


Outstanding Service Award

Hall of Fame

Earlier this fall, two former Scotus athletes were inducted to the Shamrock Athletic Hall of Fame. Kara Moore '13 and Morgan Benesch '13. In volleyball, Kara (pictured at right) played on the 2011 undefeated (29-0) state Class C1 championship team, and on the 2012 state runner up and 2010 state 3rd place teams. She held the school record for career most digs in a single match at 31. She was also selected first team, All-State in 2011 and 2012; and played in the 2013 NE Coaches Association volleyball all-star game. In basketball Kara was on the varsity team for three years and played in the 2013 Columbus all-star game. As a soccer player, she was a four-year starter and selected to the first team, all-state in 2013. Kara was also the 2013 Scotus Female Athlete of the Year.



Morgan Benesch (pictured below) was a four-time all-state runner in cross country. She finished 3rd at



state in 2009 and second at state in 2010, 2011, and 2012. She was a member of the 2012 state champion cross country team and she currently holds the school record for both the Scotus 4k home course at 15 minutes, 13 seconds, and the state 4k course at 14 minutes, 57 seconds. At state track, Morgan was a four-time participant in the 3200-meter finishing 2nd in her junior and senior years and she also ran the 1600 meter placing 4th her junior year and 3rd her senior year. She was a 4-time academic all-state in both cross country and track and she was selected as the 2013 Sertoma Female Athlete of the Year. At UNK she was a 3-time NCAA all-American in cross country and she holds several UNK track records. Thank you, Kara, and Morgan, for being amazing Shamrocks! You are now included in a great lineage of Shamrocks in the Scotus Athletic Hall of Fame.

Monty Schmidt '94 included in his summer vacation trip to Europe a pilgrimage to the burial site of Blessed John Duns Scotus. "During the summer of 2023, I went to Lisbon, Portugal to attend World Youth Day 2023; and while there I also took a side trip over to Cologne, Germany. In Lisbon I went to the beautiful church built on the site of the home of the Saint known as Anthony of Padua, who was born in 1195 and lived most of his life there. Locally, they still prefer to refer to him



as "Saint Anthony of Lisbon" due to it being his birthplace and where he spent most of his life. Padua, Italy is where he spent his last 5 years, passed away, and is buried. This was of interest to me because my home church and elementary school in Columbus, NE were named after him. And in Cologne, among other sites, I visited the burial place of Blessed John Duns Scotus, after whom Scotus Central Catholic High School was named. I discreetly left behind a Scotus prayer card, as well as a small decal of our logo near the memorial candles by his tomb. It was especially meaningful to me that I was able to see both these places relating to the two schools I attended while growing up. Both have been quite good to me!" -- Monty Schmidt '94


• Scotus Central Catholic was the recipient of the National

injury prevention and treatment for student athletes. Scotus Central Catholic is honored to receive this 1st Team recognition from NATA, made possible through the support of the Columbus Community Hospital and Scotus athletic trainer, Andrew Sheridan.

- Ron Mimick '75 was inducted into the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame on October 8th. Ron was the ninth Nebraska high school coach to reach the 300-win milestone in football, and he has been teaching and coaching at Aquinas Catholic High School since 1991. His football teams have won seven state titles and been in two other finals, and his boys track teams have won two titles and been runners-up twice.
- Effective July 1, 2023, our four Columbus Catholic Schools joined together as a Columbus Catholic Schools system (CCS.) For more information, visit the new website, www.columbuscatholic.org or contact the CCS development office located at Scotus Central Catholic.
- The junior high marching band earned a Superior rating at the Columbus Parade in September and in October the senior high marching band earned a Superior at the Harvest of Harmony Parade in Grand Island.
- Scotus had great participation numbers at the October 1st Life **Chain** in Columbus (photo at right).



