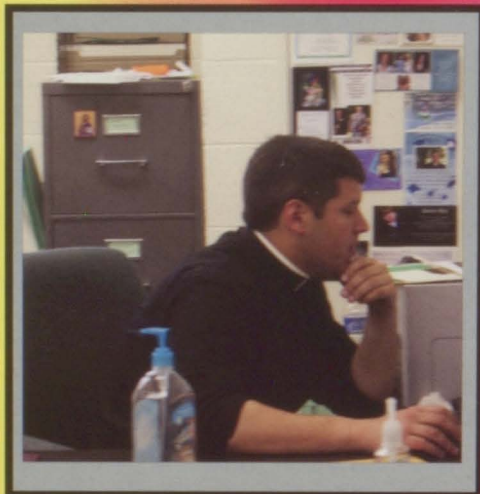

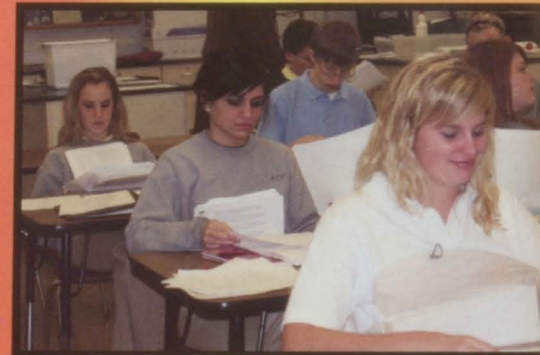

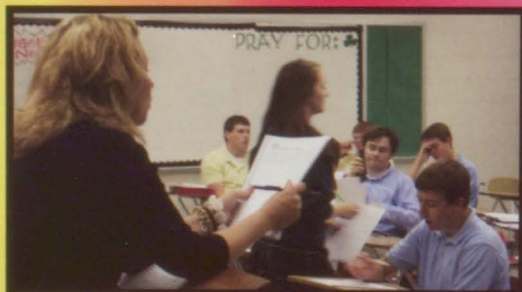

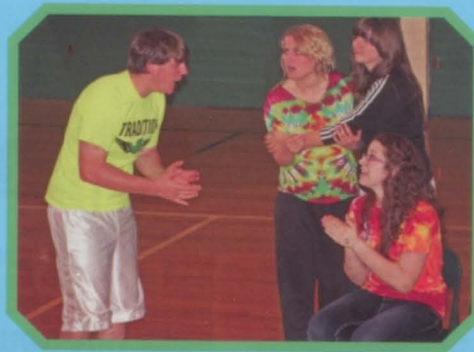

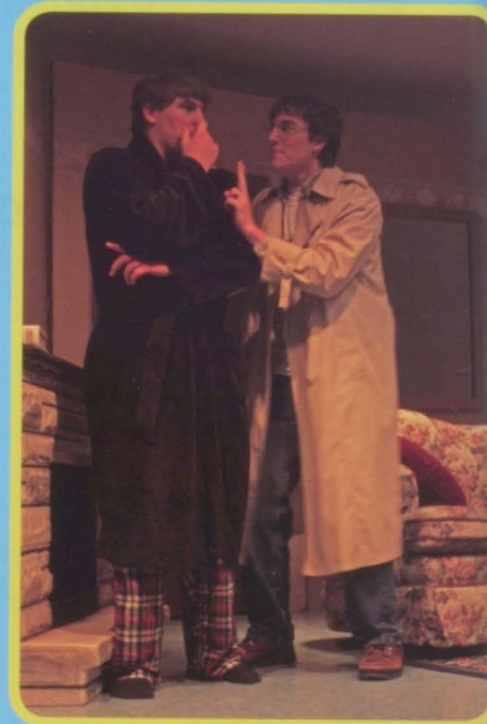

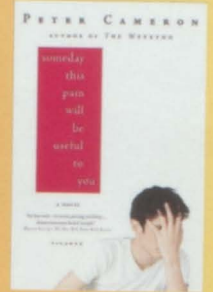

# CAMPUS MINISTRY

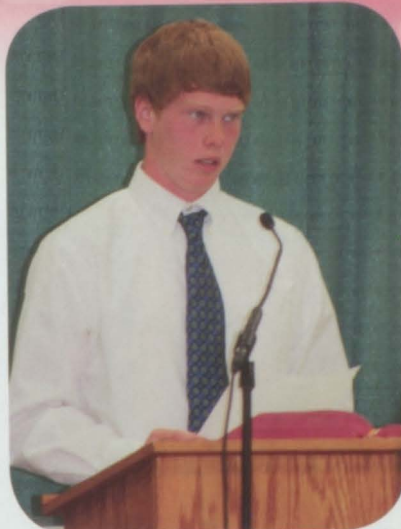

