### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

It feels like we are finally turning the corner into spring weather which means that Lent is upon us. Lent is a great time for us to reflect on our own personal faith journeys, as well as to help others find their path as well. We get the opportunity to walk alongside the Lord through His suffering, death, and Resurrection. During Lent, students at Scotus will participate in the Stations of the Cross 3 different times. The first two times will take place at St. Bon's, and the third time will be the Living Stations of the Cross in our gym, which are acted out by our students. All students will also receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation on either April 1st or 2nd during the school day. We also have a group of students who will participate in the Lenten Retreat at the Cloisters on the Platte and the Holy Family Shrine. This retreat provides students with dedicated time for prayer and reflection on Jesus' journey of Holy Week.
