# The Importance of LB753 For Children

Please **click here** to learn more about LB753 and how it ensures children growing up in poverty or who have been bullied can attend the best school for them. The Opportunity Scholarships Act provides increased scholarship opportunities through a state income tax credit. Taxpayers can claim this tax credit by making financial contributions to an SGO which are authorized by LB753.

State income tax credits can be claimed starting on January 1, 2024, with scholarships being distributed for the 2024-25 school year.

You may also read a letter from Vickie Kauffold, Superintendent of Schools at the Archdiocese of Omaha regarding school choice legislation (LB753, the Opportunity Scholarships Act) and information about scholarship granting organization (SGO).

### School Excellence Fund SEF 17









Gifts to SEF 17 will support all four Columbus Catholic Schools. Guided by strategic planning and made possible by the School Excellence Fund through SEF 17, our schools will (1) graduate students with the values needed to choose their life's vocation, become community leaders and active parishioners; (2) update facilities; (3) recruit and retain excellent teachers.

SEF 17 Goal: \$1.5 Million to be utilized over the next three years.

#### **INVESTING IN THE EDUCATION OF OUR STUDENTS** - 65%

- 1. Equipping our students to take on the next chapter of life college, trade school or workforce; leadership and entrepreneurship; and Catholic discernment of vocations (family life, religious life). Our graduates have the skills to:
  - o apply Catholic values when determining life choices
  - o use critical thinking skills and embody leadership qualities
  - o demonstrate effective communication and presentation skills
  - o persevere, adapt and problem solve
  - o recognize the importance of service and community
- 2. Creating opportunities for students to become the best version of themselves. SEF 17 will provide support for developing High Ability Learning (HAL) programming and provide additional student support in the areas of Academic Intervention / Special Education (SPED).
- 3. Keeping tuition affordable. It is through the generous support of our donors, we are able to offer a Catholic education that is accessible to all families.

#### **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS - 25%**

SEF 17 resources will create a safe and functional environment for our students by improving building accessibility and updating security measures. We plan to replace classroom doors, improve intercom and communication systems, upgrade security cameras, and add an elevator at Scotus - to assist students with mobility issues and provide a means to move instructional equipment in our three-story building.

#### **TEACHER RETENTION & RECRUITMENT - 10%**

Columbus Catholic Schools strives to enhance faculty collaboration, cultivate mentorships, and continue to provide growth opportunities guided by research. SEF 17 will provide our teachers with opportunities to pursue new and better ways of engaging all students in the classroom and allow CCS to offer competitive salary and benefit structures to recruit and retain excellent teachers.

Proofs: About 1 to 2 weeks after Picture Day you will receive a Proof of your student's 2 poses.

The Proof has the Website and Password to place your order online.

If you do not wish to pay with a credit card: Still place the order online and select Cash or Check as the method of payment upon checkout. Place cash or check in the Payment Envelope that came with your Proof. Write your Order Confirmation Number from your online order on the Payment Envelope.

The Picture Packages you order will arrive approximately 2-3 weeks after the Due Date printed on the Proof.

Family Plan: When you pay for two children in your family, this qualifies you for a FREE package of equal or lesser value for all other children in your family.

If you qualify for the Family Plan, please email <a href="mailto:info@pegasus-si.com">info@pegasus-si.com</a> with the two Order Confirmation Numbers that have been paid in full along with the Order Confirmation Number for the order that is FREE. Please be sure to order and send email prior to the Due Date on the proof to avoid any late fees — Do NOT wait for all student's proofs as deadline dates may vary if they attend another school or are a Retake. Your FREE order is ON HOLD until you email the Confirmation Numbers.

For the 3rd order or more, use payment type FAMILY and click APPLY, then submit your online order.

Retakes: If you prefer to have a retake, you may do so for any reason on Retake Day. Wait until you get your RETAKE Proof to place an order at that time. If you decide to order from your original Proof rather than the Retake, you'll receive a late fee, as it is past the Order Due Date.

<u>Due Date</u>: On your proof is an Order Due Date. If you submit your order AFTER the Due Date, you'll have a \$10 late fee and late orders can take up to 6 – 8 weeks after ordering.