• The four Columbus Catholic Schools held their first Mass, Dash, and Burger Bash event at Pawnee Park Stadium on October 1st. More than 450 individuals packed the stadium for Mass concelebrated by Fr. Patrick Harrison and Fr. Jim Heithoff; and after the Mass there was a fun run and burger bash. It was an amazing event celebrating our Catholic faith, Catholic schools, and Catholic community.



- The Shamrock girls' golf team captured their fourth straight Centennial Conference title with a team score of 372 at Quail Run Golf Course in Columbus. Scotus senior Cecilia Arndt finished individually in second place with a round of 73. Scotus then went on to win the Class C-2 district crown with a team score of 363. Cecilia Arndt was the district champion with a score of 74 and Quinn VunCannon finished as runner up. At the state Class C tournament, the Shamrocks finished in 3rd place and Cecilia Arndt finished in 6th place individually.
- Named to Nebraska's local school 2023-24 Currency Believers & Achievers were seniors Cecilia Arndt, Mary Faltys, Addison Schoenfelder, and Joanna Rusher. Addison Schoenfelder was later selected as one of 48 state finalists from which eight will receive a \$500 scholarship at a banquet next spring to use for the college or university of their choice. Believers & Achievers is a state-wide program designed to give recognition to Nebraska's future leaders.
- The Shamrock girls' cross-country team won the Centennial Conference title. This was Scotus' first team title since 2019. The Shamrock girls also captured the district title and the team will compete at the state Class C meet. District medalists were Hannah Heinrich (1st), Mary Faltys (3rd), Emilyn Kavan (4th), and Mia Fehringer (13th.) Jude Maguire also qualified for the state meet on the boys' side, placing 10th at district. The boys' team finished in 5th place.
- Scotus had 13 of the 21 players on the CHS/Scotus co-op tennis team which had mixed success this season.








Book of Memory

Scotus Receives Legacy Gift

Scotus Central Catholic, St. Bonaventure Grade School and St. Bonaventure Parish each received legacy gifts from the estate of the late Catherine Wibbels. Catherine was a 1947 graduate of St. Bonaventure High School and spent most of her professional life in education. She taught in high schools for ten years and was a guidance counselor in the Columbus Public Schools for twenty-one years. More importantly, Cathy actively practiced her Catholic faith and supported Catholic education any way she could. Scotus and St. Bonaventure Grade School each received a little more than \$14,000 from Catherine and we will be good stewards of her investment in the Catholic education of our students.



New Scholarships Recently Created!

Thanks to a \$20,000.00 donation to the Scotus endowment from JoAnn (Stavas-Braun) Svajgr, a 1963 alumna of St. Bonaventure HS/Scotus CCHS, and her husband Al, a new scholarship was established to provide tuition assistance to students attending Scotus Central Catholic. The scholarship is named the **G. J. (Jerry) Braun and JoAnn (Stavas-Braun) Svajgr Scholarship**. It is the intention of the donors that two-\$500 scholarships will be annually awarded; and as an endowed fund, the corpus of the fund (\$20,000) will never be spent--only the fund's annual earnings will support the scholarships.

A second new scholarship was also recently created by alumnus, Dr. John '93 Hain and his wife, Jaci. This scholarship will be annually funded by the couple, providing two \$500 awards—one for a female student and one for a male student attending Scotus. Eligible students must have a need for tuition assistance to attend Scotus and demonstrate strong moral character and academic achievement. The scholarship is named the **John and Jaci Hain Scholarship**.

Thank you, JoAnn & Al and John & Jaci for your investment in the Catholic education of students at Scotus Central Catholic Jr/Sr High School! It is also a wonderful example of Catholic stewardship for JoAnn and John to give back to their alma mater in this way. Scotus now manages twenty-three endowed scholarships and nineteen annually funded scholarships to support our students. Scotus students are also eligible to receive a number of community funded scholarships that offer tuition assistance to attend post-secondary education.



Would you like to create a Scholarship?