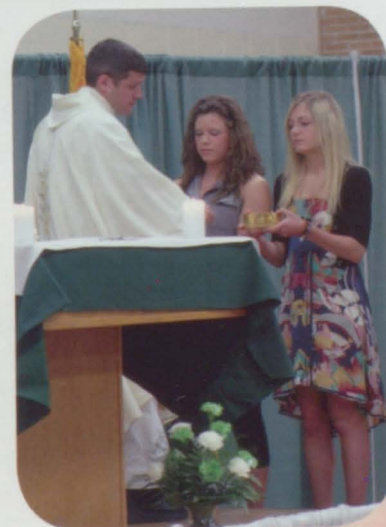

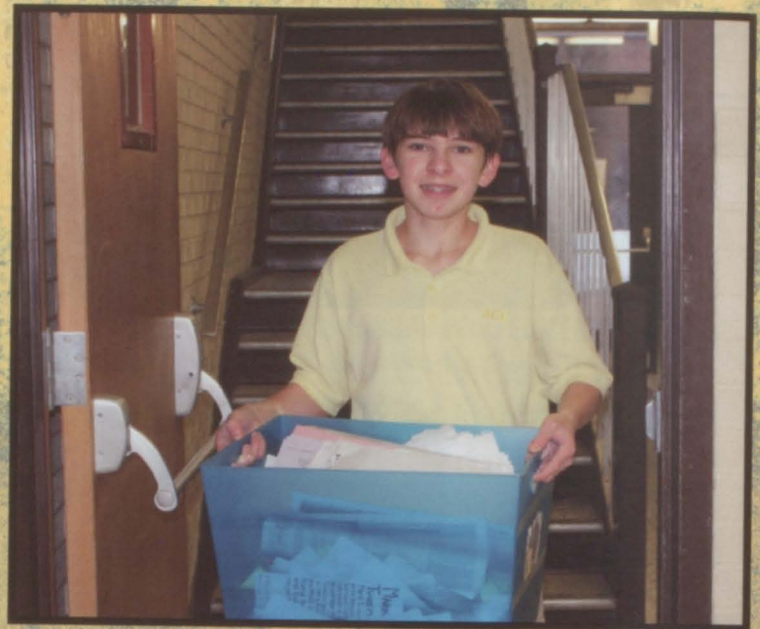

# NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

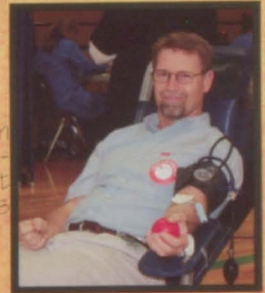

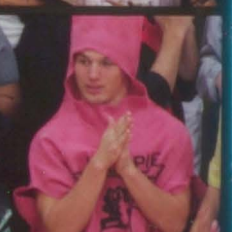

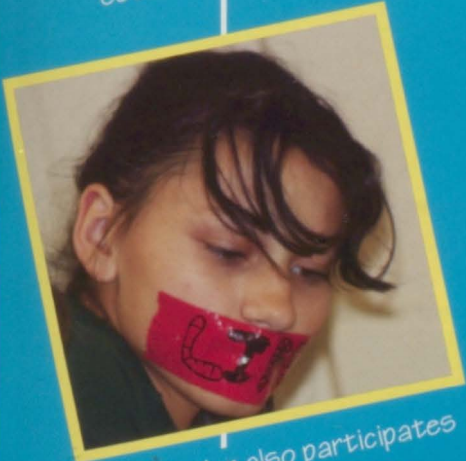

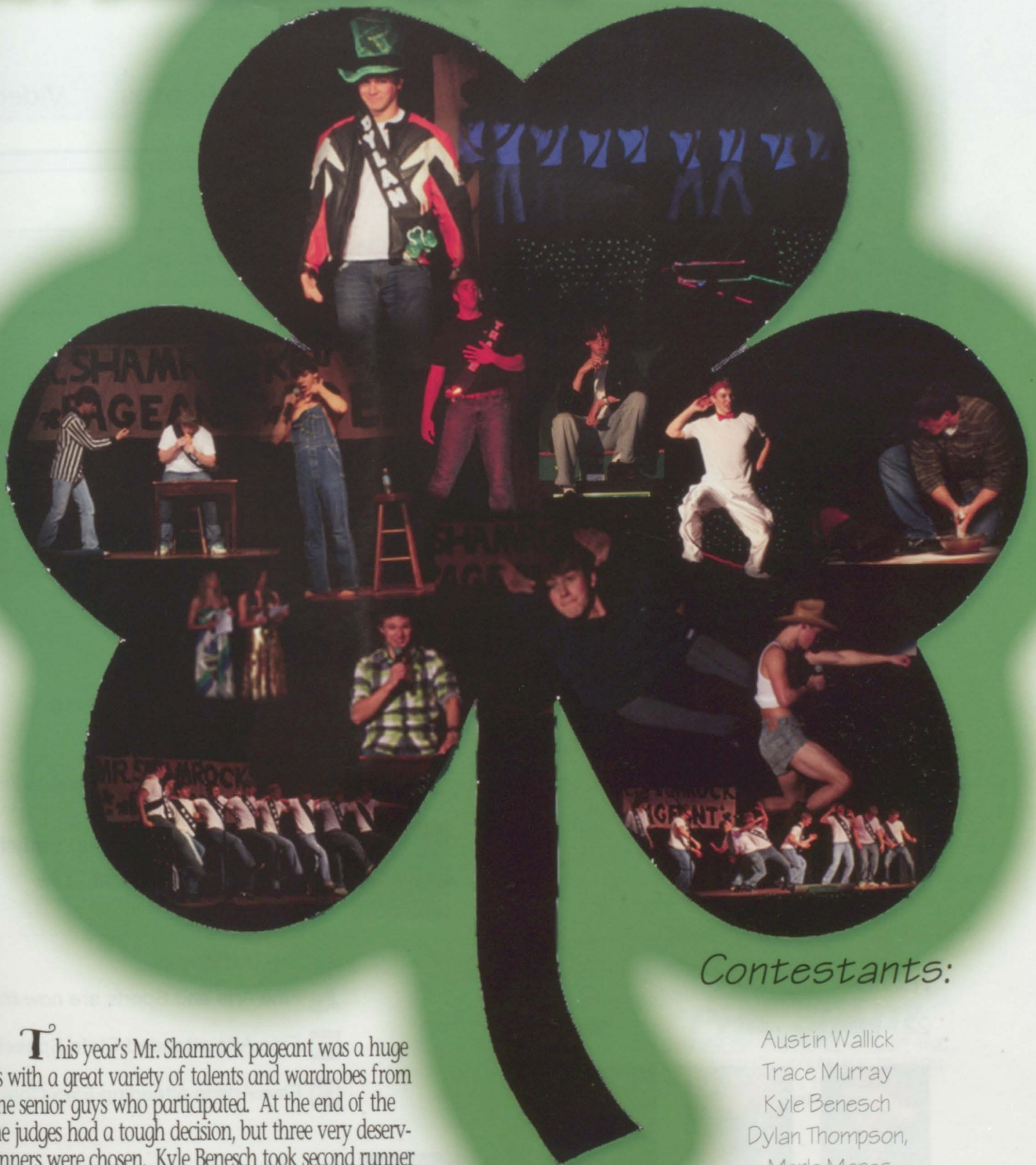

