CELEBRATING EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION: ANGIE RUSHER NAMED TEACHER OF THE YEAR

Angie Rusher, an English and Journalism teacher at Scotus Central Catholic, was recently honored with the 27th annual William and Barbara Gerhold Family Teacher of the Year award. With an impressive 20 years of service to the school, Angie has made a profound and lasting impact on her students, colleagues, and the entire community. A proud 1995 graduate of Scotus, Angie has remained dedicated to education ever since, eager to pass on the knowledge and values that shaped her own academic journey. After earning her bachelor's degree from Hastings College, she sought to deepen her expertise, earning a master's degree in curriculum and instruction from Peru State College and a second master's degree in Catholic School Leadership from Creighton University.

Throughout her two decades at Scotus, Angie has built a reputation as both an exceptional educator and a passionate advocate for her students' success. Her dedication extends beyond the classroom, with her work as a journalism coach standing out. Under her leadership, Scotus has become a dominant force in student journalism, winning 5 state championships, 2 runners-up finishes, and producing 31 individual state champions. Angie's pursuit of excellence and ability to inspire her students was recognized in 2023 when she was named the NSAA Champion of Coaches for Journalism. Her students' success reflects her coaching expertise, mentorship, and commitment to helping them grow as both iournalists and individuals.





Angie and her husband, Brett, have long been dedicated supporters of Catholic education, as seen in the education of their three daughters—Janae, Joanna, and Jillian-who have all attended St. Bonaventure and Scotus, continuing the tradition of academic excellence. Angie's commitment to the schools and the values they represent has been steadfast, both as a teacher and a parent. The Teacher of the Year award was presented to Angie during a all-school special Mass at Bonaventure Church on January 30, 2025, as part of Columbus Catholic Catholic Schools' Schools Week celebration. Along with the award, Angie received a \$1,500 stipend for personal her recognizing exceptional contributions school to the and community.