Whether it is an annually funded scholarship or one that is endowed, scholarship support has become an essential means to help students and their families afford a Scotus education. Many Shamrocks have established scholarships through direct gifts, planned gifts from their estate, memorials received by the family and pooled gifts from family, friends, and classmates. Do not forget to use your company's matching gifts program to help establish your scholarship.

Annually funded scholarships are awards that are either funded entirely each year by a donor, or the donor provides a larger sum and then scholarships at a set value are annually awarded until the gift is entirely used. We suggest that annually funded scholarships be a minimum of \$250 in value.



Endowed scholarships, established with a suggested minimum gift of \$5,000, provide perpetual scholarships for Scotus students. The corpus of the gift, in this example, \$5,000, is never spent and the annual earnings of the corpus are used to fund the annual scholarship. Additional contributions to the scholarship's corpus are welcomed.

Scotus will develop a gift agreement with the donor for both annually funded and endowed scholarships. The gift agreement provides the donor an opportunity to name the scholarship, identify the selection criteria used to award the scholarship to a student and suggest who makes the scholarship selection. Scholarships can be established for students with financial need, or to recognize student achievement in academics, activities, etc. at Scotus. Ideally, we hope your scholarship will benefit students attending Scotus or one of the Columbus Catholic elementary schools.

Thank you to everyone who played a part in making the 43rd annual Gala dinner/auction another success! After hosting the Gala in the St. Bonaventure Parish Center the last three years, Gala 2024 returned to Scotus with the dinner and oral auction held in the Dowd Activity Center. More than 360 guests were in attendance and organizers feel that the 2024 Gala was the most successful to date. The event raised an estimated net of \$375,000 plus more than \$20,000 for the creation of a new health science lab at Scotus and for the purchase of a mini-van to replace a twenty-year-old van the school currently uses. BOLIVIAN EXCHANGE STUDENTS EMBRACE LIFE AT SCOTUS

Embarking on a foreign exchange program is not just about crossing borders - it's about transcending cultural boundaries, forming lasting friendships, and immersing oneself in a new way of life. In Nebraska, two Bolivian exchange students, Mariano Azurduy and his brother Joaquin, embarked on a remarkable journey. Their experience not only enriched their lives, but also left a mark on the Scotus Central Catholic community.

Mariano arrived in the United States with a mix of excitement and apprehension in 2018. He was fueled by his desire to learn more about the English language. He had a little help before arriving because he's a third-generation exchange student. His grandmother studied in Argentina, and his mother was an exchange student in Wisconsin.

"Everything in the American system was different," Mariano said. "Having lockers, having lunch at school instead of with our families. We also have school on Saturdays."

For Joaquin, arriving in the fall of 2023, he had a background on life in America firsthand through his brother.

"Mariano told me that Scotus was a small school, but everybody knows you," said Joaquin. "He told me everybody is truly kind in Nebraska, and said it was going to be a great experience for me."

After graduating from Scotus in 2020, Mariano went to the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He graduated from UNL with degrees in finance and economics in May of 2024. He was a member and president of the Wall Street Scholars of Nebraska and will start his career on Wall Street.

Joaquin enjoyed his experience so much this year in America and at Scotus, he will be returning to Scotus for his senior year. He has built a strong bond with his American family, Steven and Jill Ramaekers, and their children, Henry and Adele.

Steven said he wanted to have Mariano and Joaquin join their family and live with them because he believes in sharing American values with others.

"This opportunity was easy for us to say yes to," said Steven. "Students who want to be in the exchange program are ready to make that effort to learn a new language and come to a new

country."

Mariano came into the Ramaekers' lives and plugged into their small family perfectly, which Ramaekers said he wasn't expecting to happen so quickly.

"We are a small family with just two children. When they came to us, it was perfect. This has been the best experience of my life."

The story of Mariano and Joaquin is a testament to the transformative power of cultural exchange and the Scotus experience.