# BAND

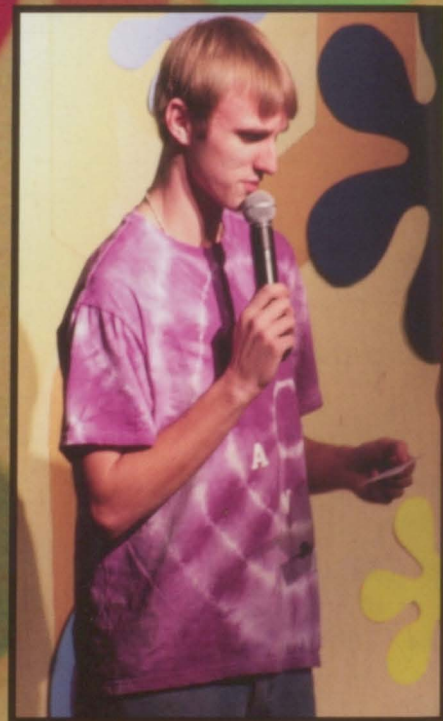

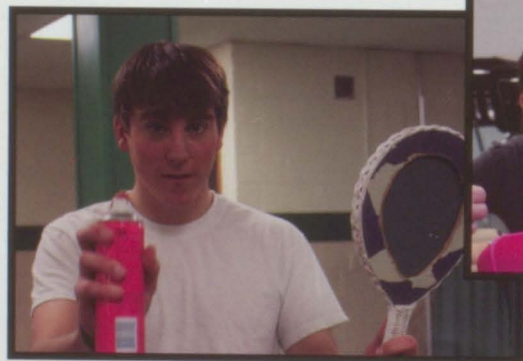
# FALL PLAY

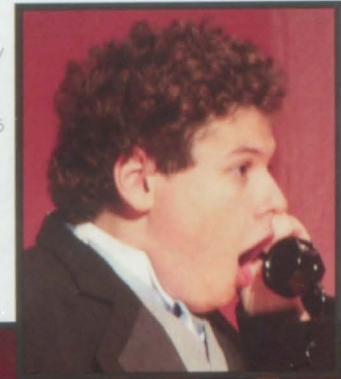

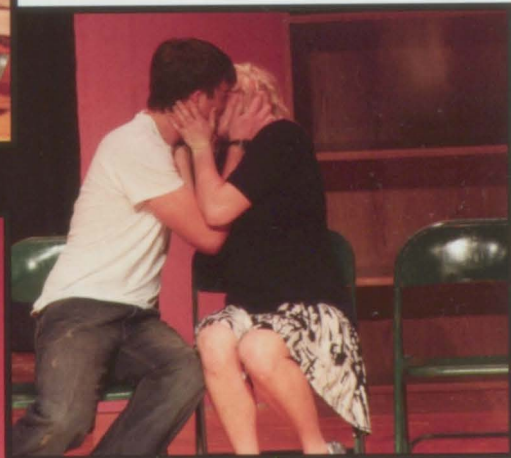

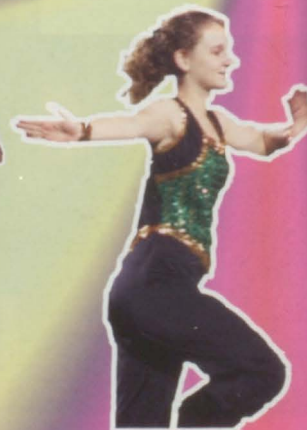

# MOCK TRIAL

Mock Trial consisted of four teams this year, two of which were completely new. A sophomore team was added along with a freshman and junior mix. Each of the teams met about once every week with their coach, who are all practicing attorneys, to go over the case and try to think of loop holes they could use. As the competition got closer, the teams scrimaged each other so they would have practice in the competition scenario.

