## Notes from the Principals

The school year is moving by at a quick pace. In October, our students finished out the first quarter with a PJ Day and a bagged breakfast, and our older students celebrated their Accelerated Reader successes. In honor of "Our Lady of the Rosary," we held rosary prayer services outside near our new Our Lady of Fatima statue. Students learned a bit about the

Fatima story and the importance of daily prayer, conversion of heart, and the Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist.

In mid-October, we held our fall Parent/Teacher Conferences. We had nearly 100% participation, which is great! It's always productive to have these face-to-face conversations as the parent/teacher connection is vital to student success.

In addition, we've had several fall field trips for our students, and on the last Sunday of the month, our Home and School organization sponsored our annual trunk-or-treat event which also included pizza for all those in attendance. Students will be able to don their Halloween costumes one more time on Halloween Day as they parade through the school to show off their unique costumes.

As we turn the calendar to November, we will celebrate All Saints Day with our  $3^{\rm rd}$  graders dressing as saints and sharing what they have learned about their saints in their classroom. On Election Day, we will have a non-perishable food drive for Simon House, and students will be able to 'vote' for their presidential

choice with one of the canned food items they brought to school. Students will also take part in the Extension Office's STEM Day at Ag Park, and in mid-November, our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students will receive the Sacrament of Penance for the first time. Finally, we will wind out the month celebrating Thanksgiving.
