


#### **Scotus Craft Boutique**

As part of our continuous school improvement process, our school staff has discussed critical skills that all people (including our students) need to have in order to become a disciplined child of God.


Last year, we adopted a framework that identified such skills, and this framework is posted throughout our building. The framework gives us a common language when working with our students. The overarching framework puts Jesus first

and is a reminder that when Jesus is first in our lives, we experience true JOY (even in the midst of suffering).

How do we know that Jesus is first in our life? We desire to come to know Him more, we take regular time to worship Him (Sunday Mass), we spend time daily in prayer, and we reach out to those around us in service. These are the four marks that indicate we are striving to put Jesus first in our life.


