Admission to get in is \$5 for adults and kids \$2 (grades 1-6).




Scotus license plate frames for sale

As we begin December, we are nearing the end of the first semester. This is obviously a hectic time with family gatherings, new activities beginning, and preparing for challenging final exams. But, we need to remember to take a step back during December and commit ourselves to

preparing for the birth of our Lord during Advent. During the month of December, our students will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation during our all-school penance services. This is in addition to our weekly opportunities for Reconciliation on Wednesdays at Scotus.

During the month of November, some of our female students had the opportunity to experience the new retreat structure at Scotus by participating in the FIERCE Athlete Retreat. This retreat focused on the Theology of the Body and reinforced that we are all created in God's image. Our students were not the only ones participating in retreats during November. Our staff had the opportunity to participate in a day of Faith Formation led by Jose Gonzalez from the Sophia Institute and Sister Karolyn Nunes who is the Vocation Director at Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George. This was an awesome opportunity for our staff to grow in their faith as well as learn how to evangelize to our students.

Also during November, our 8th grade students completed another wonderful Science Fair, our junior class participated in mock interviews led by the Columbus Area Chamber of Commerce, and our Health Science students were able to visit Columbus Community Hospital.

Our students once again helped us shoot right past our \$12,000 goal for the Dash for Cash Lottery that raises funds for the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton fund at Scotus. Students raised over \$14,000 with over 270 students selling at least \$50 worth of tickets. The Scotus Booster Club is also preparing for the Craft Boutique on December 3rd which is always a successful event that raises funds to support our students.

New crucifix

Thank you to the Class of 1983 and principal donors Michelle (Brooks '83) & Bob Soulliere who made it part of their 40th class reunion to underwrite the purchase of a new crucifix for the Dowd Activity Center. The crucifix came from Italy, and including shipping costs totaled nearly \$2,800.00. It looks great and once blessed, it will be installed in the Dowd Activity Center!

New scholarship recently created

Thanks to a \$20,000.00 donation to the Scotus endowment from JoAnn (Stavas-

Braun) Svajgr, a 1963 alumna of St. Bonaventure HS/Scotus CC HS, and her husband Al, a new scholarship was established to provide tuition assistance to students attending Scotus Central Catholic.

The scholarship is named the G. J. (Jerry) Braun and JoAnn (Stavas-Braun) Svajgr Scholarship. It is the intention of the donors that two-\$500 scholarships will be annually awarded, and as an endowed fund, the corpus of the fund (\$20,000) will never be spent--only the fund's annual earnings will support the scholarships.

November fundraisers

Bid-a-Bag was held on November 2nd with 55 women attending. Although intended to be more for engagement than for fundraising, the event had net proceeds of \$2,814.57. Proceeds were deposited in the Scotus Booster Club account where they will become available to support student activities at Scotus.

The Dash for Holiday Cash Lottery was again a success with Scotus students selling 2,949 tickets or 134 more than in 2022. Net proceeds of approximately \$12,900 will be deposited in the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Scholarship Fund which provides tuition assistance annually to Scotus students. Students involved in the ticket sales also enjoyed a dress down week at the end of November. The winner of the \$1,000 cash prize was Lakeview HS student, Eli Colegrove.


