








#### SOCIAL STUDIES

after the musical. Because there was such a short time to prepare, it took much dedication from those involved. Through the planning and work from all members of the cast and crew the production was a success.












## Mock Trial consisted of four teams this year, two of which were completely new. A sophmore team was added along with a freshmen and junior

Mock Trial consisted of four teams this year, two of which were completely new. A sophmore team was added along with a freshman and junior mix. The junior team was coached by Erik Klutman and made it to district finals by competing against the new sophmore team and Aquinas. They lost closely to Columbus High in district finals. The existing sophmore team was coached by Gene Schumacher. They beat Twin River soundly, but then lost to Columbus High in the second round. 



Lindsay Staroscik also said about the dance, "I had a lot of fun the music was good and the decorations were creative. I just love having a good time with my friends!"








# GRADUATION