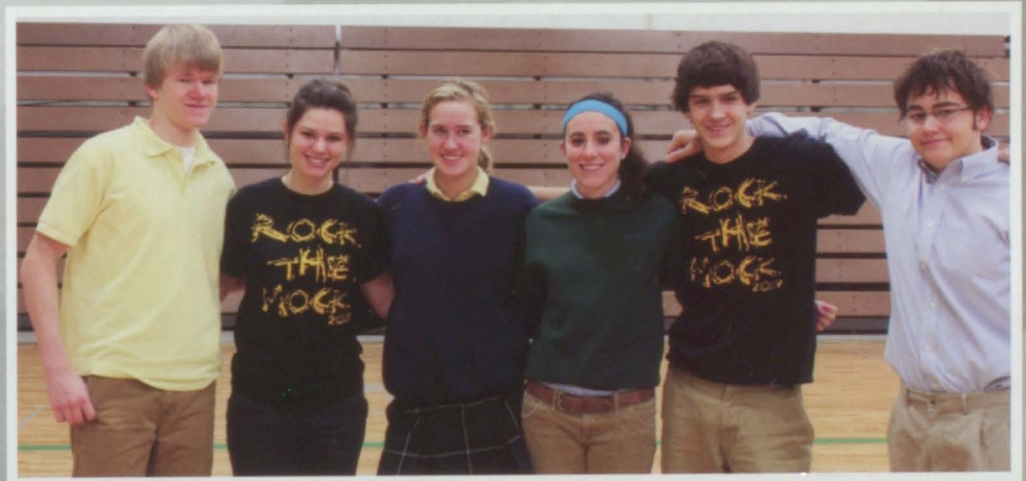

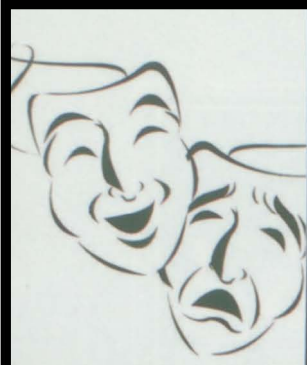

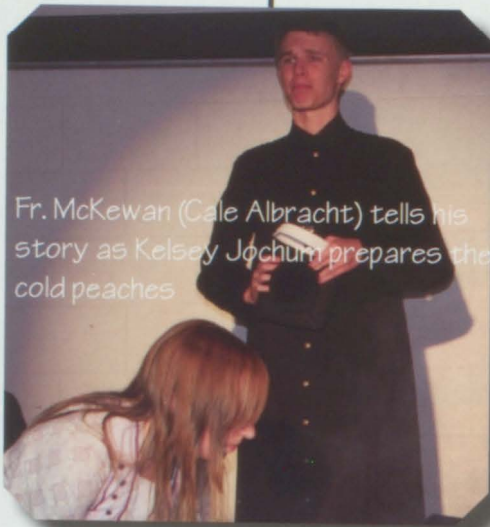

# ONE-ACT



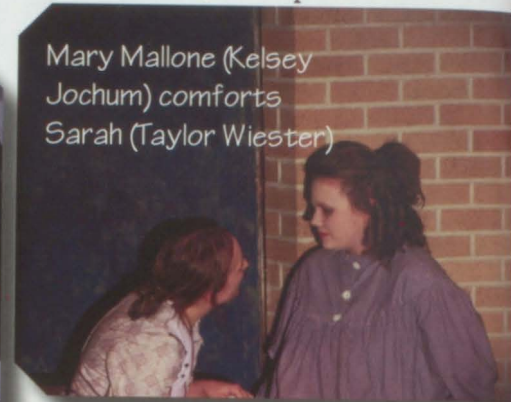

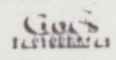

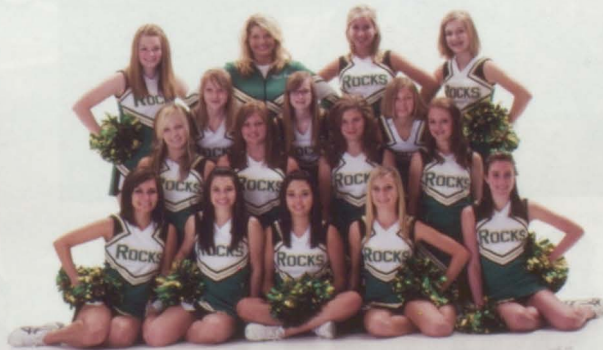

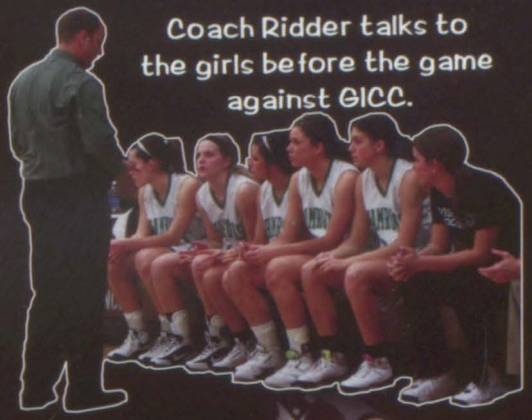

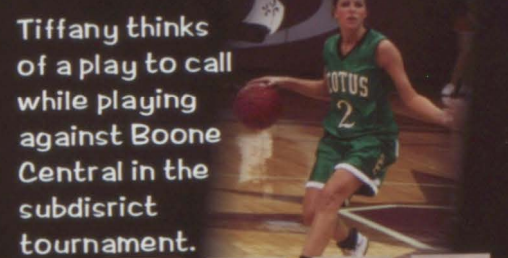

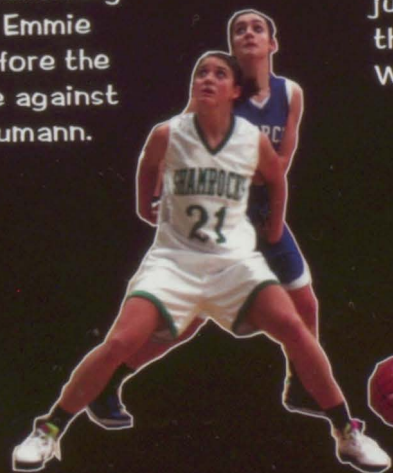

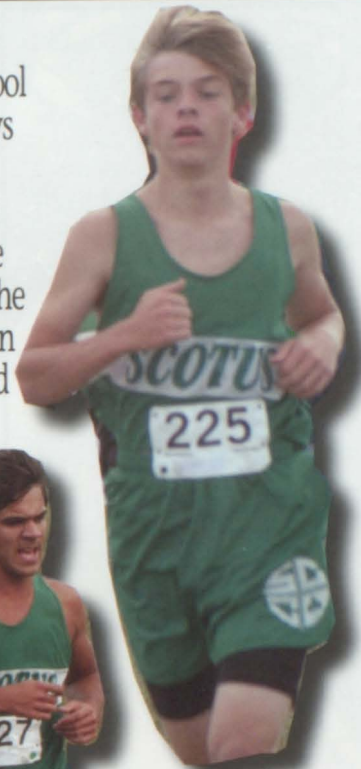

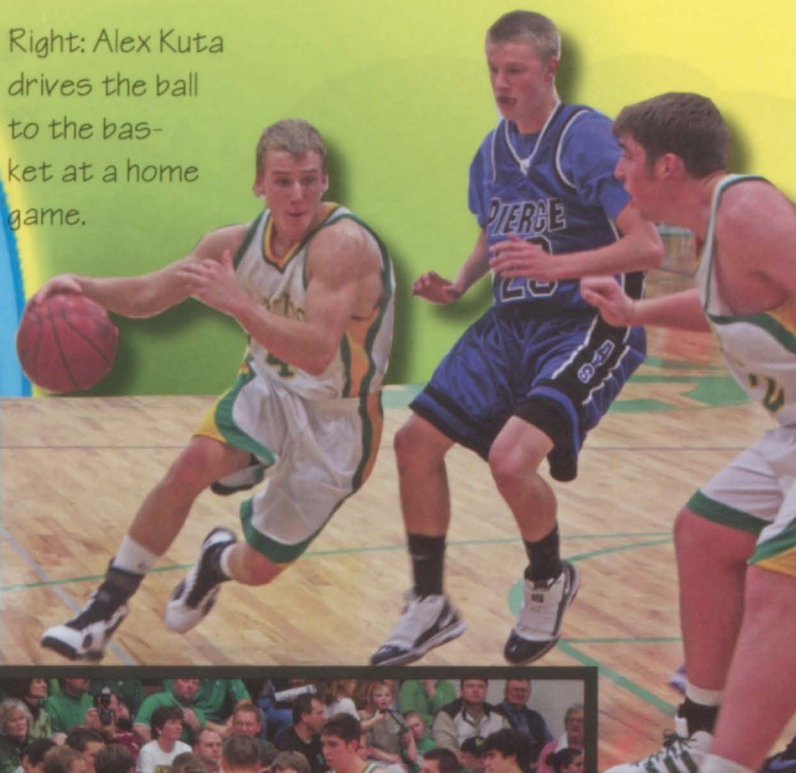

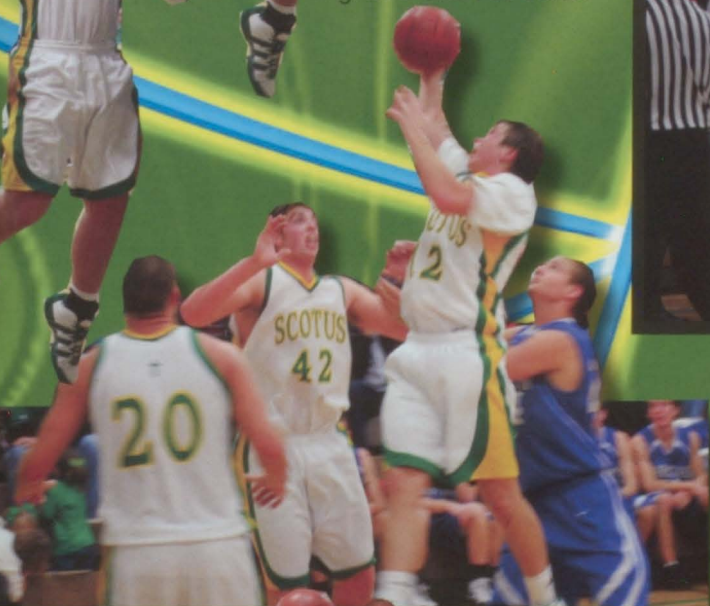

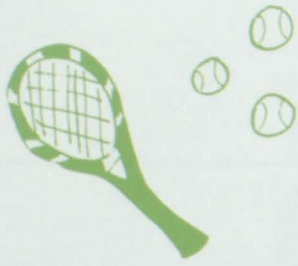

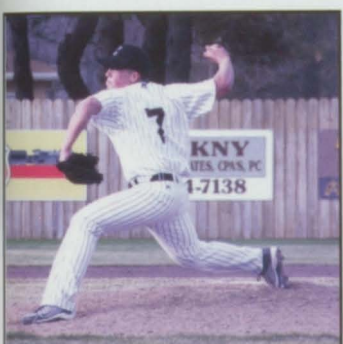

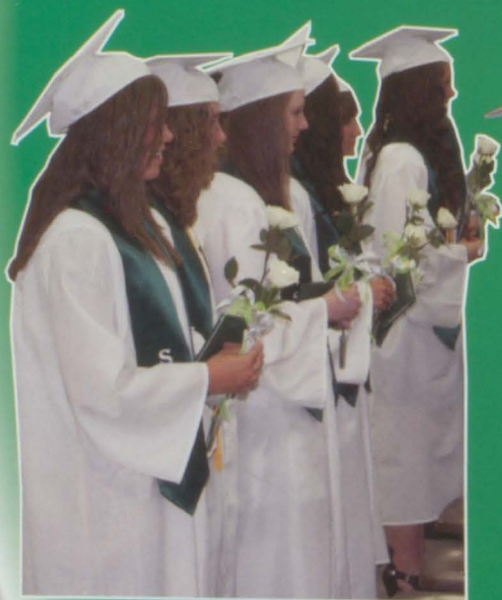
